



# The Claverack Free Library

invites patrons, donors, neighbors and friends to celebrate its fifth anniversary in its new building on Sunday December 15, 2024 from 3 to 5 p.m. The event will feature music, refreshments .... and of course, birthday cake.

Opened debt-free in October, 2019, the library made its new home in the completely renovated former-AB Shaw firehouse at the corner of State Routes 9H and 23B. The decades-long effort to expand the original 1,400 square foot library, which now temporarily houses the operations of the Claverack town board and town court, resulted in the creation of a new modern, light-filled facility that more than quadruples the size of the library.

# **KEEPING THE** HOLIDAY SEASON FUN & SAFE FOR YOUR DOGS

It is hard to believe but the holiday season is once again rapidly approaching, and I would hope that we can all have happy and safe celebrations. keep in mind that good times with family and friends; decorations, parties, gifts and all the excitement that goes along with the holidays can be stressful for our dogs that don't quite understand what is going on. While we humans try to get more done in the time we have, our dogs may only see an upset to their normal routine, trees growing in the living room and, in many homes, an unusual amount of kitchen activity that produces amazing aromas.

While the array of food that comes from our kitchen are treats to be had by the humans, they can be dangerous when consumed by our dogs. These include fatty or spicy foods, bread dough, fresh herbs, alcoholic beverages and sweets of all kinds, especially those with chocolate or xylitol.

HOLIDAY FOODS

Particularly dangerous are cooked poultry bones that easily splinter, and bone shards can cause choking or get stuck in your

dog's gums. Ask your trainer or veterinarian for suggestions.

Secure all trash cans and discourage your dog from foraging. While a small taste of turkey or sweet potatoes can make your dog happy, don't over do it. **DECORATIONS ARE NOT PLAYTHINGS** 

Many holiday plants are poisonous, such as holly, mistletoe, poinsettias and amaryllis. Keep them out of reach from your dog.

Snow globes can contain antifreeze, which is extremely toxic to dogs. Keep any antifreeze products away from your happy, tail-wagging dog. If there is an antifreeze spill, send your dog out of the room while you clean up the liquid. Dilute the spot with water and floor cleaner to ensure your dog does not lick the area later.

Don't leave lighted candles unattended. A lit candle knocked over by a swinging tail can burn your pet or cause a fire.

### **CHRISTMAS TREES** CAN BE HAZARDOUS

Anchor the tree to the ceiling or wall to prevent from tipping over.

Hang non-breakable ornaments near the bottom of the tree. If ingested, tinsel can twist in your dog's intestines and be deadly. Don't use it!

Christmas tree water may contain preservative chemicals, which can trigger severe indigestion in dogs. Stagnant clean water can breed bacteria

and cause nausea or diarrhea to the pet which imbibes. Don't let your dog drink water from the base of your tree.

Sweep up fallen needles regularly, as can puncture holes in a dog's intestines if ingested. **HELP YOUR DOG FEEL** SAFE AND RELAXED

Most dogs get excited when guests arrive. To help your dog be calmer, exercise him prior to the festivities. After 30 minutes of walking or playtime, your dog will likely be relaxed or want to nap.

As a general rule, don't allow the family dog to greet unfamiliar guests since unusual activities and commotion can cause him extra stress.

Give your dog a break from the hub-bub by putting him in his crate or in a quiet room with his bed. Allow him to rejoin the festivities after guests have arrived. Don't put your dog outside, especially in cold temperatures, where you might forget about him.

Pets stressed by unfamiliar events typically pant more, so keep your dog's water bowl filled with freshwater. PETS LIKE PRESENTS TOO

Help your dog stay busy and out of the holiday trimmings by giving him fun, safe gifts.

Shop for puzzles, games and toys that require your dog to think and keep him entertained. A FINAL NOTE

Please, please, please don't give a pet as a surprise gift.

A cute puppy might seem like the perfect gift choice, but many of these holiday presents end up in animal shelters. Owning a dog takes a genuine commitment of time and responsibility, and adoptive owners must be ready to participate in training and other activities. If you are certain the recipient is up to the challenge and wants the responsibility, seriously consider giving a leash and a collar or a note saying a dog of the recipient's choice will come with it. This helps ensure the lucky person gets just the

# Non-insulin Alternative for Cats with Diabetes

Diabetes mellitus, referred to in this article as diabetes, is a well-known condition among people. The CDC reports that 11.6% of the U.S. population has diabetes, approximately 1 out of every 8.5 people. Dogs and cats are at risk for diabetes as well. The exact numbers are more difficult to determine, but it is estimated that approximately 1 out of every 300 dogs and 1 out of every 100-200 cats may develop diabetes in their lifetime.

