
The Community Messenger ERICA EXTEMPORANEOUS

My Grampa Slagle had a deeply abiding faith in God. I know this because of how he lived his life. I know this because of what he valued. Christmas and Easter, for sure; maybe Veterans' Day and Memorial Day. He could often be persuaded by a covered dish dinner, as well. I will say this.... Grampa never missed Ash Wednesday.

Every year on Ash Wednesday, Warren First United Methodist Church and Grace A.M.E Church joined together in worship. We alternated locations and preachers every other year... choirs as well. The music! Such beautiful music, so very different from what we were perhaps used to hearing. The same could be said of the preaching – we were not accustomed to the enthusiasm, or the sense of the Spirit, that seemed to envelop the pastor at Grace A.M.E. The host congregation prepared a sprawling meal and the guests brought dessert, which I recall was always a glorious array of pie. Do I even need to clarify that the pie was homemade, down to the last crumb of crust?

Grampa worked for many years at Republic Steel. A number of the gentlemen at Grace AME worked by his side. They loved to visit and share stories, occasionally eliciting a raised eyebrow from their wives. I loved being introduced as Bud's granddaughter, while Grampa's friends spoke of their own grandchildren, some of whom where my classmates.

I don't know that I understood exactly what Ash Wednesday meant, beyond the fact that we seemed to spend even more time at the church in those weeks leading up to Easter. I did know that it was important to realize we didn't do this alone. Lots of people, in lots of churches, marked this time, these forty days give or take, as holy.

Warren First United Methodist Church sadly closed its doors several years ago. I am considerably older now. Aren't we all? I earned a Master of Divinity degree and have served as an ordained minister for very nearly twenty-five years. Truth be told, I still struggle with Ash Wednesday and its significance within our faith. How do we journey from the stark reminder of our mortality (with or without pie) to the glorious assurance of resurrection? We stumble. We stride. We wander and wobble. With each step we take, we know the solid ground beneath our feet and the sturdy shoulders of those who stand alongside us. We learn how to live, how to love. We learn what we are called to value – the community we know as dearly loved children of God.







