Collage Workshop Handout/Supply List

YOU WILL NOT NEED YOUR SEWING MACHINE FOR THIS WORKSHOP

Supplies:

Collage outline of Butterfly, Whale Tail, Seashell or Nautilus Shell. You may also use an image
outline of your choosing.
Collage fabrics. This is a great stash buster. Make sure you have a selection of different cuttable
motifs (sea creatures, flowers, vines, etc.).
Pattern Ease foundation/Pellon 830 OR background fabric 1 yard. You will only need Pattern
Ease/Pellon 830 if you're using a background with many different fabrics.
Steam A Seam 2 (regular or lite) Double Stick Fusible Web This comes in 24," 18," 12," on the roll
and $9" \times 12"$ sheets. Make sure you have enough to complete your project. You'll need $1-2$ yards,
depending on your chosen pattern. VERY important that you use Steam A Seam 2 fusible web, as
you'll need to be able to reposition your fabrics. Heat & Bond and others will not be conducive to
this type of quilt.
Blank Canvas Board. Optional. This is for mounting your finished collage. You won't need this for
class. For the butterfly, whale tail and nautilus shell, I used 18" x 24" and for the seashell I used 14"
x 14 "

Tools & Notions

#2 pencil	Appliqué pressing sheet
Black Sharpie pen	Precision Fusing Mat
Frixion pen	Rotary Cutter
Cutting Mat	Ruler
Scissors (love Karen K. Buckley brand)	Tweezers
Mini Iron & ironing pad	Light box (optional)

Before Class Meets:

- 1. Print your chosen pattern and tape it together, ensuring you follow the order of the layout. You'll need to trim some of the edges to match up your lines.
- 2. Cut your Pattern Ease foundation/Pellon 830 or background fabric 2 inches wider than your blank canvas board.
- 3. Cut the fabrics you KNOW you want to use into a manageable size. I find 6" x 12" pieces or smaller is manageable.
- 4. We'll fuse our fabrics in class, but if you're an over achiever, feel free to fuse the fabrics you'll be using for the main part of your collage to Steam A Seam 2 (regular or lite) fusible web. You'll need your Applique Pressing Sheet for this step. Check out this YouTube video on fusing preparation https://youtu.be/TKODAxApTmg. Once fused, separate the fabrics from the fusible web using your rotary cutter and mat. Clean up any frayed edges and those that have excess fusible around them.

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
