

HISPANIC ELIGIBLE VOTER POPULATION TO EXCEED 34.5 MILLION IN 2022, UP ALMOST 5 MILLION FROM 2018

Note: Eligible voters are U.S. citizens ages 18 and older. Hispanics are of any race. Black eligible voters include those who say their race is Black alone and non-Hispanic. Black and at least one other race is non-Hispanic, or Black and Hispanic. Asians likewise include those who say their race is Asian alone and non-Hispanic, Asian and at least one other race and non-Hispanic, or Asian and Hispanic. Estimates are rounded to the nearest 50,000. Percentages and changes are calculated from unrounded numbers.
