
### MY BACKGROUND








## Building Skills and Confidence





# STEPPING INTO THE SHOES OF BRITISH CONVICTS

This term, our Grade 5 students took a fascinating deep dive into Australian history by engaging in a project centred around writing British Convict Diaries. The students researched the life of convicts who were transported to Australia on the First Fleet in 1788, imagining their emotions, challenges, and survival strategies. They explored the long and difficult journey from Britain to the penal colonies, the harsh conditions aboard the ships, and the initial struggle to adapt to the unfamiliar environment of the new land. Through this creative writing exercise. students reflected on the tough realities faced by these early settlers, from their time in the crowded, disease-ridden ships to the grueling labour they were forced to perform in the harsh penal settlements. By stepping into the shoes of convicts, the students developed a personal connection to this significant chapter in Australia's history, making the past feel real and tangible.





## Building Historical Awareness and Literacy Skills

This immersive and hands-on project not only gave students a deeper understanding of Australia's colonial history but also played a vital role in their literacy developing Writing in the form of a personal diary students to practise perspective-taking and develop their ability to write descriptively and emotively. They were challenged to think about the historical context of characters, considering limited resources and the harsh living conditions they faced. Additionally, the project provided opportunities for students to hone their research skills, as they needed to gather information on the First Fleet, the convict system, and life in the early colonies. By combining history with creative expression, students also enhanced their ability to communicate their ideas in a structured and thoughtful way. Well done to all our Grade 5 students for their fantastic effort in making this project both educational and creatively engaging! This project has not only enriched their knowledge but also helped them grow as skilled and confident writers.

#### PHYSICAL EDUCATION

**Physical** Education. students In focused on two major sports: Baseball and European handball. They started by learning the rules and skills needed to participate in each sport, from being uncertain on how to put on a glove or hold the bat, to then catch the opposing team's hits and batting in baseball to homeruns, the student's skills improved significantly over the term. As the term progressed. students took part in full matches against other year levels, showing incredible growth in their skills. and confidence. teamwork energy, effort and sportsmanship displayed during each lesson were truly impressive.

## MATHEMATICS LEARNING UST. BILAL

In Mathematics, students worked through key areas across the term with a strong focus on deep understanding and problem-solving. We began with fractions, where students learned to place them on number lines, find equivalents, and confidently add and subtract them. In algebra, they explored visual and number patterns, used brackets in equations, and worked unknowns. Later in the term, we investigated statistics, with students conducting their investigations and presenting their findings in tables and graphs. Across all units, students developed critical thinking skills and began to see themselves as capable and confident mathematicians.

## INQUIRY UST. BILAI

This term's Inquiry unit took students on a journey through significant events in Australian History, including the Gold Rush and Federation. They explored how the discovery of gold in the 1850s shaped Australian society and brought people from all over the world to the goldfields. Students also learned about the reasons behind Federation, the key figures involved. and how the colonies united to become one nation in 1901. These helped students build lessons historical thinking skills and connect past events to modern Australian identity.

## **HEALTH** UST. BILAL

This term in Health, our focus was on drug education and developing the skills to make safe, informed choices. Students explored the differences between legal and illegal drugs, learning how substances can affect the body and mind. Through role plays and discussions, they practised ways to say "no" confidently, respond to peer pressure, and identify trusted adults they can turn to for support. The unit encouraged students to think about their personal values and build the confidence to make responsible decisions in tricky situations.



### Male Staff vs Male Students A Thrilling Battle


