Firstly, our school is currently undergoing the VRQA audit process, an important milestone that supports our commitment to maintaining high standards of governance, teaching, learning, and compliance. We appreciate the dedication of our staff in preparing for this audit and thank our community for their ongoing trust and cooperation as we work through this process.

We are also pleased to share exciting news regarding our school expansion plans. As part of our growth, we have secured 5 Killarney Drive, which has been developed into a new library, musollah, staffroom and meeting space. We are also in the process of upgrading the existing student toilets, including the installation of wudhu' basins. These additions will greatly enhance our learning environment and provide valuable facilities for both students and staff.

In line with our vision for continuous growth, we have submitted an application to the VRQA for the inclusion of Year 10 in 2027, with the outcome expected in Term 3 this year. Looking ahead, we also plan to introduce Year 11 in 2028 and Year 12 (VCE) in 2029, InshaAllah, allowing our students to complete their full secondary education within our school.

Student Representative Committee Raises Over \$2,000 for Charity

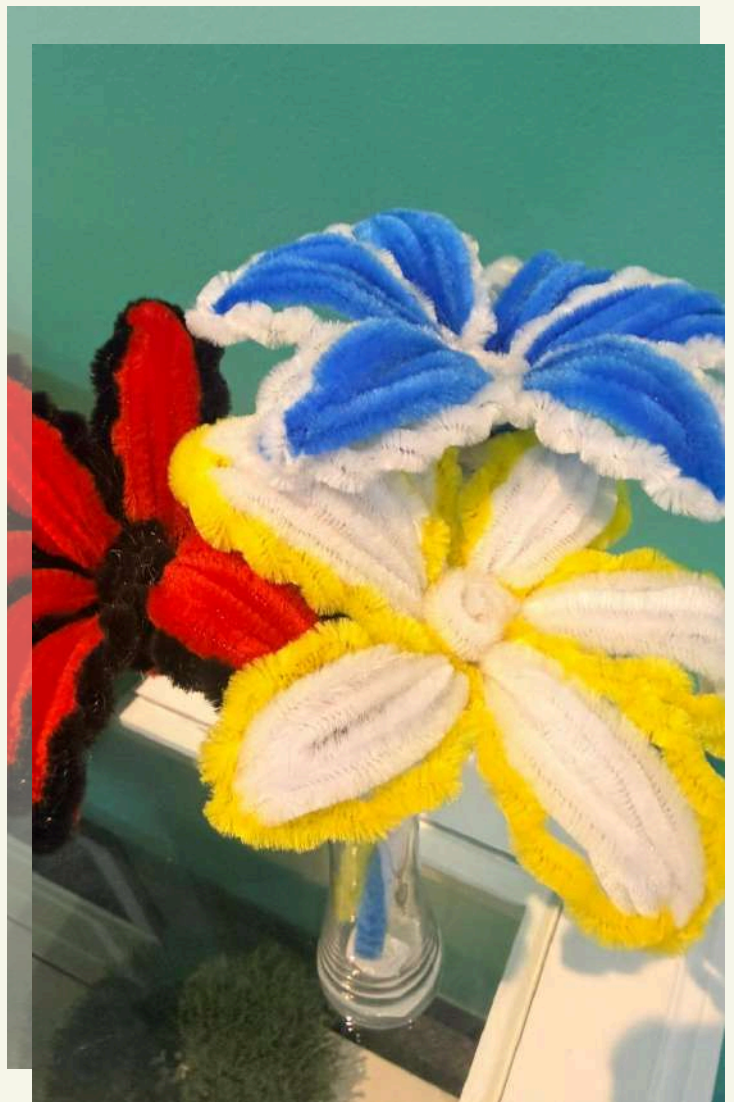


SRC Blooms for a Cause

Throughout Term 2, students continued to strengthen their Quran recitation skills, building confidence, accuracy and fluency at their individual levels. They worked step by step to improve pronunciation and reading, while also developing a deeper connection and love for the Book of Allah.

