The meeting was called to order at 7:40 by the president, Bruce Santy. Bob Roberts moved that the reading of the minutes be dispensed with: second by House, carried.

Claude Clark introduced John Stock of Tupper Lake who has recently been appointed a member of the Adirondack Park Agency, heading their department or committee, on Land Use. He came with an unbiased opinion as to our position and possible questions concerning the APA.

He briefly outlined the growth of land use ideas from the 50s to the 70s and mentioned that an agency for land planning causes an emotional upheaval but that in the long run the good of the general public transcends the good of the individual. He spoke of certain areas within the Park where benefits have accrued from such planning; mentioned the available help of Federal Funds and predicted that eventually federal planning will prevail. He stated that zoning is good if done right. A poor zoning plan is worse than none, he said. From his point of view he said that he can see no advantage of our inclusion in the Adirondack Park but urged zoning, mentioning the fact that we could set up a zoning district and not wait for the town. Two final statements may be of interest to record:

State Land outside the "Blue Line" is not taxable. Inside the Blue Line, it is.

Also- the area of the Adirondack Park can be increased but it cannot be decreased.

ANNUAL MEETING JULY 13, 1973

The annual meeting of the Lake Titus Protective Association was called for 8 P.M. on Friday the 13th of July at 8 P.M. at Leon and Vi Elliott's camp.

Bruce Santy, president called the meeting to order at 8:30 P.M. A moment of silence was observed in memory of those who have passed away since the last Annual Meeting - George Massie and Bess Kirk.

The secretary's report of the last annual meeting and of the called meeting on September 1, 1972 were read and accepted on motion by Norris Howard and second by Laura Allen.

The treasurer's report showed balances as follows: Checking account- \$ 447.22 and interest account- \$1795.41. The paying membership increased by 14 this year just passed. There are 25 property owners who are not members of the association and 84 who are. The report was accepted and placed on file.

Under Old Business the following reports were given-

Fish and Dam, Jim Smallman reporting- 3500 trout were put in off Salliner's dock- 2000 rainbow and 1500 other. The dam is in good shape but the board across the top is not. Someone pried out the metal gate and it had to be replaced. No one knows who, of course. That gate ~~does~~ does not control the water level at all.

Navigation- No report.

Membership and Welcome. One new camper, Al Smith was welcomed and Nancy (Mrs. Henry) Fischer <sup>with her family</sup> who is occupying the Hale camp was introduced.

Trails- Laura Allen- Took early to say much about them. At the end of last summer they were in very good shape. She especially thanked Jim Fickett from the Hyde camp for his help. Frank Lytle called today that Imarcelle Trail is "not too bad" but some work is needed on it. Kevin Brosnan added a word- that trails are good.

Pollution- Elizabeth Donovan reported that there is some dye left for testing of sewer systems. Sinks were not checked and those that may have dishwashers should see that they do not drain directly into the lake. Some systems should perhaps be checked again.

Upper Beach - Chuck Hicks- Things are in good shape- Picked up some trash.

In the matter of silting- Jim Smallman reported having contacted the Conservation Department who, mentioning that silting is a natural process, said that they have photo-copies of the St. Lawrence watershed which are available for use in studying the situation.

Picnic- According to the secretary's report it was held the weekend after July 4th! Somebody forgot to function apparently. Still time to have one. Jim Smallman will find someone to be on the committee with him as Clay Stemple is no longer on the lake.

After a call for other nominations of which there were none, it was moved by Laura Allen that the secretary cast one ballot for the slates as read. Second was by Bill Kilburn. Carried and so ordered.

Bruce again took the chair. He apologized for not having brought out one matter of business concerning a letter to the Malone Town Board relative to a zoning ordinance which was voted at the special meeting last fall. He read the letter. There was nothing in it that could have been acted upon until very recently.

Larry House introduced Bill King, Town Supervisor, who said that the chief reason that it was reported that the Town Board was against zoning, was the fact that they have on file 1180 signatures of Town residents who want no zoning whatsoever. It is felt that these signers perhaps did not consider the protection afforded by zoning and a committee is working on another ordinance to present. It is hoped that when a public hearing is announced that there will be less apathy and that people who WANT zoning will show up as well as the "againstness". There are things that the supervisors cannot legally do. There are some that they can do and one thing that they have done is to order our new pump for fire protection for us. He also mentioned the Callfiremen who would rush to our assistance whenever called upon.

