





# American Legion Post 626 in Gladstone goes online for poppy donations

Memorial Day 2020 under COVID-19 has presented American Legion Post No. 626 in Gladstone with some challenges, according to Post Commander Doug Millison.

There will not be a public Memorial Day ceremony at the Clay County Veterans Memorial this year. The post also is not able to conduct its typical Poppy Donation Day, where they accept in-person donations to help fund all of post veteran programs in exchange for a memorial poppy.

"We will honor our fallen privately on Memorial Day," said Millison.

While they cannot accept donations in

person, this year post members will be accepting poppy donations on a special page on the post's website, al626mo.com, from Monday, May 18 through May 31. Donations are also being accepted by mail to American Legion Post 626, P.O. Box 10613, Gladstone, 64188, with "Poppy" in the memo line.

We hope the Gladstone community, which is always so generous to us, will still be able to find and support us," Millison said.




