Keeping with my administration's theme of "sowing seeds for tomorrow", I've been experimenting with different vegetable seeds to see how late I can keep having fresh, homegrown lettuce. So far, the Parris Island variety has resisted bolting. I neglected to get my summer vegetable seeds planted during this hectic past spring, so I will soon be sowing some hot weather favorites such as okra, tropical spinach, and Everglades tomatoes.

In my ornamental garden, native Encyclia tampensis (AKA butterfly orchid) my husband and I salvaged from live oak branches after Milton are coming into bloom, as are the various native tillandsia (air plants) we've salvaged. As we get to know more of our neighbors, I hope to start offering to plant some natives in their yards as a neighborly gesture. Of course, there's also the ulterior motive of hoping to share the horticulture bug with them! I also have the ulterior motive of spreading my plants over a larger area than just our yard, which makes them collectively more likely to survive than they would be if they were all in one place.
