I saw the web, then I didn't. I moved the phone to compensate, first too far, then not far enough. It's hard to capture something when that something is hard to see.

Except, of course, when it isn't. Have you had occasion to view the Northern Lights when they've been visible in our area? Sadly, I have not, but I have seen breathtaking photographs. Apparently, when you use the proper settings on your phone, you are actually able to see the celestial phenomenon more clearly than with the naked eye. Fascinating!

I spend a good amount of time thinking about how Howland Community Church is seen in the larger community. I wonder what it might take to bring more folks through our doors, and what might encourage them to stay, to become a part of our vision, our mission. It's largely a matter of perception, of perspective. "Open our eyes that we may see," dear God. Open our eyes. Open our minds. Open our hearts.

# Greetings from Gabby!


What do you think about all of the pretty leaves? Have you noticed how they have changed colors?






## Client Choice Pantry
