
10 Years of Debating

#### **SETTING THE BAR HIGH!**

21 people tuned in to the 104 London Debaters' Zoom Room on Tuesday 13th February for an evening of improvised and prepared debates.

Chiko Maranga chaired the improvised Table Topic minidebate session, with topics centred on emotions; from happiness being overrated, through jealousy, emotional people and the trustworthiness of anger.

Our founding member, Paul Carroll, won best TT for his take on the toxicity of emotional people.

After the break, where we all enjoyed hearing a little from the guests, it was time for Kamal Khan to take up the gavel and chair the main debate of the evening. With many puns he introduced the motion **This House Believes Alcohol is Good for Society.** 

Before the debate 6 people voted in favour, 8 against and 7 abstained. After the debate both teams had increased their vote, with 8 voting in favour, 9 against and 3 abstaining. The Proposition won the swing, but the Opposition had enough to defeat the motion.

Lo, arguing for the Proposition, won the prize for best speaker for a spirited defence of alcohol providing plenty of proof.

In the evaluation, William pointed out that the definition of "good" could have been worked on more to the Prop's benefit, as it was a key value, and that the Opposition risked increasing their burden of proof by favouring pubs with carrot juice and yoga.

## MAJORITY FOR FIRST PAST THE POST

42 people elected to attend the debate meeting on Tuesday 27th February, where the main debate was about the electoral system in the UK.

Sasha led the improvised Table Topic debate session, with topics ranging from fast food and smartphones in schools, to vapes for kids.

After the break and with glasses refilled from the bar, our former Club President, Renata, chaired the debate with more assurance than Sir Lindsay Hoyle.

The motion was **This House Rejects First Past the Post for General Elections**, and after a debate with excellent rhetoric and substantive arguments, both sides had convinced more people to vote for them, but the Opposition more.

14 voted in favour, 17 opposed, 11 abstained, and so the motion was defeated with a swing to the Opposition.



Our Founding Member Paul Carroll, DTM, delivered the debate evaluation, and said that both sides had fulfilled their roles well with a good clash over the purpose of democracy itself.
