The teens express themselves through their interactions and compelling songs as they resolve their conflicts and find the path to connection.





WRITER'S STATEMENT

Words have been magical to me ever since I began forming them. I quickly learned that the right words strung together could tell a story and... be used as weapons. Wishing to use them for 'weapons of good,' I got my big break when I was hired to write shows for a professional touring children's theater company. We didn't do iterations of Cinderella, Hansel and Gretel, or any published children's play for that matter, we created our own shows about busing, sexual decision making, the metric system, conserving water, multiculturalism, the Jewish, Hispanic, Asian, and Black Experience, smoking, alcoholism, drug addiction, peer pressure and oh so many more. We were so effective, we ended up recreating many of our theatrical shows for television. The Voyage of the Same-ites, our *Emmy winning* show on PBS, was about aliens coming to earth and encountering human rights. Later, I wrote for Disney, Scholastic, Universal, Mattel and many others. But never was I to come close to my early experience of using words and entertainment to explore important human themes. I missed leaving our audiences with something more than wanting to buy a toy, a sugary cereal, or to tune in next week. I wanted to return to writing shows that left kids thinking and feeling something beyond what they look like or what clothes they put on. Back in my children's theater days we didn't sell toys, video games, or subscriptions. We created one-off shows that kids, teachers, and parents loved. Now, I want to do it again! Only this time with far more out-reach!

Through "WEirD Detention," our team can combat one of today's most urgent issues: lack of communication. Our mission: to combat rampant meanness, violence, and the lying that is all too prevalent in our society today. To this end, we will produce our film "Weird Detention," an "edu-tainment" piece that models Conflict Resolution and Compassionate Communication via three troubled tweens in a most entertaining and educational way. Once distributed, parents can stream it, kids can watch it on their iphones, and schools can show it on screens. No worries. We won't leave you hanging. Audiences will also be able to access games and materials all to help understand how to effectively communicate with empathy, clarity, and compassion. Last line here for a hook? (something like – "Let's arm our kids with these tools. The future of our world depends on it.")
