I was very intentional, not to mention genuine, as I thanked him for such a good idea.

I am proud that it is my good fortune to be your pastor, and that you are willing to share a bit of your journey, your story, with me and with each other. "It's such a good feeling!" Thank you!

# Herman and Jane Crum Scholarship Application Now Available

Howland Community Church members and children of church members are eligible to submit an application for a scholarship from the Herman and Jane Crum Scholarship Fund, maintained by the Endowment Fund Board of Howland Community Church.

Eligible applicants must:

- be enrolled, or accepted for enrollment, at an institution of higher learning beyond high school (includes vocational schools)
- be a resident of Trumbull County, Ohio
- submit a completed application via email to <a href="https://example.com">HCCCED@gmail.com</a> for the Church Board to review by June 15

To receive a copy of the Crum Scholarship application, please e-mail <a href="https://example.com">HCCCED@gmail.com</a> and one will be provided to you. Award decisions will be made by June 30, 2025. The monies available in this scholarship fund vary year to year and an award amount will be decided once applications have been received and approved. Any monies awarded will be a one-time award for that school year, and funds will be given directly to the school or institution where the student is officially enrolled.

Any award is to be considered a gift not required to be repaid; however, if a recipient wishes to pay back the amount awarded to be utilized in the granting of additional scholarships in the future, that action is welcomed.