Just as there are different types of diabetes in humans, cats and dogs have different types as well. Type I is an insulin dependent form where the cells in the pancreas no longer produce insulin, resulting in elevated glucose (sugar) levels in the blood. Type II noninsulin dependent form is where the pancreatic cells have impaired function or the cells in the body are resistant to insulin, resulting in the same elevated glucose levels. Type III is much less common and is associated with pregnancy or hormonally induced, resulting in insulin resistance. Type II diabetes occurs in cats, but not in dogs. Type I and III can occur in both species, with Type I as the most common in dogs. In this article, we are focusing on a noninsulin treatment for Type II, which occurs in cats. It is important to note that the main treatment for dogs with diabetes is still insulin.

The most significant risk factor for developing diabetes in cats







is obesity. Age, inactivity, and the overuse of steroids can also increase the risk, but obese cats are four times more likely to develop diabetes compared to cats of a healthy weight. Male cats seem to be at a higher risk than female cats. There does not appear to be a breed predilection in the United States.

blood glucose concentrations, and healthy activity levels. Previously, insulin and diet were the combination used to achieve these goals, but oral medications have been developed for cats to reach the same objectives.

### in humans for the past decade. These medications lower the concentration of glucose in the body by excreting it through the kidneys. This lowers the insulin resistance in the body and reduces damage to the pancreas, allowing the cells in the pancreas to make more insulin. It is very important to say that if a cat cannot make its own insulin, this medication is not appropriate, and insulin

must be implemented to treat it.

Currently, there are two approved

medications in the United States

- a liquid (brand name Senvelgo)

Just over this past year,

medications known as SGLT2

(sodium-glucose cotransporter2)

inhibitors were developed for

cats, a class of medication used

and a tablet (brand name Bexacat). Because of the requirement that a cat must still be able to make its own insulin, it is very important to discuss this treatment with your veterinarian, as it is not for every cat. There is no easy way to tell if a cat has type I vs. type II diabetes, so education and initial close monitoring are very important. These medications are approved for use in newly

beneficial to cats for several reasons including maintaining

lean weight, regulating insulin levels, and improving kidney and urinary health.





1/2 pound ground beef 4 tablespoons butter, divided

3/4 cup chopped onion 3/4 cup shredded carrots

3/4 cup diced celery 1 teaspoon dried basil

1 teaspoon dried parsley flakes 1-3/4 pounds (about 4 cups) cubed peeled potatoes

3 cups chicken broth

1/4 cup all-purpose flour 8 to 16 ounces Velveeta, cubed 1-1/2 cups whole milk

3/4 teaspoon salt 1/4 to 1/2 teaspoon pepper

1/4 cup sour cream

Optional: Onion rings and thinly sliced green onions

# Directions

In a large saucepan over medium heat, cook and crumble beef until no longer pink, 6-8 minutes; drain and remove from pan. In same saucepan, melt 1 tablespoon butter over medium heat. Saute onion, carrots, celery, basil and parsley until vegetables are tender, about 10 minutes. Add potatoes, broth and ground beef; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, until potatoes are tender, 10-12 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a small skillet, melt remaining 3 tablespoons butter. Add flour; cook and stir until bubbly, 3-5 minutes. Add to soup; bring to a boil. Cook and stir 2 minutes. Reduce heat to low. Stir in cheese, milk, salt and pepper; cook until cheese melts. Remove from heat; blend in sour cream. If desired, serve with onion rings

gift-wrap paper used on presents heaped under the mansion's 18foot Christmas tree. The tree is decorated with electric lights, as trees might have been in other mansions of the period. Tree lighting was an early application of electricity, first used by one of Thomas Edison's engineers on his Christmas tree at home.

Visitors can tour the mansion through December 23. The site will be closed on December 24 and 25. From December 26 through December 30, Staatsburgh will be open every day. The site's giftshop will be open during all tour hours, offering a wide range of books, jewelry, apparel, toys, and other gift items.
