#### **GAPOA BOARD MEETING BRIEF**

The GAPOA regular meeting was held at the lake pavilion on May 20, 2023.

AFTER welcoming the members in attendance, minutes from the previous GAPOA regular meeting (February 4, 2023, which was held via telephone conference), were read, amended, and ratified.

THE Treasurer's Report was submitted and reviewed by Treasurer, Debbie Turck before the committee chairs presented their reports.

THE potholes were filled as required. The spring thaw has now transitioned to summer dust. Continue to drive with care and posted speed of 15 mph.

SAND will be delivered for the lake beach. The residential geese make a lot of mess - the board is looking at ways to make the environment less friendly for them. Further investigations are required as migratory birds are protected.

PROPERTY owners are reminded to check GAPOA rules and regulations if intending to do any alterations and additions to their property.

THE sterile carp released into the lake in early spring are already showing their value for lake health.



#### ON THE LAKE & AROUND THE COMMUNITY

Dr. Mike Casteel (Water Quality, Microbiology) is contracted by the GAPOA board to study, monitor and evaluate the lake water quality. He reports to the board and immediate action can be taken if the water quality deteriorates. *Please take note of the CAUTION signs posted at the lake.* 

FOR any inquiries or concerns, please contact the board (Chair Fred Turck or Brian Snyder Environment Chair). You will regularly see Mike in the GAPOA boat, at various hours and days of the week, for water testing. Information signs about the beach and lake water quality are quided by the summer testing program in place by the board. You will likely see Dr. Mike Casteel (Water Qulaity, Microbiology) at various times, testing water samples. There are several testing areas around the lake, with focus on the beach area, and lake edges. Mike will immediatley notify the board to assess information caution levels. As the air and water temperatures increase, the alagae and potential coliform levels may increase. Lake water reports are updated on the website and at the lake.

NOTE: If you are NOT in good standing, you do not have access to the GAPOA common ground areas (lake, beach, pavilion, fishing pier). This also means you can not be a 'guest' of another property owner, even if they are in good standing. Payments of assessments, arrears, or any other penalty are accepted all year. #### BEACH AND WATER QUALITY INFORMATION

Regular water quality testing will continue over the summer. Please check any updates posted at the lake gate and beach.

The migratory Canadian geese are very content hanging out at the lake too. They do make a mess! You will see a bucket and scoop... feel free to try it out before - instructions are included!

Below are the information signs - for algae and e.coli potential contamination.

#### **HURRICANES ARE NOT JUST COASTAL**

- **determine** your risk
- develop an evacuation plan include all members of your household - you may need to just move to a lower level of your home, or leave the area immediately!
- assemble supplies examples include a flashlight and spare batteries, bottled water (3 days worth/per person), canned food, blankets, and medications
- check your insurance policies and do any property maintenance BEFORE an event
- help your neighbor we are all in this together
- write out your plan and share with your group

#### STORM ON THE HORIZON

## GET OFF THE LAKE! GET OUT OF THE WATER! FIND SAFE SHELTER RIGHT AWAY!

Thunderstorms are dangerous storms that include lightning and can:

- Create powerful winds over 50 MPH
   Create hail
- Cause flash flooding and tornadoes
   WHEN THUNDER ROARS
   GO INDOORS!
- Move from outdoors into a building or car
  - Pay attention to alerts and warnings
    - Unplug appliances
    - Do not use landline phones

#### **HEAT RELATED ILLNESSES**

- NEVER leave any children, pets, or adults in a closed, parked vehicle
- Drink more fluids (nonalcoholic)
   Don't wait until you're thirsty to drink
- Stay indoors or find a cooling center in your area on extremely hot days
- Wear lightweight, loose-fitting clothing
- Stay indoors during extremely hot temperatures
- Use sunscreen, even on cloudy days
- Wear protective sunglasses and hats

#### **RECREATIONAL WATER ILLNESSES**


Recreational water illnesses are caused by germs spread by swallowing or having contact with contaminated water in swimming pools, hot tubs, water parks, lakes, rivers, or oceans. Recreational water illnesses can include a wide variety of infections, including gastrointestinal, skin, ear, respiratory, and eye infections.

- Don't swallow pool, lake, pond or river water
- Shower with soap before and after swimming
- Avoid swimming, or other activities in obviously stagnant freshwater bodies when temperatures are high and water levels are low

#### **FOOD RELATED ILLNESSES**

Most foodborne illnesses result from food being contaminated when it is being prepared or served.

- Clean Wash hands, cutting boards, utensils, and countertops
- Separate Keep raw meat, poultry, and seafood separate
- Cook –Ensure that foods are cooked to a safe internal temperature: 145°F for whole meats, 160°F for ground meats, and 165°F for all poultry.
- Chill Keep your refrigerator below 40°F. Refrigerate food that will spoil



#### MIGRATORY CANADIAN GEESE BECOME COMMUNITY RESIDENTS

"These long-necked, graceful geese have become an unrelenting nuisance in parts of Virginia. It's not all their fault:

Development and other intrusions to their habitat contributed to the problem.

A federal law also protects them, though maybe it's worked too well.

The Migratory Bird Treaty Act safeguards Canada geese and many other species.

Congress passed the 1918 law "to combat over-hunting and poaching that supplied the enormous demand for feathers to adorn women's hats."

Many Canada geese today, though, flourish. The birds have only a few predators, including foxes and raccoons."

## Residents can not legally cull the birds before taking several other steps first.

www.virginianercury.com www.shorturl.at/cdkJN Based on the Environmental Inpact Statemtn EIS (2006), the USFWS revised the Federal Regulations that pertain to resident Canada geese.

Changes were made to make it easier for the public to resolve resident Canada goose conflicts. Among the changes, specific "Depredation Orders" were developed that allow landowners to remove Canada geese at airports, in agricultural areas, and in other areas where they are causing conflicts with human populations.

## No permit is required, but you must register with the USFWS in order to conduct this activity.

A website has been developed specifically for this registration process, and provides additional information on the program.

While more choices to create a humane but 'hostile' environment are being investigated under the guidance of DWR (VA Dept. of Wildlife Resources), a Goosey-Scooper is available for beach and lake users to use! It is located by the beach
