2025 GC Pennants

GC Pennants for B and C grade players will commence in September. Four clubs will contest the C grade, and 3 will contest the B grade, and Moorabinda will field teams in both events, though some C graders may be asked to play in the B grade.

2025-26 Summertime Challenge Ladder

The Committee has approved a challenge competition for GC singles players. Players who nominate for the competition will be arranged initially in order of their current index points, from lowest to the highest. Players will be able to challenge another who is one or two places above them on the ladder, if they win they assume the losers place on the ladder.
