



Academic Achievement

Johnson City Schools scored all A's in achievement in grades 3-8 in Math, Reading/Language, Science, and Social Studies, according to the 2014 Tennessee Report Card. For value-added learning gains, Johnson City Schools scored A's in Math, Science, and Social Studies and a B in Reading/Language Arts. At the high school level, Johnson City Schools significantly exceeded the state in students scoring proficient/advanced in Algebra I, Algebra II, Biology, English I, English II, and English III.



 We are pleased to work with Grace Fellowship Church, Coalition for Kids, Homework Club, Rise-Up, Boys & Girls Club, Girls Inc., Carver Recreation, and Memorial Park.
- Mountain View implements the OLWEUS bullying prevention program. At Mountain View, we call this the P.E.A.C.E. program. P.E.A.C.E. educates staff, students, parents, and the community about behaviors related to bullying. The program also implements measureable action plans for reducing bullying behaviors at school.
- We offer Arts programs to our students, such as ballet, chorus, and orchestra.
- MV is the first school in the state of Tennessee to be the recipient of Frontier Health's System of Care (SOC) Expansion grant that provides SOC services to the students and families of Mountain View. These services include the Arts Club (after-school and summer program), counseling services, summer camp opportunities, resource services, and so much more!
