We had more outstanding activities over the last quarter. A big <u>Thank</u> <u>You</u> to everyone involved in any way!

The Post combined our efforts with 5 other Clay County Posts and co-sponsored a 5K run which raised over \$4,000 for The Northland Therapeutic Riding Center for the Legion's Children & Youth Month in April. Members of the Color Guard and Honor Guard from 3 of the Posts presented the colors to open the race and members of our Volunteer Team helped out in critical areas of the run itself.

To start out May we had a good turnout of 18 Legionnaires and family members for the Elks "Stacks for Students" fundraiser which benefits scholarships for area high school students. Members got these items over to Travis Merrit at the Disabilities Assistance Program. He will service the equipment and make sure it gets to a Veteran in our region.

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The following were taken from my emails, sent by the VA.

Did you know that you may be eligible for an annual clothing allowance if you use a prosthetic or orthopedic appliance and/or medication for a service connected skin condition that causes permanent damage to your outer garments?

If you're eligible, and you haven't yet applied for this year, you need to act fast! If you have already submitted your application, then no further action is required on your part. Your application should be submitted on or before August 1, 2018. To apply, submit (in person, by mail, or fax) <u>VA Form 10-8678</u>, Application for Annual Clothing Allowance, to the Prosthetic and Sensory Aids Service at your local <u>VA medical center</u>.

Additional information on this benefit is available at <u>https://www.prosthetics.va.gov/psas/Clothing\_Allowance.asp</u>.

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With VA's new **Decision Ready Claim (DRC)** Program, you can get a decision on your claim within 30 days after it's submitted. Watch this helpful <u>video</u> to decide if the DRC Program is right for you and your claim.

If you plan to file any of the following types of claims, work with an accredited veterans service officer or other accredited representative:

- **Direct Service Connection Claims**: Claims for a disability that was caused by or during your service.
- **Presumptive Service Connection Claims:** Claims for a disability that VA automatically presumes to be service-connected based on unique conditions or situations you experienced during your service.
- Secondary Service Connection Claims: Claims for a disability that you have as a result of another service-connected disability.
- **Increased Disability Claims:** Claims for a disability you have a VA rating for that has gotten worse.

With DRC, you and your accredited representative put in the time upfront to make sure your claim is decision-ready at the time of submittal. Once you submit your DRC, there's no more back and forth with VA. You will have a response within 30 days! To learn more, please visit: <u>www.benefits.va.gov/compensation/drc.asp</u>.

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Did you know VA offers housing grants to Veterans with certain service-connected disabilities and disabilities resulting from aging?

VA stepped in when Peter, an Army Veteran, had physical challenges navigating his home. "The VA provided me with a grant which allowed us to equip our house for complete handicapped access," he says. Renovations included widening door openings, installing grab bars, ramps and more.

Specially Adapted Housing (SAH) and Special Housing Adaptation (SHA) Grants

To help Veterans with permanent and total service-connected disabilities live more independently, housing grants can be used to build an adapted home or make modifications to an existing one. Find out more here.

Home Improvements and Structural Alterations (HISA) Grant

This grant provides medically necessary improvements and structural alterations to Veterans' primary residences. Eligibility is not limited to Veterans with service-connected disabilities.

#### Susan Kee - Honoring Korean War Veterans

ATTENTION ALL FAMILIES OF KOREAN WAR MISSING IN ACTION (MIA) SERVICEMEMBERS

\*\*PLEASE SHARE THIS POST\*\*\*(Please share this post so that we can reach and help as many families of Korean War MIAs as we can.)

As you know with the recent summit between US and North Korea, one of the key points agreed upon was that North Korea would return the remains of missing in action (MIA) American service members from the Korean War. In the news, I have read that in just a few days over 100 remains are expected to be transferred to the US military forces in South Korea and then brought to the US for identification.

If you are a family member of a MIA (missing in action) service member from the Korean War, please read this important information on what actions you need to take now.

Over the last 6 years, I have met with over 300 families of Korean War missing in action (MIA) service members. I have interviewed them, learned from them, and accompanied them to their meetings with DPAA (Defense POW MIA Accounting Agency), which is US Department of Defense Agency responsible for the recovery and identification of all US military service members. I want to share what I have learned from these families, for all the families out there, who need to know what they should do now in preparation of the return of these remains from North Korea. So, I put together this list of tasks each family should know and do.

I sincerely hope that this will be the start of many more remains to be returned from North Korea. I send my continued heartfelt prayers for the 7,702 American heroes still missing from the Korean War, to be found and reunited with their families. This post is dedicated in honor of their tremendous sacrifices. Their return is long overdue to these families who have waited so long.

As a Korean American, I know I am here today because of the tremendous sacrifices made by these American fallen heroes. Their families have lived with indescribable pain of not knowing if their loved ones will ever be found. I will do all I can to help and assist these honorable families. May God always bless these families, whose loved ones made the ultimate sacrifice for my freedoms and for the people of South Korea, <u>Susan Kee -</u><u>Honoring Korean War Veterans</u> and fallen heroes.

