I am not, in any way, shape or form, an athlete. I am fond of joking (but not really) if you ever see me running, you should be running as well, as danger is surely afoot. Truth be told, I am not much of a spectator, either. By virtue of being in marching band and jazz band, I have seen my fair share of football and basketball games, but that's all.

The Olympics are an exception. There is something about the convergence of so many people with such impressive control of their bodies and minds. The self-discipline and skill necessary for training and competition is incredible. The idea of folks with such diverse backgrounds and cultures sharing a world stage is refreshingly hopeful during anxious times.

My favorite event is women's gymnastics. Perhaps it is because I am rather uncoordinated, dare I say clumsy, but I marvel at such strength, power, and spirit. There is an alluring balance of grace and grit. I remember Mary Lou Retton's fierce performance that secured the all-around gold medal in 1984. Then in 1996, who could forget Kerri Strug, who "stuck the landing" even though she had seriously injured her ankle. Simone Biles' decision to prioritize her physical as well as mental health in 2020 stands out as a feat of strength and courage of a different mettle.

I don't recall exactly when it happened, but there is another moment in gymnastics history that has stayed with me. A young woman from Team USA had just completed her routine, and while she finished strong, it was evident she had hurt herself in some way. As the camera panned to her teammates, there was a considerable display of enthusiasm. Then, I noticed one of the athletes mouthing what I took to be "Are you okay?" Her brow furrowed a bit as she expressed concern for her friend. Winning isn't everything, particularly if the cost is someone's well-being.

We all need to be reminded, from time to time, that we are "fearfully and wonderfully made." (Psalm 139.14) We need to be reminded that respecting our limitations is not a sign of weakness, but rather remarkable strength. We need to be reminded that compassion is far more precious than gold. And, we need to be reminded that we are all, in fact, in this together.

### Greetings, Howland Community Church Family-

It is with a heavy heart that I let you know that my time at Howland Community Church will be coming to an end sooner than I had expected.

As part of my ordination process I have to undergo CPE Training, which is experience and education in Chaplaincy. I knew that I would eventually be taking part in this training, however, I didn't realize that I wouldn't be able to work elsewhere while going through training. I will be working under a Chaplain at a United Church Homes assisted living facility in Canal Fulton, which is by Canton. That's an hour drive from Shaker Heights, and even further from Howland. I will be putting in 20 hours a week of service time there. On top of that, I will be taking part in a 4 hour class every Wednesday, and I'll have weekly meetings with instructors and my mentors. This is a 6 month training program that will take me from October to April.

A few weeks ago I had what the United Church of Christ calls a Wisdom Circle. It was comprised of the General Minister of the Living Water Association, my advisor, mentor, and pastor from my home church in Shaker Heights. The Wisdom Circle is designed to determine what a Member in Discernment has left to complete before their ordination. It was determined that I will be ready for my ordination paper, and final preparations after I complete my CPE Training. I hadn't anticipated it happening so quickly.

Had I known that my ordination process was going to be completed so quickly I wouldn't have applied for the Youth Pastor position at Howland Community Church. However, I can't with a good conscience say that I shouldn't have applied. I can't state this enough, it has been an absolute pleasure, honor, and blessing to get to know all of you and to be a part of the Howland Community Church Family. What you all and Erica have done for me in this journey I am on is immeasurable. You all taught me how to walk on this ministerial path, and for that I will be forever grateful to all of you. I could write an entire book on all that I learned from Erica but you all know how special and amazing she is. What a blessing it is to have had her as a mentor and friend, and to continue to have her mentoring me even as I navigate through this next chapter. She and I are friends for life.

As far as the business side goes I just wanted to mention a few things. This job was always about what I could do for H.C.C. and the experience I could gain from it. I was allotted 20 hours a week, but rarely did I ever exceed 10 hours a week. Also, *every* donut, pizza, juice box, craft, party favor, etc. that was used for Youth Group from day 1 was paid for by Rene and me. I didn't want to tax the church anymore than was necessary, and it was our pleasure to help out the church that was always so good to us. Furthermore, after I preached on Father's Day (6/16) I stopped receiving any pay, and I've been working as a volunteer and will continue to do so until August 25, which will be the last day I'll be at the church in a working role.

Goodbyes are always difficult but this is definitely not a goodbye. I am not moving out of the state, and when my schedule allows believe that I will be down in Howland for church, for the special Christmas and Lent services, fish fries, etc.

I love you all and though I won't be serving as your youth pastor anymore I hope that I will always be your friend

and a part of your family.

# Client Choice Pantry




