

In her novel *Their Eyes Were Watching God*, Zora Neale Hurston suggests, "There are years that ask questions and years that answer." Sometimes it is only in retrospect that we are able to discern the difference. Some questions seem simple, almost inconsequential. Others carry more weight. Sometimes answers are effortless, strong and sure in their certainty. Others are more malleable, given to circumstance and even happenstance.

Questions help us determine where we are heading and help us make sense of where we have been. Personally, I tend to put more stock in the questions than the answers. How they are framed, to whom they are asked, their intended purpose – each smaller question has the potential to draw us toward larger answers. I am quite fond of saying, "Ask difficult questions. Question easy answers."

Crafting questions can be a bit of an artform. You have heard me speak of my friend Ethan, I am sure. He is on his high school's Academic Challenge team. He will tell you that, while there may be no such thing as a "stupid" question, there are definitely poorly worded ones. In a quiz bowl context, questions are meant to solicit particular, factual answers. Sometimes, however, questions are meant to shine a light in the darkness that comes from not knowing. Sometimes questions awaken us to what may yet be possible if we dare to look at what counts as an answer from a different angle.

So often over the course of a week, I have many conversations with many of you. So often, I think to myself of someone else who needs to hear bits and pieces of what we are talking about – folks who have dealt with similar circumstances, folks who are engaged in various church projects and efforts, folks who would be blessed by the insightful thoughts and ideas you so generously share with me.






