

Get your shots at the pharmacy.

Make it easier to stay protected against common infections and viruses.

You can get your vaccines (including the seasonal flu shot) at your local retail pharmacy. You don't need an appointment – just stop in or get it while you shop.

Your plan covers these vaccines at the pharmacy

- Childhood vaccines such as measles, mumps and rubella (MMR)
- Covid-19
- Flu
- Hepatitis
- Human papillomavirus (HPV)
- Meningitis
- Pneumonia
- Shingles/zoster
- Tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis



Know before you go

It's a good idea to call your pharmacy or find an in-network pharmacy on **myCigna.com**® before you go for your shot. Make sure:

- The pharmacy has the vaccine you want to get and ask if there are any age restrictions
- Your vaccine is covered
- A certified pharmacist will give you the vaccine

Simply bring your Cigna HealthcareSM ID card with you. The pharmacy will take care of the rest.



Not all plans will cover vaccines in the same way. Log in to the myCigna App or myCigna.com, or check your plan materials, to find out how your specific plan covers them. You can also see a current list of covered vaccines and pharmacies in your plan's network. Most immunizations for travel aren't covered. If you use an out-of-network pharmacy, services may not be covered or may be subject to your plan's copay, coinsurance or deductible. Call your pharmacy to make sure the vaccine is covered and available at their location. You shouldn't need to make an appointment to get a vaccine.

Health benefit plans vary, but in general to be eligible for coverage a drug must be approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), prescribed by a health care professional, purchased from a licensed pharmacy and medically necessary. For costs and details of coverage, see your plan documents.

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
