FEATURED RECIPE

MOOSE STEW WITH WINTER VEGETABLES

LI RABABOO DI NARIYAANL AVIK LII ZHAARDINAAZH D'IVER

INGREDIENTS:

2½ lb. lean boneless moose 1 tbsp. oil 3 tbsp. butter ³/₄ cup chopped onion ¹/₄ cup flour 1 tsp. salt 1/2 tsp. pepper 1 bay leaf 1 tsp. crushed thyme 1 tsp. crushed marjoram 4 cups lightly salted beef stock or water 8 small potatoes 8 small onions 8 medium carrots 3 medium parsnips 3 canned tomatoes plus 1/2 cup liquid 1 cup frozen peas 1/2 cup chopped parsley



INSTRUCTIONS:

- Cut moose into 1½ inch pieces and pat dry with a paper towel.
- In a heavy saucepan, heat oil and butter, and brown the meat one layer at a time. When all meat is browned, set aside.
- Melt more butter in a saucepan if necessary and sauté onion until tender and golden.
- Stir in flour, cooking over medium heat until flour is golden.
- Return meat to the saucepan and add seasonings and stock.
- Using a wooden spoon, scrape up all browned bits from the bottom of the pan.
- Simmer, partially covered, until the moose meat is tender, about 1½ hours.
- Peel potatoes, onions, carrots, turnips, and parsnips. Leave potatoes whole; cut a shallow "x" in the root end of each onion. Cut carrots, turnips, and parsnips into finger-sized sticks. Chop tomatoes coarsely.
- Add vegetables to stew and cook, covered, at moderate heat. Simmer until all ingredients are tender, about 30 to 40 minutes. Add peas and simmer for 5 more minutes.
- Taste and add more seasoning or liquid if necessary.
- Sprinkle with parsley and serve.

LABRADOR TEA

LEDUM GROENLANDICUM

Labrador tea, Muskeg tea, or swamp tea is a plant native to North America and is historically used by many Métis and First Nations groups.

The plant is found in cold boggy areas and grows to about 1 metre (3 feet) high. Labrador tea is a flowering shrub with many long branches, white flowers, and evergreen leaves.

The fragrant leaves are used as a soothing tea. Labrador tea has long been used as a traditional herbal medicine for cough, chest and kidney conditions, headache, rheumatism, diarrhea, sore throat, female disorders, and malignancies.


