
FEAR



In 2023, there have been 14 school shootings this year that resulted in injuries or deaths (updated April 6, 2023).



WE CAN'T AGREE

Clearly, we need a strategy to deal with conflicts before they build into name-calling, bullying, or even bloodshed.

A SOLUTION WE CAN AGREE ON

Our first preventative strategy [for school shootings] should be to make sure kids are respected, that they feel connected.That means building kids' skills around conflict resolution, stress management and empathy for their fellow classmates - skills that can help reduce all sorts of unwanted behaviors, including fighting and bullying.

CONFLICT RESOLUTION

Conflict Resolution Process

Acknowledge what other is feeling

Listen to understand

Clarify what the other wants

- Ask questions
- Repeat back what you heard
- Ask for confirmation of your understanding of what is meant






MISSION
