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Specialty Supplies:

- ☐ **Fabric Solids.** A fat quarter of 7 different solids will be more than enough to complete one 16" block. Refer to the pattern for shade variations. According to the pattern the Red, Green, Blue and Purple Gift Bows use colors from the Robert Kaufman Kona collection. The Pink and Aqua Gift Bows use a combination of colors from the Robert Kaufman Kona collection and Art Gallery Pure Solids collection. The Silver and Gold Gift Bows use colors from Riley Blake Confetti Cotton collection.
- ☐ **A sewing machine in good working order**
- ☐ **Paper:** Regular 20 lb copy paper or specialized lightweight FPP paper.
- ☐ **Add-A-Quarter Ruler:** Features a specialized lip that lets you trim your fabric seam allowances accurately to a consistent 1/4 inch.
- ☐ **Card Stock 5" x 7" piece** or any old greeting card you have lying around

Standard Tools and Notions

Needles 70/10 or 80/12	Rotary Cutter
Small Cutting Mat	Mini Iron and pressing mat
Seam roller	Pins and/or Wonder Clips
Tweezers	Ruler
Mini scrap and/or trash bag	Fabric glue pen or temporary water-soluble glue stick
Seam ripper	Scissors
Best Press or Starch	

Before Class Meets:

1. Print the pattern at Custom Scale 100% on either 20lb copy paper or specialty FPP paper. Please note, the pattern includes TWO sets of pattern pieces. One is blank, which will allow you to write your colors on each piece and the other is labeled specifically for the RED bow. You will only need ONE set to complete one 16" block.
2. Using the fabric key on page 4 of the pattern, number your chosen fabrics. If using any color other than Red, try to follow the fabric gradations based on the Reds.
3. Cut out your paper pieces slightly larger than the dotted line.