There followed much discussion and Mr. King answered many questions that were put to him. Allen Child who is on the planning committee of the board and who is the only Lake Titus property owner on it, also answered questions. Naturally the question of the Adirondack "Blue Line" came in and Bob Coughlin formally moved that we petition to be included in the Adirondack Park. This brought quite a burst of "No!" Lynn Smith stood to move that at our next meeting we have a representative from the Adirondack Park Agency come in to explain the benefits, etc., to us. Bob Coughlin withdrew his motion. Laura Allen seconded Lynn's motion and the Smith-Allen motion carried.

On the question of the "next Meeting" Howard Rymers moved that the next meeting be a called meeting later this summer. Norris Howard seconded. Carried. Bruce stated that in the meantime he has some booklets available for study AND HE WILL SET THE TIME for the meeting in the News Letter which will be going out soon.

Merle Parker asked about up-dating the constitution booklet and Laura Allen offered to help search records to bring the booklet up to date with amendments etc.

This was brought about because of extra expenses entailed in the pollution program, dock maintenance at the upper beach, the two mountain trail docks, maintenance work at the dam and an \$84. increase in taxes on L.T.P.A. properties. The annual meeting of the Lake Titus Protective Association was held at the Leon Elliott camp on Friday, July 14, 1972. The meeting, called for 8 P.M. was called to order by the president, Bruce Santy, at 8:20. There were 51 present.

A moment of silence was observed in tribute to members and campers who have passed away since the last annual meeting- Those so memorialized were Frances Ames, George Hanna and John Sausone.

A welcome was extended to new campers and guests.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and accepted with one correction: The report should have read "Palisades" instead of "Cathedral Rocks". *final*

The treasurer's report showed an operating loss of \$49.01. Bal. July 10, \$350.?? Savings account bal. \$1725.68. Bill Kilburn moved to accept the report. Bill Gibbons seconded. Carried.

The Fish and Dam committee reported that 5000 trout-rainbow and brown were put in the lake this spring by the conservation department. The dam is in good shape. Wert Marshall reported.

Bill Gibbons reported on the Breakfast Walk of 1971. 171 registered. Expenses were \$101.92- cleared \$33.35.

New campers mentioned were Gordon Todd- Camp Dec and and John G. Gillett.

Bill Kilburn reported on Navigation. At the outlet, boats go too fast and too close to shore. There was much discussion of speed and shore erosion. Bill Hardy spoke up and said that all one needs to do, when a boat endangers another with speed, or otherwise disregards rules and common courtesy, is to get the number of the boat, tell him and he, as Town Justice, can take care of the complaint very nicely. Lynn Griffith Smith asked that the buoys that Captain Badger put into the lake when he was chairman of Navigation, be replaced to mark hazards and distances off shore. Bill Slack offered to work on booklets of information to be given to campers to inform or remind them of Navigation laws.

Pollution-E. Donovan- Spoke with appreciation of the cooperation of all the campers in the dye tests of sewer systems last summer. 70 camps were checked and there were 48 negative and 22 positive reactions. of the 22, 5 have been corrected. Letters have been prepared to send out and it is hoped that the testing can be completed this summer. More dye will have to be purchased. The committee asked those who have problems to contact them- Haven and Allen are the other members. Morris Howard spoke of a firm- Environment 1, in Albany which specializes in equipment for an up-hill job/ and in monitoring and correcting equipment. Bill Kilburn thanked the committee for their work last year. A round of applause followed. There followed discussion of boat exhausts but it brought no definite action.

## Lake Titus Protective Association

Annual Meeting, July 12, 1974

The meeting was called to order at the Arnold Camp by President Bruce Sandy at 8:00 P.M. with 51 persons present.

A moment of silence was observed in memory of Janet Haven and Ed Lockwood, members who had passed away since the last meeting.

The minutes of the two meetings held on July 15, 1973 and August 24, 1973 were accepted as read.

