How Does Your Garden Grow?

Cheryl Rosten

Cheryl Rosten enjoys being a member of MRGC in the winter months, but most of her gardening in done in the summer in Midland, MI. Cheryl is an Advanced Master Gardener, an active member of Evergreen Garden Club, and a volunteer of the Dahlia Hill Society.

Dahlia Hill was started in the '80's, with a Mother's Day gift of two dahlia tubers. The young girl who gave the gift had no idea her dad was the one who would become intrigued by this unique flower. He ordered more varieties, eventually ran out of space in their yard, and finally, with the help of a local foundation and many donations, bought the property that is now known as Dahlia Hill.

After the first hard frost (approximately the first week of October), the tubers are dug and washed, and the month of November is spent dividing and labeling for winter storage.



Cheryl's favorite: Cafe au Lait



Tubers multiply underground, so of the original 3,000 planted, about 12,000 are stored in bags of vermiculite in a room kept at 45-50 degrees November through April (See photo of freshly dug tubers.) In April, buds start appearing and volunteers begin quality control. Whether planted or sold, a tuber needs to have a bud. The third week in May, the tubers are planted a foot apart and the rest are sold during the week leading up to Memorial Day. Proceeds cover practical expenses such as gravel for the parking lot. Any leftover tubers are given for Master Gardener project gardens.

Over 300 varieties of dahlias are grown on the Hill, with representatives of all 23 petal configurations, which are quite diverse. Over 50 volunteers maintain the garden April-November by weeding and deadheading when blossoms appear in August. Mr. Dahl, a Swede, and other contemporary hybridizers, have not come up with a scented, or true blue dahlia. There is a prize for anyone who does!

Cheryl is also a docent on Dahlia Hill and enjoys enlightening the public about this spectacular flower. For more information, take a look at www.dahliahill.org.
