I just read the announcement about your "yard" sale on April 4th. I am not able to attend the sale, but I have a guilt that I would like to give to someone. Yes, give!

I was told at one of your quilt shows a couple of years ago that it is probably from the 1880s (based on the condition of some of the pieces that have deteriorated on account of the dye used at the time).

It was given to me by a friend a number of years ago, so I don't know anything else about it. I want to give it to a person who will cherish it and enjoy it - not someone who will just turn around and sell it on eBay.

It is a small quilt. The maker embroidered her name discretely in the sashing. That makes me think it might have been a young girl's very first quilt. It doesn't look as if it's ever been cleaned, and, as I said, some pieces are falling apart due to the dye. Still - it's a lovely thing and would look good as an addition to someone's treasured collection.

If you know of such a person in your guild, I would like to be in touch with her (or him). I do not drive at night, but I could meet that person during the day somewhere.