Treasurer Phyllis Crownan reported on income and expenditures from the checking and savings accounts. Bank balances as of July 1 were \$729.29 in the operating account and \$1,867.95 in the interest account. Eighty-Two members have paid 1974 dues to date. There is a very real possibility of a need to increase the amount of dues as costs continue to rise, unless more paid memberships can be obtained.

Dam and Fish Committee. Bert Marshall reported that the dam was in good condition this year. This past spring the lake was stocked with 2500 rainbow and 1800 brown trout averaging six to twelve inches in length.

Membership. Lynn Smith will chair this committee again this year, assisted by Sue Smallman and Herb Smith. More paid memberships must be obtained in order to meet our financial obligations, or dues must be increased, or both. Two suggestions were made. First, that the

association adopt a sticker identification program wherein stickers would be issued to members and use of Association property be limited to those carrying current stickers. It was felt that this would be difficult to enforce, and that few non-members use these facilities anyway. Second, an associate membership plan was suggested for persons using the Lake Titus Campsite at the Lower Beach. It was noted that Leona Baber, Proprietor of the Campsite had paid full membership dues last year, although she does not take an active part in the Association. This suggestion was referred to the Membership Committee.

Navigation Committee. No formal report made by Joe McGuire. Concern was expressed to the committee about irresponsible speed and handling of boats on the lake.

Trails. Laura Allen reported that she had been here only one day, but had heard that trails were in good shape. The mail boxes holding the hike registers need replacement or repair. Bert and Guy Marshall opened the Elephant's Head trail from the landing to the top last fall. The docks at the foot of both Immortelle and Elephant's Head need repair.

Pollution. Elizabeth Donovan reported that there is still a bit of dye left for checking septic tank drainage. The Committee is still trying to get more dye. Most camp systems with drainage faults causing pollution have been corrected. No recent complaints have been made, but members were urged to report any suspected sources of pollution. Testing of the lake water was questioned since it has been three years since such a test was made.

Breakfast Walk, 1973. Marjorie Sill Boynton reported that 237 people registered at last year's Breakfast Walk, and probably 250 attended. .  
new record.

Junior L.T.P.A. Linda Carr reported that this group needs members. Any camper between ages 10 and 19 is eligible to belong. The group has worked on the trails, and is interested in setting up a water ski slalom course and ski jump if enough interest is shown by others.



A called meeting of the LTPA was held at "Lyn. Brink" at 7:30 P.M. on Friday, September 1, 1972. There were approximately 40 present.

The meeting was called to order by Bruce Senty, president. The minutes of the Annual Meeting in July were read by the secretary.

The treasurer reported that so far this year 74 suspects ~~names~~ ~~persons~~ have paid dues- the same number that paid up during all of last year.

The Annual Meeting of the Lake Titus Protective Association was held at the Leon Elliott Camp at Lake Titus on Friday, July 9, 1971 at 8 PM. Several people had said before the meeting that they had failed to receive their notices so efforts will be made next year to get them distributed more completely.

**FIRE PUMP** - As noted at the last L.T.P.A. meeting, the portable water pump and fire hose are now located in Smallman's Marina. Jim Smallman has kindly agreed to act as interim "fire chief" until a committee of a permanent nature can assume the responsibility. If you have a fire that you can't seem to control, please call Jim at 483-5906 (if you don't have the number memorized by now, it might be a good idea to post it somewhere near your 'phone).

**POLLUTION** - The first meeting of the Pollution Committee was held at the Donovan camp on Saturday, July 25th. The committee determined at that time to get in touch with the New York State Board of Health as soon as possible in order to find out what kind of assistance we may expect from them.

Of the many types of pollution affecting our lake today, the greatest threat comes from rapid eutrophication (i.e. over-enrichment). Vast quantities of nutrients, especially phosphates, are being dumped into the lake by man's activities. These phosphates generally stimulate massive growth of algae and waterweeds. The results of this overfertilization are becoming painfully obvious here at Lake Titus (suds trails, evidence of raw human waste matter, etc.). In short, our beautiful clean lake will become choked with plant life, desirable fish species die from lack of oxygen because decaying algae has removed oxygen from the water - leading to its eventual "death" as a swamp.

