# Moving Forward Together

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#### The United States Constitution

Article II, Section 1 of the U.S. Constitution imposes only three eligibility requirements on persons serving as president, based on the officeholder's age, time of residency in the U.S., and citizenship status:

#### U.S. Constitution - Presidential Candidate Eligibility

"No person except a natural born Citizen, or a Citizen of the United States, at the time of the Adoption of this Constitution, shall be eligible to the Office of President; neither shall any person be eligible to that Office who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been fourteen Years a Resident within the United States."

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#### What This Plan Includes

## 1. Real-Time Transparency

#### • Public Online Portal:

A simple, easy-to-use website will show how every dollar of U.S. aid is spent. Taxpayers will be able to see:

- o Total aid provided.
- o How funds are divided (e.g., food, housing, infrastructure).
- o Updates on projects funded by U.S. aid.

#### • Quarterly Reports:

Every three months, a detailed report will be released to explain:

- o Progress made with U.S. aid.
- o Any challenges or issues encountered.

## • Independent Audits:

Aid spending will be reviewed every six months by independent experts. Their findings will be published for the public to ensure full accountability.

#### 2. Reform-Driven Support

#### • Strict Benchmarks:

Ukraine must meet the following goals to continue receiving aid:

- o Within 6 Months: Create a centralized anti-corruption registry.
- Within 12 Months: Prosecute at least 10 major corruption cases and establish an independent anti-corruption agency.
- Within 18 Months: Demonstrate significant reductions in government corruption and oligarchic influence.

#### • Redirection of Aid:

If these benchmarks are not met, U.S. aid will be redirected to trusted organizations like NGOs or local Ukrainian communities to ensure that funds still benefit the people.

#### 3. Citizen Empowerment



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#### • Taxpayer Oversight:

A bipartisan "Taxpayer Accountability Council" will oversee aid spending and hold public hearings to address concerns.

#### • Ukrainian Voices in the U.S.:

Ukrainian refugees and expatriates living in the U.S. will serve as advisors to ensure aid is culturally relevant and effective.

#### • Local Control in Ukraine:

Aid will bypass corrupt centralized systems and go directly to local Ukrainian communities for rebuilding schools, hospitals, and homes.

## 4. Immediate Humanitarian Support

#### • Focus on Essential Needs:

Aid will prioritize:

- o Food and clean water for displaced families.
- o Emergency shelters and housing.
- Medical supplies and healthcare access.

# • Trusted Delivery Partners:

Aid will be delivered through respected international organizations, ensuring it reaches those in need.
