Saskatoon Jelly

Ingredients:

3 cups berry juice ½ cup lemon juice 7 ½ cups sugar 1 bottle liquid pectin (certo)

Instructions:

- Clean and prepare berries. Place about 4lbs in kettle and crush. Heat gently until juice starts to flow and then simmer covered for 15 mins
- Place in jelly cloth and squeeze out juice
- Squeeze and strain juice from 4 lemons and put aside
- To make jelly, measure sugar and juice into a large saucepan and mix.
- Add lemon juice and combine well.
- Bring to a boil over high heat and all at once, add pectin, stirring constantly, then bring to a full rolling boil and boil hard for 1 minute.
- Remove from heat
- Skim and pour quickly into sterilized jars and seal.

Plants to Help Us

Burdock (Arctium minus bernh)

Akwâminakisîmin: île-à-la-Crosse Michif

Machi'kwanaas: Michif-Cree

Medicinal Uses: Alerative, depurative, diaphoretic, diuretic, and tonic.



Burdock is an introduced species, naturalized in North America from Asia and Europe. Vitamin and iron rich, Burdock was originally brought here for food. It can be found along roadsides, fields and vacant lots.

The roots are used in tonics and serve as a strong blood "cleanser", cleansing the body of toxins, while promoting the health of the liver and skin. It is also said to help reduce swelling and deposits in arthritic joints. It is also used for treating gout, high blood pressure, kidney and liver problems and stomach pains. The powdered roots, mixed with grease, are said to help in healing burns and skin irritations, as are poultices made of its leaves. The leaf tea is used following a hard dry cough or after a coughing spell.

All parts of the plant are edible. Both its leaves and roots are used. The leaves can be added to soups and stews. The roots, if dug in the first year, can be used in stir-fries, soups or mashed and fried in patties.

MMF closes successful 52nd Annual, and first virtual, General Assembly

Winnipeg, MB in the Homeland of the Métis Nation – The Manitoba Metis Federation (MMF) has successfully concluded its 52nd Annual – and first virtual – General Assembly.

"COVID-19 has robbed us all of so much over the past year," said David Chartrand, President of the MMF, "Our assemblies are dynamic events with music, dancing, friends and family, all coming together to affirm our Manitoba Métis democracy."

This was the first year that we were not able to gather together in one place, but through today's video conferencing technology, we had a very successful assembly.

Highlights of the event include:

Signing of a Negotiators' Statement of Understanding with the Government of Canada — The Statement is a major
milestone in the negotiation of a Manitoba Métis Self-Government Recognition and Implementation Agreement, which
recognizes the MMF as the Manitoba Métis Government, not a club or an organization. The recognition of our inherent
rights of self-determination and self-government — as differentiated from contingent rights — we have fought hard for over
the generations since the time of Louis Riel.

In 2013, the Supreme Court of Canada declared Canada had failed to implement the lands promise of the Manitoba Act, 1870, and that this was a historic wrong that needed to be rectified. The Statement, along with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's video, renewed Canada's commitment to continue to negotiate with the MMF and resolve this outstanding land claim.

- •\$1 million to support the location of missing and murdered loved ones The program, called Pey Key Way Ta Hin in Michif and Bring Me Home in English, will provide individual rewards for information that leads to locating missing individuals. We are <u>currently offering \$10,000 for tips</u> that lead to locating Jennifer Catcheway and Marcus McKay.
- •\$1 million to Youth Professional Development Along with skill-building conferences, the MMF will support Métis Youth as they pursue their athletic goals in hockey, baseball, curting, golf and more. "It's time to start filling the empty baseball diamonds in our Métis villages," said President Chartrand. "With this fund, we can build Youth camps that will be the best in the province and give our hockey players and other athletes a strong system to help them develop their skills."
- Citizens took to the Internet to watch the weekend's proceedings in record numbers, with Facebook page views up
 225%, well over 55,000 hits on our AGA website and an additional 7,500 plus hits to our www.rmf.mb.ca website. Social media engagement reached its peak with over 7,000 reactions to our evening of music and entertainment.

Out of respect for our Citizens and our democratic process, this virtual assembly passed essential motions, but saw resolutions not deliberated or voted on, but rather tabled to the next assembly, where we expect approximately 3,000 delegates. Once COVID-19 vaccinations are complete in Manitoba, later this autumn, the MMF plans to host an in-person assembly where the tabled resolutions will be voted on.

"We're very proud of our delegates who attended the event, along with the many Métis Citizens and allies who livestreamed the event to watch our democratic process in action. The Local Executives stayed online throughout the entire proceedings and even worked through their lunch," said President Chartrand. "I can't wait until we can fully assemble – hopefully in October 2021 – and get down to the business of governance for the Métis in Manitoba. I know that will be an event to remember."

This virtual annual assembly will be followed by a mini-Annual General Assembly on Monday and Tuesday, where 90 Youth ages 5-12 have registered to learn about Métis democracy and governance matters.