Since it seems apparent that our greatest enemy is detergent generated phosphates, the committee urges all camp owners to refer to the enclosed list of detergents (rated in terms of their phosphate content) before purchasing any brand name at the store. You will notice that ordinary soap is the least polluting.

Note: The term "biodegradable" on a detergent box has nothing to do with a phosphate content. All detergents are biodegradable. If someone tries to sell you a "non-polluting" detergent, demand the truth about phosphate content before buying.

The Annual Meeting of the Lake Titus Protective Association was held at the Leon Elliott Camp at Lake Titus on Friday, July 9, 1971 at 8 PM. Several people had said before the meeting that they had failed to receive their notices so efforts will be made next year to get them distributed more completely. *25 Present*

The meeting was called to order by the president, Leon Elliott at 8:30 P.M. A moment of silence was observed in memory of those campers and former campers who have passed away since the last meeting. Those memorialized were Eleanor French and Earl Fuller.

The Secretary's report of the last meeting was accepted as read.

The Treasurer's report was read by Bill Lytle, treasurer. 17 new dues payers were added this last year and this is now 70% of the camp owners. Balances are \$399.88 in checking and \$1658.70 in savings. Our taxes have nearly doubled. Someone asked why we pay taxes? Town tax and school tax on property owned as an association.

#### Reports of Committees:

Dam and Fish- "Same as last year". Dam in good shape. Mert Marshall had not been notified of fish planting but Jim Smallman added that the Conservation men had "just showed up" with trout and he had helped them stock about 3500 as last year.

Navigation- Warren Crowner- Good year but boats still travel too close to shore, eroding shore and endangering swimmers. The consensus is that most people "Don't know" the rules.

Membership- Introduced Barry Smith of Glen Cove L.I., and Massena who has bought the Lockwood camp.

Trails- Laura Allen- Has not had opportunity to check them this season. Praised Jr. LTPA members for help last season. Is not in favor of too much improvement on ~~Cathedral Rocks~~ trail as it is dangerous for unseasoned rock travelers. As far as is know all trails are passable. It was the "Breakfast Walk" (this is it's 19th year) which set out to save the various trails. Docks at all trails need repair. *Palfitades*

Pollution - Donovan-Committee has met 4 times. There are 88 camps on the lake. Proposed that we set aside enough money to buy dye to check sewerage systems as that seems to be the source of greatest pollution. Had Mr. Brown present to explain the process of checking same.

Fish poisoning- Still a moot question.

Jr. LTPA-Peter Gibbons- Linda Carr is new president. A small number of Juniors this year and they feel they can not handle the organization of a Regatta as last year but think there should BE one

Breakfast Walk-Detailed report was in the desk drawer of Bruce Santy, chairman, at Niagara Mohawk at the time of the fire last winter, there was a profit of \$102.00 from the walk. They retained \$15.00 for supplies and now have a fair inventory of same.

Claude Clark took the chair and heard the Report of the Nominating Committee- Mary Coughlin, chairman.

8:15 P.M. at the L.A. Elliott Camp

President Felix (~~Shelly~~<sup>Phill</sup>) Shelly opened the meeting at 8:30 and called upon Laura Allen to read the minutes of the 1969 meeting - in the absence of Dorothy Hale-Secretary.

After correction (Treasurer's report) they were accepted.

Mr. Shelly called a minute of silence in standing tribute to those who had died during the past year.

Fish and Dam - Merton Marshall not being present, Lawrence Porter said that he knew the dam was "O.K."

Trails - Laura Allen reported that the trails were in good condition - particularly the one to Elephant's Head - thanks to a work party

of Jr. L. T. P. A. members who had joined her for a day of excellent trail work and in cutting away obstructions to the views of the lake and Immortelle,

Upper Sand Beach - Bill Lytle said that a half day session of work by a group of Jr. and Sr. members last summer did the necessary work and he felt that a similar half day of work each year would keep things under control.

Jr. - L. T. P. A. - Peter Gibbons president - The Juniors had during the 1965 Season:

1 meeting  
a regatta  
a sailboat race  
worked at the Upper Sand Beach trail cleared on Elephant's Head  
New President of the Jr. L. T. P. A. will be Lloyd Palmer.

The Junior members said that they are available for helping with projects such as trails and the Upper Beach maintenance.

