Did you know that you may be eligible for an annual clothing allowance if you use a prosthetic or orthopedic appliance medication and/or for a service connected skin condition that causes permanent damage to your outer garments?

The cut-off for this year has passed, but now you know for next year. To apply, submit (in person, by mail, or fax) VA Form <u>10-8678</u>, Application for Annual Clothing to Allowance, the Prosthetic and Sensory Aids Service at your local VA medical center.
