

Genesis: 10 Powerful Truths Every Believer Should Know

Scriptures from Genesis Based on What We Should Remember as Christ Followers From NKJV Bible

I chose verses that help us understand God, creation, sin, faith, obedience, covenant, and God's promises.

1. Genesis 1:1

“In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.”

What we should know: God is the Creator of everything. Nothing came before Him, and nothing exists without His power. Genesis begins by showing us that God is eternal, sovereign, and mighty.

2. Genesis 1:27

“So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.”

What we should know: We were created by God and in His image. That means human life has value, purpose, and dignity. We are not accidents. We were made by the hands of a holy God.

3. Genesis 2:24

“Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh.”

What we should know: God established marriage. This verse teaches us the beauty of covenant, unity, and God's design for husband and wife.

4. Genesis 3:6

“So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate...”

What we should know: Sin begins when we choose our desires over God's command. Temptation may look appealing, but disobedience brings consequences. This verse reminds us to guard our hearts and obey the Lord.

5. Genesis 3:15

“And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel.”

What we should know: This is a powerful promise pointing to Jesus. Even in the middle of mankind's fall, God spoke hope. From the very beginning, God had a plan for redemption.

6. Genesis 6:5

“Then the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.”

What we should know: Sin is serious and affects the heart deeply. God sees not only actions, but the condition of the heart. This verse warns us that a life apart from God becomes deeply corrupted.

7. Genesis 6:8

“But Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord.”

What we should know: Even in a sinful world, God's grace still shines. Noah stands as a reminder that God honors faith, obedience, and righteousness. Grace is a beautiful thread running through Scripture.

8. Genesis 12:2

“I will make you a great nation; I will bless you and make your name great; and you shall be a blessing.”

What we should know: God called Abraham with purpose and promise. This verse shows that God blesses His people not only for themselves, but so they can be a blessing to others.

9. Genesis 15:6

“And he believed in the Lord, and He accounted it to him for righteousness.”

What we should know: Faith matters deeply to God. Abraham believed God, and that belief was counted as righteousness. This teaches us the importance of trusting God even before we see the full promise fulfilled.

10. Genesis 50:20

“But as for you, you meant evil against me; but God meant it for good...”

What we should know: God can bring good out of what others meant for harm. Joseph’s story teaches us that God is working even through pain, betrayal, and hardship. His purposes are greater than the evil we face.