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WHAT ALL FAMILIES OF Korean War MISSING IN ACTION SERVICEMEMBERS SHOULD KNOW and DO:

1) Contact DPAA- Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency

DPAA is the US government agency which falls under the Department of Defense and is responsible for the recovery and identification of all missing American service members from all wars. If you are a family member, you need to contact them and give them the name of your missing loved one, your relation to that missing service member, and your contact information to establish communication with this agency.

2) Ask to speak to the Casualty officer or Case Manager handling your loved ones' case.

-Establish contact and regularly contact the case manager to find out what work is being done to recover and identify your missing loved one. It is up to the family member to stay in contact with the case manager and make sure the case manager is working on your case and provide you with all the information you need. -Please be proactive about staying in contact with your Casualty Officer.

3) Provide your and your family's DNA to DPAA

-This is CRITICAL. Without the DNA from the family member, they will not be able to identify the remains of your loved one.

-The DPAA will need your DNA to use to match and then identify the remains. Please contact DPAA and your case manager to make sure they send you a DNA kit to submit your DNA.

- After submitting your DNA, please contact DPAA to make sure they have your added your DNA information into their system which will be used to match and identify the remains. Without your DNA, they will not be able to identify the remains of your loved one.

4) Ask your Case manager at DPAA to provide you documents and information they have for your loved one's case.

5) Attend meetings that DPAA provides.

-The DPAA provides regional family update meetings around the country and an annual briefing every year in Washington DC. At these meetings, they provide information on their process of recovering and identifying remains and you will get the opportunity to meet other families and learn from them and find out what you can expect. #### WHY AMERICAN LEGION POST 626?

This is a snapshot of what our Post has accomplished from 1 June 2017 to 31 May 2018.

VA&R – Five members volunteered 730 hours at the KC VAMC, and we have a VA Voluntary Services (VAVS) coordinator who organized two donations to the VAVS program totaling over \$580 in goods such as underclothing, shoes and other goods. We are sponsors of an annual fundraiser in support of St. Michaels Veterans Center and make donations to The Veterans Home in Cameron.

CEREMONIAL FUNERAL HONORS – The Post has an Honor Guard Team which has been certified by the Missouri Military Funeral Honors Program honor guard team to assist in veterans' funerals and has conducted over 60 Ceremonies last year, donating over 1,000 hours of their time.

AMERICANISM – The Post is heavily involved in getting many students from two high schools to Boys State. Last year we sponsored 4 students to attend the course. We also participate in Girls State even though we do not have an Auxiliary by collaborating with a neighboring Auxiliary Unit, sponsoring 3 of their students. We have a good relationship with a local middle school were one of our members teaches. In the middle school, we participate in the School Awards Program awarding a medal and certificate to one male and one female eighth grade student each year as well as put veterans in the classrooms and participate in their Veterans Day Program for 7th graders. We also donate to the American Legion Legacy Scholarship Fund. The Post is sponsoring a team in American Legion Baseball and we have a school coordinator for the American Legion Oratorical Program.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH – Our Post has a person designated to assist Veteran families with dependent children who apply for Temporary Financial Assistance (TFA) locally and in the District. We have funds set aside in our budget to assist in a small way until the TFA grant at National can completed. Our Service Officers provided financial help to three veteran family's. We stand ready to assist Veterans who use the Family Support Network, participate in the Chamber of Commerce's Friday Fright Night which offers a safe environment for Halloween, and this year we participated in the North Kansas City School District's "Stuff the Buss" program gathering 112 boxes of school supplies and over \$400 to buy more for local children. In April we sponsored and volunteered for a 5K race which raised over \$4,000 for The Northland Therapeutic Riding Center as part of Children and Youth Month.

COMMUNITY - Our Post is highly active in our community, participating in 5 public events throughout the year. We; Conduct a Memorial Day Ceremony, open Bluesfest with our color guard, march in the Gladfest parade, place wreaths on veteran's graves as a part of Wreaths Across America and present a donation to the Mayor for local charities during the Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony. The Post has a "Go To" Volunteer Team that is active in supporting the community through assisting with community service projects. Our Post regularly attends fundraisers for student scholarships put on by the Elks and Rotary.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS – Our Post has a Facebook page to communicate to our members **and** the community at large. We are also members of the Gladstone Chamber of Commerce.

#### WHERE DOES MY MONEY GO?

Nationally the American Legion protects and furthers the rights of that Veterans have earned (Lobbying Congress), provide expert help in obtaining full veterans benefits (Service Officers), strengthen patriotic values in our nation (Boys and Girls States) and support Legion sponsored programs that benefit veterans, their families, and communities (Temporary Financial Assistance, National Emergency Fund, Child Welfare Endowment Fund and Volunteerism).

Over one-year Posts in Missouri will manage

- Over 1, 600 benefit claim cases
- 21,000 recorded hours of community service
- \$64,000 in emergency aid
- Honors for 4,000 veteran's funerals

Dues are \$35, \$27.50 of that goes to Department & National, another \$1 goes to District, the remaining \$6.50 stays with the Post and is used for Hall rental and other administrative costs as well as membership recognition activities.