Speakers - Mr. Porter introduced two speakers - Mr. Fifer, Fish Manager for Region 5 of the N.Y. Conservation Dept. at Ray Brook, and Mr. Fred White, Water Resources officer for Malone.

On Fishing - Mr. Fifer said

that the trout fishing at Lake Titus had deteriorated since the detailed study of the lake was made in 1949.

He outlined a possible plan for controlling perch - for which the Dept. has the technique. Fish life would be killed by poisoning.

Every land owner on the water shed - lake shore and its tributaries and streams below the dam would have to agree to the plan in writing <sup>and in answer to questions</sup>.

In his remarks Mr. Fifer included the following:

The outlet is a good site for damming to keep undesirable fish from coming up from Branch Brook.

Poison would cost \$7,000 =  
 Total cost of project \$20,000 =  
 of State money - (i.e. tax derived.)  
 Preliminaries would take until 1972 - about 3 years - if work were begun now.

Job would be done after Labor Day - so that few campers would be in camp when the dead fish abounded.

Lake Titus is 430 Acres in area.

Rotenon is used for such poisoning. Most fish succumb - all but some bull heads for example. Perch are the most vulnerable.

Although the poison is supposed to be harmless for mammals - the lake would not be safe for

drinking, swimming or cooking for two months.

(Some members wondered what would happen in the general food chain - from the smallest living things as in the marshes up through the birds and mammals that would eat from the quantities of dead and ~~dying~~ fish.)

Perch are most successful in competing with trout for the limited food supply.

Perch at present in the lake are probably stabilized at the highest level possible with the available food supply.

Hopfully there is no sewage problem - but the out-board motor oil pollution is bad.

After the project of poisoning and restocking with trout public access would have to be guaranteed - including a parking lot for 20 cars. There would be a limit on legal horse power of fishing boats - but - no supervising personnel on hand. It is supposed that the bulk of "angling pressure" by boat launchers would be off before the camping season.

We can continue the "put and take" program.

In the course of Mr. Fifer's talk there was some discussion

and a long discussion followed.

It was determined that no one could know ~~how~~ for how long there would be "good trout fishing" following a poisoning project. There have been just a very few such projects completed.

George Hanna said that he was absolutely sure that live minnows would be brought in - and also - there are fishermen who want just any fish.

After a show of hands by camp owners present it was decided that further studies should be made before any action be taken.

On water resources, pollution and navigation -

Mr. White included the following:  
A new law requires a permit for new docks that extend 5 feet or more from shore into 4 feet of water.  
Sewage is "injurious to fish" and is covered by a conservation law.

The lake is being "enriched" and is gradually getting shallower.  
Mr. White urged campers to phone him or other staff members if

problems come up. - Phone numbers are listed under "N.Y. State conservation officer" in the telephone book.

# Annual Meeting L.T.P.A. 1967

President Bill Hardy presided and opened the meeting at 8:20 P.M.

A moment of silence was observed in memory of Campers and former Campers who have passed away since the last annual meeting:

The Secretary's report was read and accepted, on motion by Bill Lytle and second by Lawrence Porter.

The president thanked our hostess for the use of her camp for the meeting, and thanked Weston Marshall for helping her get it ready for us.

New Campers introduced were: Helen (Cooks) Gubaud, Jean (Lytle) French, Mr + Mrs Ernest Henry, Ruth Curry, Helen Wilgour, Sue and William Steek.

The treasurer's report was read. Balance \$460<sup>00</sup>. It was moved by Mrs. Herack, seconded by M. Marshall that the report be accepted and placed on file. Carried. A copy is attached.

Navigation - Marny Grewer, Chairman was absent. It was brought out that there are several newer and larger boats on the lake. This lake will be patrolled by the Sheriff's patrol. The more doing it is fair but very strict and it was suggested that all boats be properly equipped. There were the oft-repeated complaints re speed and warnings to show, and the oft-repeated regulation "Boats shall not travel more than 5 MPH within 50 feet of shore."

All boats must have navigation lights. Row Boats + Canoes must carry a light to flash.

This discussion led to water-skiing: The law - a safety belt is not required but there must be 2 people in the boat, one driving and one other over 10 years of age. It was highly recommended that there be a motion to demand that all skiers be required to wear a safety belt while skiing on this lake.

