
I hope my first book, later volumes in the series, and items featuring this world and these characters will find their way one way or another into the lives of many children and others young at heart and give them something special and memorable."

## FROM THE AETHER

(last week's social media updates)



I thought I'd make occasional shares of items in the Redbubble store related to the book series. This is one of my favourites, a stark, bold design for a hardcover journal, with the view from the two windows in Rex's house in Iceland, as seen in his intro for VOL. 1. All in shades of black, white, and grey, with the front cover teasing the back cover, revealing as it does only the beam of light from the lighthouse and the front of Rex's car.







Everything in the books is drawn to this level of detail. So even though an item may be seen from a distance for reasons of visual composition — such as this well-worn classic microphone in Rex's house in the outro for Vol. 1, where it's only one element of that two-page spread showing a stage-like wide view of the room — it might as easily have been (and sooner or later may be) seen close up. Having the level of detail already there lends a sense of reality and lets me play with composition with infinite flexibility, much like a film director or photographer setting up shots. And because I create everything in the app Concepts, which is vector-based, any zoom level is possible without blurring. This and other close-ups will eventually appear on collectible postcards and other items in the store.
