Byzantine Monastery Closing

Holy Dormition Franciscan Friary, in Sybertsville, PA will close as of January 2021. Father Jerome, OFM stated that this is mainly due to the lack of available Friars. On January 31, at 2pm, they will have a final prayer service to close the chapel, with a reception if conditions permit. The friars are still able to honor all intentions and memorials; and will continue to pray for all of their benefactors. They ask for your prayers at this difficult time.

To remember: Covid-19 Guidelines for Church Reopening

- Must wear a face mask or covering when entering and while in the building. Only remove when receiving and consuming Communion and then replace it on face.
- Must sanitize hands, sanitizers located in the vestibule on both sides when entering and exiting the building.
- > Do not shake hands or hug other parishioners and do not congregate in the vestibule.
- Follow the designated foot traffic patterns and floor markings.
- Maintain social distancing (6 feet) while sitting, standing, and approaching for Communion.
- Follow the directions posted in the bathrooms about cleaning handles, knobs, and surfaces when using and leaving the bathroom.
- May bring your personal prayer book but must take it with you on leaving. All prayer books have been removed from the pews.

Communion procedures to be followed

- Parishioners sitting in the right pew section will form a line in the center aisle to receive communion.
 - When everyone on the right side has received communion, parishioners sitting in the left

pews will line up to receive communion.

• Parishioners should not slide across pews and must maintain a separation distance of 6 feet.