A motion was then made by Bill Lytle and seconded by E. Doucrou that the following resolution be adopted:

"That all Campers see to it that any skier leaving their dock has a safety belt on". Carried.

Also:

Docks must be numbered

Rafts must be lighted or be equipped with reflectors

It was moved by Bill Slack that all rafts shall be lighted from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise. Second was by Mrs. Gibbons. Carried.

The question of how to enforce this was raised. The Navigation Committee shall notify raft owners.

Trails - L. Allen. Trails are in good condition and their use is recommended. Volunteers have helped clear them. The Williams need to do a bit of repair on Summitville dock. In 1965, 187 signed the register on Summitville. Not so many in 1966. Elephant's Head trail not used so much.

Fish - Fish were planted - saw thru the ice - 15,000 rain-fall trout - (lytle)

Dam - M. Marshall - Explained about the planks in the dam that control the water level. He neglected to take out the planks in the fall and the ice came higher than usual and debris floated down + lodged. Dam now in A1 condition.

Bill Slack commented on surface current and silt building up.

Upper Beach - 20 volunteers marked a full day - cut trees stump and undergrowth back for about 2 ft. This is a "start" but it will take several years to complete the job. May be able to burn debris on ice next winter. The slide needs a trace.

Outlet - a boat house falling down there makes a "junk yard"

Question of reparability referred to Claude Clark.

There is also a sunken dock near the dam.

The new navigation committee shall see that these things are cleaned up.

Registration:

It is against state law to throw anything into the lake including Cigarettes.

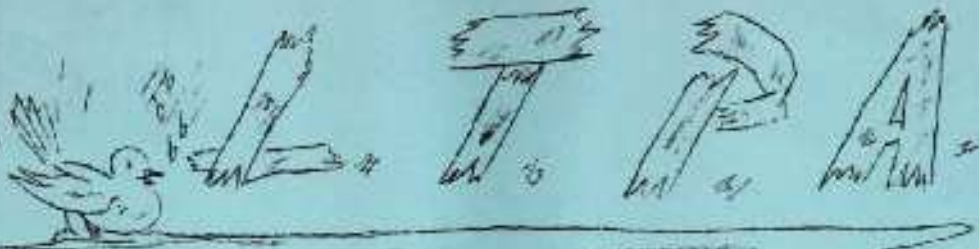

Committee Reports were called for:

1. Navigation: Capt. Badger Chik. is very ill in Bethesda Naval Hospital. Pres. Clark reported for him, noting that we have had no accident on the lake in a long time and we hope there will be none. He says boats are properly lighted and avoid high speeds near shore. A get-well-card was circulated and all present signed it.
2. Trails: Laura Allen reported painting flags. The dock was not built at the foot of the Elephant's Head trail. Quite a few people have used bath trails and the docks are in place. Please sign. Laura put in a plug also for Cathedral Rocks and the Palisades - the Cliffs at the base of Mt. Sumastille.
3. Fish: Armand Oriere for next month reported 3200 Rainbow - 1-2 + 3 year-olds - 12"-16".
4. Land: reported that last winter he was approached by lumber interests to sell off the Yellow Birch in the

Maple Hill area. Not being in authority to do so, he  
 said "no" and contacted the Conservation Department at  
 Key Break. They came down & surveyed and found  
 they had \$500-\$ to 1000- in salable timber but agreed that  
 the area would be "A mess" afterward. The Conservation  
 Department asked for a contact person. After discussion  
 Board appointed Merton Marshall as Chairman of a  
 Forest Committee and to act as contact with the

Thank you for your letter of Feb. 26th. The other day when trying to look up something else I came across a more complete file on "Titus" and am enclosing the information gleaned. There are 9 cards and I quote:

1. Titus, Elisabeth K. Wife of James H. Died at Rye, N.Y. Jan 20, 1869 aged 66 years.
2. Titus, Henry. Biographical sketch, (Malone) Palladium 2/3/1887 Known as "Judge" - Built soybean factory in Chase Falls, 1832. Palladium 3/24/1887. Was agent for James H. Titus, according to Dr. W.H. Harwood in the Malone Farmer 4/8/1903
3. Titus, James H. Son of Henry. Account of his early mills, etc, by F.L. Turner, in Malone Telegram 9/12/34. (This may not be accurately dated to the mill at Branch Pond (Lake Titus). (Here is a reference to another card or a clipping but I do not know the date. We could perhaps work it out if needed.) Died 4/23/1882 - in Brooklyn in 80th year of his life.
4. Titus, John, Fishing, Queens County
5. Titus, Mary, Administrator of the estate of John Titus, late of Queens County. Deed to 3000 acres in middle 1/3 of Township #9 - Town of Shelah, 12/16/1829. Consideration of \$10.00 named in deed. (Reference in the corner as "Lib. 5" which I take to be "Liber 5" of the deeds on file in the County Offices. No page no. given.)
6. Titus and Parmelee, James H. Titus, A.B. Parmelee-1866 Morton S. Parmelee entered firm of Titus, Parmelee and Son, Jan. 1875 Lands in Middle 1/3 Township #9 Malone-9726 acres ex Wallace tract. South 1/3 of #9 Malone, 10,653 acres. (Aug. 1866 taken from record book of firm).
7. Titus, Parmelee and Co. May 30 1878. The firm of Titus, Parmelee and Co. being this day dissolved by mutual consent, this cash book was examined and found to be correct and satisfactory to all parties hereto- (signed) James H. Titus, A.B. Parmelee, M.S. Parmelee, and is from page 71, cash book #4.
8. Titus Parmelee and Co. "Public notice is hereby given that the firm of Titus, Parmelee and Co., is by mutual consent this day dissolved. The business will be carried on hereafter by the messrs Parmelee, to whom all payments due said firm are to be paid and by whom all debts are to be paid." (signed by the same 3 as above) Palladium 6/6/1878
9. Titus, Parmelee and Co., Transfer of 16/1878 involved personal property, 2 saw mills, 6 water powers, 1 pping mill, 100 A. of land in villages and some 40,000 A. of wild land in Malone, Bellmont, Duane and Franklin. Pall. 6/6/178

TO ALL LTPA MEMBERS:

After the annual meeting, and the somewhat heated discussion with Mr. Lampman on the subject of state access to Lake Titus, I took it upon myself to ask the official of the Conservation Department in Albany who is in charge of the land acquisition program for clarification of some points that may have been left under a cloud of steam after the meeting. The information I have acquired follows:

The Department had at first discussed a boat-launching ramp on Lake Titus. That idea was vetoed by Commissioner Wilm (probably on the grounds that we have enough boats and water skiers already.)

The present thinking is to provide an access point on the lake for canoes and car-top boats. Use of boats of this type only would be assured by a suitable barrier for cars located some distance from the water. This would require carrying the boat from car to water (and that's pretty strenuous with a 16-foot boat and 75 horsepower motor).

The exact location has not been decided upon, though mention has been made of land adjacent to Smallman's. I assume this means the beach property next to Smallmans.

The plan would not become effective before next year at the very earliest, and probably not until 1964.

After the annual meeting, and the somewhat heated discussion with Mr. Lampman on the subject of state access to Lake Titus, I took it upon myself to ask the official of the Conservation Department in Albany who is in charge of the land acquisition program for clarification of some points that may have been left under a cloud of steam after the meeting. The information I have acquired follows:

The Department had at first discussed a boat-launching ramp on Lake Titus. That idea was vetoed by Commissioner Wilm (probably on the grounds that we have enough boats and water skiers already.)

The present thinking is to provide an access point on the lake for canoes and car-top boats. Use of boats of this type only would be assured by a suitable barrier for cars located some distance from the water. This would require carrying the boat from car to water (and that's pretty strenuous with a 16-foot boat and 75 horsepower motor).

The exact location has not been decided upon, though mention has been made of land adjacent to Smallman's. I assume this means the beach property next to Smallmans.

The plan would not become effective before next year at the very earliest, and probably not until 1964.

Annual Meeting- L.T.P.A.- July 19, 1961.

The Annual Meeting of the Lake Titus Protective Association was held at the Lynn Camp at 8 PM. on Wednesday, July 19, 1961.

The meeting was opened by the president, Elizabeth Donovan, who asked the secretary to read the call to the meeting.

