The United States Constitution

Article II, Section 1 of the U.S. Constitution imposes only three eligibility requirements on persons serving as president, based on the officeholder's age, time of residency in the U.S., and citizenship status:

U.S. Constitution – Presidential Candidate Eligibility

"No person except a natural born Citizen, or a Citizen of the United States, at the time of the Adoption of this Constitution, shall be eligible to the Office of President; neither shall any person be eligible to that Office who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been fourteen Years a Resident within the United States."

Executive Order

North American Free Trade & Security Partnership Act of 2028

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Preamble

Through this agreement, we commit to:

- Eliminating unnecessary trade barriers and restoring free trade across North America.
- Prioritizing economic growth, sustainable energy cooperation, and technological advancement.
- Protecting individual freedoms while ensuring responsible security policies.
- Addressing systemic social and economic issues, including housing affordability and workforce development.

Objective:
