HUDSON RIVER MARITIME MUSEUM



With a solar powered touring vessel and a dedicated group helping local history come alive, the Hudson River Maritime Museum in Kingston is open this summer to the public.

It's great news for anyone looking for a waterway adventure, a valuable learning experience, or an entertaining escape. They're all as close as the historic Hudson River.

The museum, located in the popular Rondout waterfront district, offers an air-conditioned space with an array of interesting exhibits, lectures, and even regular classes in woodworking, sailing, and traditional rowing. Plenty of surrounding restaurants and shops are close by, as well as the Roundout inlet itself, which offers a relaxing walkway.

But the fun isn't limited to the shoreline. Thanks to Solaris, a traditional looking displacement hull touring boat with state of the art features, the HRMM can take a learning adventure onto the river. What's more, there are custom tours that make it easy to choose something that captures

Though the HRMM officially christened its new touring vessel, Solaris, at the tail end of the 2019 season, museum marketing manager Lauren Berg says the boat hasn't been fully available to the public until this summer.

In 2020, with the COVID lockdowns and restrictions, public tours were unavailable. To make up for it, the Museum mounted a project called RiverWise, which documented



ACCORDING TO QUACKERS



In August 1762 the sandwich, as we know it, was created when the Earl of Sandwich requested meat between two pieces of bread.

August was once the sixth month of the year. In the original ten-month Roman calendar, the month went by the name of Sextilis, meaning "the sixth month" in Latin. It wasn't until around 700BC that August was rudely shoved back in the order of months when January and February were added to the beginning of the year by King Numa Pompilius.

August has also changed its number of days multiple times. In the ten-month Roman calendar, the months all had either 30 or 31 days, totaling 304 days in the year. Not only did Pompilius add January and February to the calendar, but he also reduced the number of days in August down to 29. It wasn't until Julius Caesar introduced the Julian calendar that it was left with 31 days, and it's stayed the same ever since!

learning exploration trips by Solaris and another vessel, a traditional sailing schooner, Appollonia. Postings of those exploits on social media were a way of keeping the museum and the river connected to the community at a difficult time, says Lauren.

But this summer Solaris is making up for lost time with a full schedule and a great selection of tours for anyone who wants to venture out onto the river, not just in style, but with a reduced carbon footprint. Solaris is 100% solar-powered and doesn't require fossil fuels to operate. The vessel's rooftop solar panels charge during the day, enabling her to travel up to 50 miles at night using reserve battery power.

"Last season Solaris really did not get to go out for public tours, so RiverWise was kind of her way of getting out there," says Lauren. "But now people are welcome to get onboard for a number of different themed tours. She is what we call a floating classroom. We want people to know Solaris offers not just leisure cruises, but mainly educational programming. And



Spencertown Academy Arts Center's 17th annual Hidden Gardens is scheduled for Saturday, August 28, with a self-guided garden tour, outdoor market, and botanical-themed art exhibition. This beloved Columbia County summer event is designed to inform, inspire, and intrigue garden enthusiasts.

"The 16th Annual Hidden Gardens Tour and Market on the Green had to be canceled for 2020 because of the pandemic. Not knowing exactly how opening up would evolve, we passed up the month of June this year and opted to schedule the event for later in the summer for the first time," says Madaline Sparks, who cochairs the event along with Vivian Wachsberger. "This later timing for the tour gives garden voyeurs a rare opportunity to view these beautiful private landscapes in the waning days of summer, rather than the burgeoning of late



spring. The light is different, the color palette is bolder and richer, and it affords us a chance to see how these avid gardeners keep their landscapes interesting and fresh in the dog days of August."

Wachsberger adds, "Several of the gardens have been on the tour before, but not for many years and never before offered for late season viewing. They have matured and evolved over those years and will offer a totally different perspective in August of 2021.





The Old Dutch Village Garden Club has awarded July Garden of the Month to two local gardens.

Taste Budd's Café at 40 West Market Street in the village of Red Hook has been awarded the Business Garden of the month. Taste Budd's has been owned and operated by Daniel Budd since 2005. He takes pride in this outdoor space that is the only garden seating business in the village. Often, he can be seen early in the mornings tending to the flowers. Dan states that his goal is to have a welcoming gathering place for the community. In that regard he has fostered music and visual arts in and out of his café.

The outdoor garden area is a nice addition to sit and enjoy the giant zinnias, annuals and scattered black-eyed susans and Shasta daisies. It is not unusual to see students with laptops and folks of all ages enjoying the food and ambiance at Taste Budd's.

The Residential Garden of the Month has been awarded to Brian Forman and Anthony Barletta at 25 Church Street on the corner of Fraleigh Street in the village of Red Hook. Having moved to the Red Hook area about a year ago, they were looking for a place with a garden in the future. org, or call 845-338-0071. "We want people to know that when they purchase tickets for Solaris tours, they are supporting the museum," Lauren notes. "And anything you purchase through the museum supports us."

Solaris has been described as kind of a metaphor for the museum itself. Built on traditional lines, it looks very much like a 19th century steam launch. And yet its other foot is in the future, with solar power and internet

"We learned alot about the Solaris on the trip," according to John. "I used to baby the boat a little more than I did after that trip. The amount of power storage on board [there are sixteen solar panels on the Solaris canopy roof], and also the ability of the panels on a nice sunny day to recharge, is pretty impressive. We were able to be a little more aggressive in the maneuvering, and not have to worry, not have that fuel gauge anxiety. She just always had a full charge."

"Yeah, Solaris is a very cool boat," Tanya agrees. "It's unlike any other boat I've ever driven. It's kind of more like a sailboat than your classic motorboat. It takes a lot of focus. We're constantly checking what our levels are, and seeing if we can have the most efficient ride possible. You know, like keep the straightest line, and go at exactly the right speed. And so that was really fun to play around with. It was a lot of quality time with Solaris."

It's hard to overestimate the influence of the Hudson in shaping almost every aspect of local and regional history. Before there were trucks, cars or railroads, there was the river. Towns and industries settled along the Hudson, linked by travel and trade. From Manhattan to Peekskill, and Poughkeepsie through Kingston and on to Albany, with many points in between, the Hudson was the focal point of life and commerce since the earliest settlements of Dutch, English and French.



now Bowdoin Park, and the Algonquins. The fertile soil along the river made for propitious plantings of what indigeous peoples called the "Three Sisters": corn, beans and squash. Those foods were harvested and dried for use over the winter months. Game including deer, black bears and rabbits were plentiful. The Hudson, unlike many interior rivers, is a complex tidal estuary which ebbs and flows with the Atlantic, northern points contain fresh water. In spring, the salt line can retreat as far south as the Tappan Zee Bay. In late summer, the line can reach Newburgh Bay or even Poughkeepsie, especially during droughts. Due to the nature of Hudson as an estuary, it supports an especially rich biological environment for various species of aquatic life, providing critical habitats and essential spawning and breeding grounds. Without a doubt, the Hudson River will continue to be an ecological, historical — and a scenic and entertaining landmark known the world over. And there are few better ways to learn about and experience the river, than making a visit to the Hudson River Maritime Museum. 



sales generate nearly 10 percent of the library's annual operating budget.

Update on Peaches

Peaches, the dog from Cairo, NY that had been a victim of attempted decapitation, multiple stabbings, and being left bleeding for hours, is making a full recovery.

The "P" in HIPAA stands for Portability, not Privacy

People do not have a clear understanding of how HIPAA is put into practice. HIPAA, which stands for Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, was established in 1996 as an act to provide consumers with a national standard for handling our medical information. The word "privacy" is not in the name of the act. The "P" stands for 'portability," which reflects the purpose of this act: HIPAA was developed to "modernize the flow of healthcare information" (<u>https://www.hipaajournal.com/</u> is-it-a-hipaa-violation-to-askfor-proof-of-vaccine-status/). To be clear, HIPAA does not result in your health information being totally private and protected; rather, the key purpose is to manage how your health information is handled and transmitted. Here's how it works. With this act we are able to access our own medical records, authorize others to access our information with our permission receive disclosure and notification when our health information is shared. There are many organizations and companies receiving our health information that have nothing to do with our actual healthcare and everything to do with covering the cost. We are more familiar with signing forms that allow our doctors to share information with other healthcare providers and our health insurance companies. These groups are called "covered identities."

But we are less familiar with other companies and organizations (beyond the covered entities) who have access to our health information. They are identified as "non-entities."

- 1. Credit card companies: If you have travel insurance coverage with your credit card, take a look at your credit card notices about disclosure. They have access to your health information. If you are ill or have an injury while traveling, your credit card company covers the costs. Your privacy goes out the window. 2. Employers
- Worker's Compensation: 0 If you have a workrelated injury or illness, you have no choice but to file the claims through Worker's Compensation. Now your employer has access to some of your health information. 0 Employers may require drug-testing, preemployment physicals and periodic physicals for high-risk positions (i.e., exposure to chemicals or working with heavy equipment). There are loopholes and some health information is exposed (https://www.policygenius.com/ blog/who-controls-your-health-

data-a-guide-to-your-rights/) Life, Long-term Care and Disability Insurances, and even Auto and Home Insurance companies: If you want coverage for life, long-term care or disability insurance, you must health provide information upfront as part of the application process. For certain claims

with home or auto insurance, your health information might be revealed (https://www. gocompare.com/life-insurance/ <u>access-to-medical-records/</u>). Social Security has access to your health records and can obtain them quickly, since this is a requirement for people participating in the disability program: Social Security Disability Program or SSDA https://www.ssa. gov/disability/professionals/ <u>hipaa-cefactsheet.htm</u>) Law Enforcement: If the police need to identify or locate a fugitive, suspect, material witness, or missing person, they can access health information. They obtain this information through subpoenas, attorney letters, or the individual or family (https://www.hhs.gov/hipaa/forprofessionals/faq/disclosures-<u>for-law-enforcement-</u> purposes/index.html)

How do these companies and organizations obtain your health information? It is easy. All your health information (including prescriptions) is stored in what is called "clearinghouses." Remember signing the form that allows your health information to be shared with your health insurance? Well, your health information be "transported" needs to somehow. Clearinghouses electronic are stations or hubs that allow healthcare practices to transmit electronic claims to insurance carriers in a secure way that protects patient health information. This system maintains your Protected Health Information (PSI), which includes 18 elements such as name & demographics, your SS #, dates of all admissions & discharges to hospitals, ERs rehabilitation centers, etc. But the clearinghouses also maintain a list of all your diagnoses and prescriptions. Yes, they are secure and you have given your permission to disclose this information, but these clearinghouses are also accessed by the above-noted non-entities. For example, when a physician wants to purchase disability insurance coverage (to protect income and family), the clearinghouse provides all this personal health information to the insurance company in order to determine acceptance or denial of the insurance. There is misinformation in regard to privacy and HIPAA on the other end, such as the times when we find ourselves unable to obtain updates about a family member's medical condition. However, there are circumstances when a physician can use his/her clinical judgment to disclose information and yet we mistakenly hear "It's a HIPAA Violation" when it is not (https://betterhealthwhileaging. net/hipaa-basics-and-faqsfor-family-caregivers/). This applies to COVID vaccine status as well. When people ask the question - "Is it a HIPAA Violation to Ask about COVID Vaccines?"- the answer: is "No." According to the HIPAA Journal: "Any organization can ask any

employee, customer, or relevant third party whether or not they have been vaccinated against COVID-19 without violating HIPAA. However, before asking the question, organizations should be prepared for how they will respond to individuals' answers, or how they will respond if an individual refuses to answer the question" (https:// www.hipaajournal.com/is-it-ahipaa-violation-to-ask-for-proof-<u>of-vaccine-status/</u>). Reminder: The sole purpose of HIPAA is portability, not privacy. Thus, the question can be asked without violation, but caution must be taken as to "how" the information is utilized (For example, one cannot infringe on protocols of the American Disability Act). This is where people get mixed up about privacy and HIPAA. With COVID-related health issues, we are dealing with a public health crisis, and communicable diseases are reportable to the departments of health for our safety. "Protecting the privacy of individually-identifiable health data and promoting the public's health often seem at odds, but health data are the lifeblood of public health practice (https://www.cambridge.org/ core/journals/journal-of-lawmedicine-and-ethics/article/abs/ health-information-privacy-andpublic-health/0D5035F5D785 <u>3DAA740921CE8263C0C7</u>). Here in NYS, the following guideline was set on June 15, 2021: Individuals must present their vaccination records if a business or organization requires it. "Unvaccinated or unknown vaccination status individuals who are over the age of four must continue to present proof of a recent negative COVID-19 diagnostic test result and wear masks within the venue" (https://www. governor.ny.gov/news/governorcuomo-announces-covid-19restrictions-lifted-70-adult-newHudson River View - August 2021-9

yorkers-have-received-first). In summary, there is widespread misunderstanding of HIPAA, its Privacy Rule and the use of our health information (https:// privacyrights.org/consumerguides/health-privacy-hipaabasics). People are quick to toss out the phrase - "It's a HIPAA violation"-when they really have no understanding of its function.



settle into this young man's mind. Now he has a great deal of anxiety because he is concerned that he may die of a heart attack. In fact, it has become so bad that he panics anytime he is alone.

This is one example of the impact of the words spoken to us and how deeply just one conversation can affect our lives. Perhaps you've had words spoke over you that say you are a failure, or blame you for something you didn't do.

Peace requires a clear mind. In her book Sacred Rest Dr. Sandra Dalton calls the chatter of the mind, cerebral background noise. Ideas and plans are born here but the toxic selfdestructing thought patterns also live here in the internal monologue. This can leave you with the inability to concentrate on other, more important things.

The Bible admonishes us in Romans 12:2 to be transformed by the renewing of our minds. Part of this renewal means knowing who you are. If you have accepted Christ as your Savior and have begun the journey of having a personal relationship with Him, you are called a child of God - you are a child of a king. Children of a king think differently. They have confidence because they know who their father is and how much power he has. 



Osteoarthritis in Cats

Cats are unique – they are unlike dogs and often distinct even from each other. A major difference is that cats are really good at hiding their pain. They act differently than a person or dog would and it makes it difficult to accurately assess their comfort. A common cause of pain in cats as they get older is arthritis, but because of the difficulty in determining their pain, it is a drastically under diagnosed problem. Arthritis, also known as osteoarthritis, is a degenerative condition of the joints. It is chronic, progressive, and can develop from a trauma, a congenital abnormality, or just every-day wear and tear. Arthritis can affect any joint space, including the cartilage, joint capsule and associated bones but it typically affects the hips, knees, ankles and elbows.

It also tends to affect the joint spaces between the vertebrae. There are signs at home that can indicate there may be a problem. Cats may no longer jump or seek out higher locations. They may avoid the litter box, especially if it's in a "far away" location such as down in the basement – or if the sides of the box are relatively high and it would require them to take big steps to get in or out. They may also have a personality change they could be more withdrawn, less social or start growling, biting, or scratching more. A diagnosis can often be made

on physical exam, but imaging such as x-rays is also very helpful. They can pick up more cases and assess the severity of arthritis. Approximately 90% of cats with arthritis will have radiographic evidence, however only 50% will have clinical signs.

There are options to help alleviate discomfort, slow the progression and improve overall • quality of life. A big help is weight management as overweight cats are more prone to arthritis due to the added pressure on their joints and less active lifestyle. There are also supplements (typically omega 3 fatty acids glucosamine/chondroitin) and and medications that can help. Modifying their home by using ramps/steps, moving their litter box and providing one with lower sides or an opening to walk in, and offering soft bedding in multiple locations may also help. In dogs, physical therapy (including LASER and acupuncture) and surgical techniques are relatively common, but in cats these areas are just beginning to be explored.

Our pets cannot typically directly tell us that they are not well, so it is up to us to look for cues, but also to have them evaluated at least annually. If arthritis is suspected, it should be addressed as soon as possible the earlier the above treatments are implemented, the more rewarding the results are. Also, talk with your veterinarian about the treatment options. Every kitty is unique and their treatment plan should be tailored to them as well.

you're concerned that leaving, your happy, highpitched voice can make him think it's okay to feel anxious. Dogs are pack animals and so they expect their leaders to be strong when they leave the pack. Therefore, ignore your dog for about 10 minutes before you leave. Boredom

Dogs sleep a lot during the day, but when they wake up, they want something to do. It doesn't take much to entertain a dog, even when you're not at home.







The Town of Hillsdale's popular flea market returns Saturday Aug. 7, offering a wide array of goods ranging from household items and clothing to antiques and collectibles. The market will take place in Hillsdale Hamlet Park, located just southwest of the traffic light at the intersection of N.Y. Routes 22 and 23.