The sec/retary's report of the last Annual Meeting was read and accepted with one correction- by Merton Marshall- there were 7,500 trout planted.

The Bill Kilburns were introduced as new campers although both are well known to Titus campers. Mr. John Evans was again present as a guest, Mrs. Boyse, guest of Jane Child was introduced and Mr. Harold Sill, Sr., after not being present at a meeting for nearly ten years was welcomed.

The treasurer's report showed a balance of \$650.51- July 1960 and an overall balance of \$1439.70 as of July 1961. This includes \$750.00 from the new road payments and some interest. It was moved by Claude Clark and seconded by George Hanna that the report be accepted as read. Carried.

Merton Marshall reported on work at the dam. It included the hauling in of 8 loads of gravel. He again mentioned the fish planted this year.

Laure Allen reported on trails: Immortelle- good except for one large tree. It is suggested that the trail be remarked around the tree. The register, replaced last year, is in good shape. Campers were asked to save can lids (from the larger size cans), cutting them off with a heavy rim. These to be left on the Allen or Marshall dock to be painted and used where needed.

The "Hints to Campers" provided for last year has been done and distributed by the Jr. LTPA. The "Fire and Drowning" placard will be done. After new telephone numbers are assigned next year it will be re-printed.

Morton House reported on our Land Holdings: In 1951 there were 800 acres of land to be sold bordering on the lake. The Association had no money but the Board of Directors, (Or Executive Committee) decided to buy up the land and wrote members, sending proxies for their vote. They had very good response. The Directors signed a note for \$1000.00. They lumbered the hard wood, sold lots and by 1953 the note was paid and the certificates of indebtedness cleared up. He went on to say that the present directors would like to see the land now owned by the association "frozen" or reserved in perpetuity. In discussion the following items were brought out: Claude Clark questioned the right to "reserve". It was stated that there are at present 10 or 12 lots on the lake; not all suitable building lots. They sold for \$500.00 each, when sold several years ago (ones that WERE sold). The value of "wet lands" to the lake. The amphibian and fish life are greatly dependent on these.

After discussion, the president appointed a committee to "advise how a statement in the by-laws can be worded covering the possible sale of property and that an amendment to the by-laws be included in the notice of the 1962 Annual Meeting-(Sec.1 Art.2)"

The Committee: Claude Clerk, Laura Allen, Mrs. Carpenter, Morton House and Elizabeth Donovan, ex officio.

Navigation Rules and Law were discussed at length. New regulations pertaining to operators of power boats were noted as follows: Under 10- no one may operate a power boat. 10-14 may operate if owner of a safety certificate or with an older person- 15 or over, in the boat. Sally House is qualified to teach power-boat safety, has taught some and is willing to teach others. The course requires about 4 hours. A plea was made for people to tie their boats up better when leaving them. Bill Smellman is a deputy of the Sheriff's Office on boat patrol. It was decided that a new Navigation Committee should be appointed by the incoming president.

## 1963 Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the Lake Titus Protective Association was held on Wednesday, July 20, 1963 at the Roberts Camp with 52 attending.

Just before the meeting opened, a bouquet of red roses and long noedle pine was brought in, with a card reading "In loving memory of those not with us tonight - The Hale Family"

The Call to the Annual Meeting was read, followed by the reading of the minutes of the last annual meeting. On motion by Amos Crooks, the minutes were approved.



## ANNUAL Meeting - 1959

The meeting was called to order by the president George Hamed, who asked the secretary to read the call to the meeting, and to read the minutes of the last Annual meeting. Arnes Croake moved to approve the minutes; Laurence Porter seconded, Carried.

The minutes of a meeting of the Directors, held at Dr. Crowner's office, Sept. 29, 1958, were read. Moved and seconded as above for approval. Carried. The president then read a letter written to Armand Briere, Sept. 26, 1958 concerning the chaining of a road across L.T.P.A. property.

The president stated that Mrs. Louis Child and Miss Margaret Fisk, former Campers, have passed away within the year and asked for a rising moment of silence in tribute to their memory.

In his annual report the president spoke of his effort to induce the Assessors to cut tax rates on lots ~~held~~ ~~in~~ recent years owned by the association.
