"Picture Piecing" With Cynthia England Tuesday, February 8, 2022 9:30-4:00 Oneco United Methodist Church 2112 53rd Ave. E., Bradenton

Do you like the accuracy of paper piecing but hate ripping out all the paper? Cynthia's workshop will give you a frustration-free method to achieve the accuracy but avoid the ripping. Using a small landscape pattern and her method, you will learn her technique to be able to produce a quilt from simple to complex, small to large. There will be a half day of sewing using a small landscape pattern, Sandy Shore, and a half day of design so you can learn how to apply her method to your own designs of any size. A kit fee of \$45 that includes the pattern, all fabric, instructions, and all design supplies is payable to the instructor. Cynthia's method is clever and applicable to designs of any size and complexity, and she will explain and demonstrate her process thoroughly. If you are familiar with Cynthia's book "Picture Piecing," you are already an admirer! Her prizewinning large quilts use many tiny pieces and appear at first glance to be appliquéd.

Have you been wanting to try ruler quilting? Have you purchased rulers and been hesitant to jump right in and experiment? Here's the workshop for you! Diane will guide you through the process and get you started. Learn the basics of free-motion quilting using rulers to design custom quilting for your quilts! No marking, no mess, no stress! You will learn how to divide the quilt into smaller sections, use rulers to fill the spaces with curves, lines, grid, or circles. Learn all the tips and tricks for avoiding common problems and getting great results. <u>A ruler foot for your</u> <u>machine is required.</u> No book or pattern purchase is required. The best news is we finally have our location for judging. We will be at Harvest United Methodist Church. The church is located at 14305 Covenant Way, Lakewood Ranch. Due to church hours, we will hold quilt in-take on Monday, February 14, from 10 - 2 pm. If you are not able to make that time, you may send your quilt with a friend or contact a board member. We will be happy to arrange a time to pick up your quilt. Directions to Harvest UMC

If north of SR 70 – Go east on SR 70 to Lorraine Road (about 3.7 miles). Turn right on Lorraine Road, and continue 2.6 miles to Covenant Way on the left.

South of University – Go east on University Parkway (about three miles) to Lorraine Road. Turn left. The church will be the left.

The deadline to submit quilts for the quilt show has past and we will not be accepting any new submissions. Thanks

Consignment Shop

Want to earn some extra cash? Cash you could use to enlarge your stash? We will have a consignment shop at our quilt show in February. If you have quilts, home deco items, or wearables that you wish to sell, we will have a booth set aside to help you. Forms will be available online and at the January meeting. Each item will require a separate, completed form. Please complete the entry forms and return them to June Cannon, either by mail (11846 Dunster Ln, Parrish, FL 34219), email (June.cannon@sbcglobal.net), or by hand at the at the convention center. Items MUST be clean and odor free. A 20% consignment fee will be deducted from the proceeds and the funds will be earmarked for the 2022 quilt show.

For items being judged that you wish to sell, a "For Sale" tag will be affixed to the quilt directing interested parties to the Consignment Shop attendant for upcoming meetings. We will collect the items on February 17, 2022 during set-up information. A consignment form will also be required in addition to the entry form for any judged items. Please turn these forms in asap so that the preliminary paperwork may be completed.

This year we are opening accepted consignment items to Knit or Crochet items as we know many of our quilters have additional skills. Only Manatee Patchworkers may place items in the Consignment Shop. So check your closets for any quilts, place mats, table runners, pot holders, or quilted jackets you'd like to turn into \$\$\$.

Consignment Shop Information

- No unfinished items will be accepted, unless it is a completed quilt top.
- Consignment fee of 20% will be deducted from the proceeds.
- Minimum price per item will be \$25.00
- Consignors will receive a check from the guild within 2 weeks after the quilt show.
- You may consign as many items as you wish, but each item must be accompanied by a completed consignment form.
- Please retain a copy of the completed form(s) for your records.

• Unsold items must be picked up at the Bradenton Area Convention Center on Saturday, February 19, 2022, between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. Either the consignor or an authorized alternate must collect the unsold item. If an alternate is to pick up the unsold item, please provide written authorization including the name of the alternate and your name.

• Items being judged in the quilt show are also available for consignment. A tag will be affixed to the item directing the prospective purchaser to contact the Consignment Shop attendant for further information. Consignment entry forms must also be completed for these items.

We will be layering quilts. Volunteers are needed to help with selecting, piecing, & pressing backing and bagging & labeling the quilts into kits to be available for members to take home after meetings.

There is a microwave and a refrigerator available if you wish to bring your lunch - there's also a Subway in the plaza next to the library.

The dog bed process is working well - 29 dog beds were donated to the Humane Society in January. Please remember to pick up dog bed covers at the Community Service table at meetings so they can be taken home and "stuffed" with fabric and batting scraps. This process eliminates the necessity of storing scraps and scheduling a special workshop to assemble and stuff the dog beds.