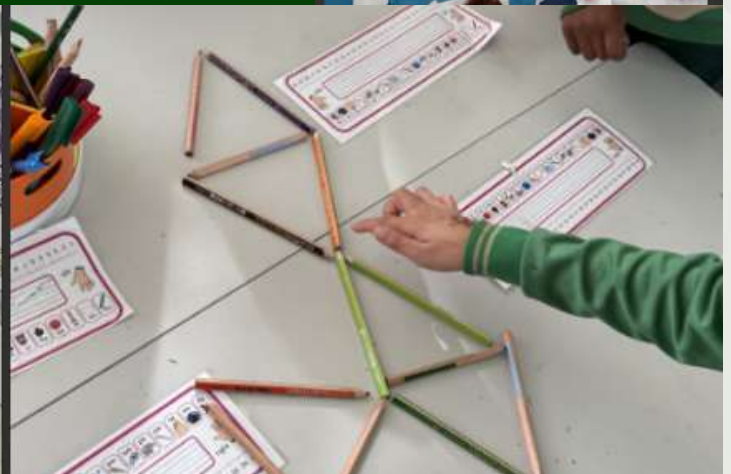


Engaging Learning Across the Curriculum

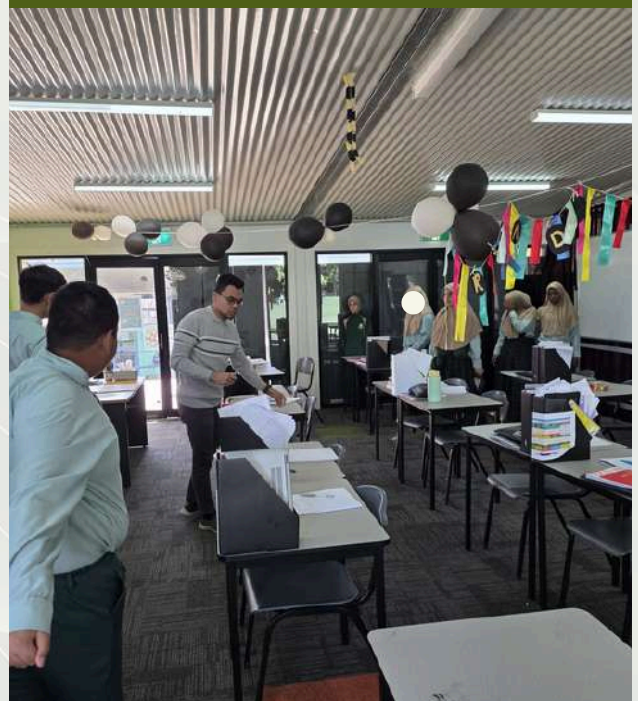
Figurative Language in Action

Building Skills for Life

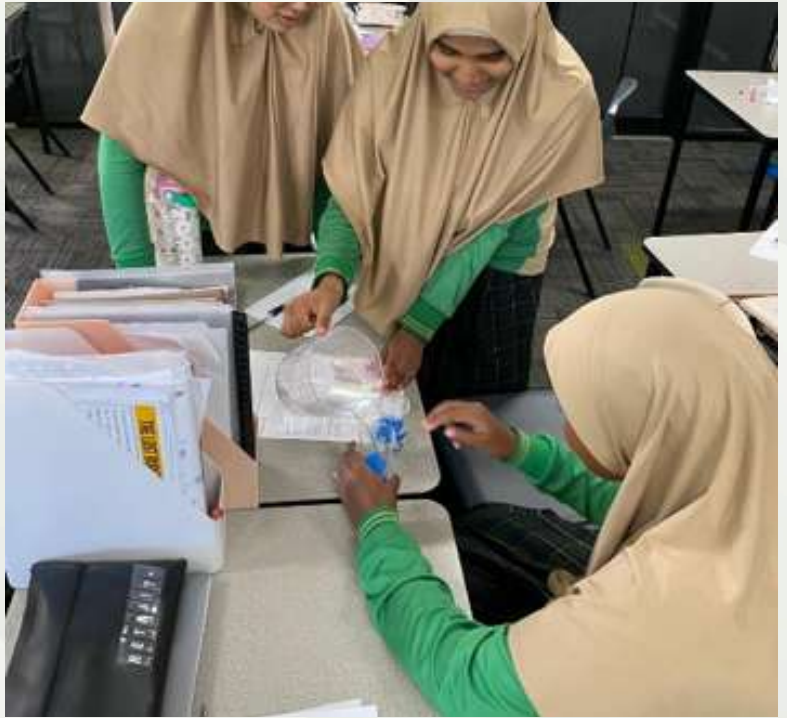
