Dear friends.

I hope everyone enjoyed a wonderful holiday weekend with friends and family. Does anyone else enjoy looking at the fireworks and spotting flowers in the display? The displays are so fleeting that unless another plant lover is looking at the same display at the same time and from a similar angle, it's difficult to be certain!

One of our native plants that's reliably in bloom this time of the year, the firebush (Hamelia patens), always makes me think of fireworks when I see a mature specimen that's been properly pruned. This native gem is also very easy to propagate from seed. Another reason I think of fireworks when I see blooming is because of the whirling dervish of hummingbirds and butterflies it always attracts. Exercise caution if you decide to add one to your landscape to be certain you are acquiring the true native; over the years, there has been some confusion. Even a mature plant seemingly growing wild might not be our native as some of the other species have crossed and created hybrids. I plan to snap some photos of one I believe is a native and will send them to a botany PhD to verify. Then I'll gather some of the berries to cut and dry to obtain the seeds. Please let me know if you'd like to try your hand at growing some.

A last garden tidbit in keeping with the colors of the Fourth of July is the observation that some of my most rugged vegetable plants thus far have had red leaves or stems! Lettuce variety "Red Sails", and kale variety "Russian Red" were very robust and producing well...until we were gone for a few days, and they didn't receive rain. Next year, I'll use the same direct sow date and try again to see how far into the summer I can coax them with watering. My enormous surprise is how resilient and productive Swiss chard variety "Vulcan" continues to be. It is easily a yard long from stem to leaf tip. I've been using these enormous leaves as green mulch as we cannot possibly eat that much Swiss chard!


