
THE OLD DUTCH CHURCH PRESENTS LIVING HISTORY CEMETERY TOURS

CO TO HOST ART OPENING FOR EXHIBIT **BY MICRO-MOSAIC ARTIST N.J. WHEELOCK** ON OCT. 13

CO is pleased to announce an art exhibit opening, "Harmony and Piece" by artist and Rhinebeck resident N.J. Wheelock from 6-8 p.m. Friday, Oct. 13.

Wheelock is a multimedia artist who specializes in micromosaics. A communications graduate of Syracuse University, she worked on commercial and public-service announcements for radio before settling into a career as a counselor for emotionally disturbed youth.

During this time, she created recycled glass mosaic and garden art for specialty Rhinebeck shops in and Woodstock. An unexpected diagnosis of advanced cancer and a year of treatment resulted in job loss and prompted development and finethe tuning of her artistic talent. Her passion for intricate detail and meticulous work sparked her to create a new mosaic medium. These "micro-mosaics" are intended to astound and amaze with the complexity of interrelated tiny pieces — silver-lined glass bugle beads — always hundreds, most often thousands, to complete one larger-scale sculpture. The raw forms are base-painted and a design rough-sketched with beads glued on one by one. Completed pieces are sprayed with a UV protectant clear-coat sealant. 

Michael has brought some innovative ideas to the table during the campaign. On a practical level, he stresses that courts need to dispense justice in a more timely way. Implementing special courts for drug addiction, youth cases, and veterans could be key in coordinating resolutions. Those special courts could bring together different assets and services that taxpayers pay for, and make sure they're implemented in an efficient and effective way to help with rehabilitation. **Thorny Problems Should Meet Judicial Temperament**

Michael says his commitment thoughtful, а judicial to temperament will be а cornerstone of his tenure, should he be elected to the Columbia County Court Judge position.

"As a judge, you've got to have empathy, you've got to have compassion, and sometimes you have to hold your tongue. I'm thinking about people going through difficulties in deciding where kids should live, or other highly consequential matters. I think it's important to know that we need to support families and support communities, and if we do that together, we can make the world a better place. You need to have commitment community service." to

He says his longtime work as a public defender has taught him to appreciate the complexities of people's lives and problems, and how his community is impacted when lives slip through the cracks. Though there are no easy

answers, the first job is to really listen to the problem. "You have to look at both sides. Certainly as a judge, you have to prepare for what the prosecutor is going to assert, and also what the defense will argue. You're going to have to see both sides.

"Years and years ago I learned two or three people can live or experience the same exact thing and have seen and recorded it differently in their mind. It's just based upon the human perception and what we expected to see, what we've experienced in the past. It doesn't mean that someone is distorting or lying. Their perception is shaped by what they've experienced in the past. They're not necessarily dissimilar, and they could both be true from that person's perspective. And I think you have to be understanding, compassionate and willing to spendthetimetotrytofigureitout."

To better understand and meet specific human challenges seen regularly by the county court, Michael has proposed specific courts to handle drug related cases, youth cases, and veterans cases.

"I worked in treatment courts. I was part of the first one in Columbia County in Hudson City Court. I'm in the behavioral health court right now, which is dual diagnosis, mostly substance abuse and then mental health difficulties. Judge Cheryl Roberts who recently became the Hudson City Court judge contacted the officer of court administration, and was allowed to start a behavioral health court. The need for the same had existed for years. "People are suffering from substance abuse and mental health. We don't know which came first, the chicken or the egg. But in her court now, she brings in Greener Pathways, Probation, the Greater Promise Neighborhood, Columbia County Mental Health, Twin Counties and other stakeholders. So there are all these people in court, and then we staff the litigants the day before, a couple of days before, depending upon everybody's schedule. The overriding question is how can we serve this individual and get them back to being productive?

So it's not that certain people don't need punishment and be held accountable for their actions. Maybe they do, but does warehousing people for long periods of time solve anything?"

The corrosive effects of drugs on society is something Michael well recognizes, and he makes a distinction between professional dealers and the syndicates behind them, and others who often started out as experimenting teens, or who had drugs pushed on them. "I always talk about how it takes seven attempts, on average, for people to stop smoking cigarettes. So what about heroin and what about cocaine, if the person is hooked on it? I also am an advocate for hard work, and note that idle hands are the devil's workshop. So if you're working and you have a job, you come home at the end of the day, you want to spend the time with your family, interact with people and relish your hard work from that day."

"And if you're not working and you're addicted to drugs and then you're just scheming and scamming and trying to come up with drug money, you're going to steal from your neighbor's house and see if they locked the garage door and try to take an antique or just whatever. So it's tricky. The people that are really moving large amounts of drugs, they are a severe problem. Many addicts don't have any other real skills. So we need to break that cycle."

Trying to make the county court system more timely and efficient is another of Michael's major goals.

"People I'm talking to care about justice proceeding in a timely fashion. They care about individual cases, in their community or that they read about, and they want to know why certain things happened."

"So my take is you need a judge that is willing to take the reins and try to broker timely resolutions." Lifetime Local Involvement With Hudson and Columbia County

"I went to Twin County recently for a gala event. Twin County is the substance abuse recovery agency. I work very closely with them, I have a lot of clients that have had and continue to suffer



Renal Gland Disease – Addison's

By Julianne Porter, DVM Many people have heard of organs such as the kidneys or liver, but there is a smaller organ that can be very problematic if it is not functioning properly; the adrenal glands. Adrenal glands are a pair of glands situated somewhat above the kidneys. They are responsible for producing hormones to help regulate blood pressure, responses to stress, metabolism, and the immune system. Among their multiple functions, the adrenal glands produce hormones called corticosteroids. A type of corticosteroids, glucocorticoids (cortisol), act on sugar, fat, and protein metabolism to allow the body to burn (rather than store), so they are ready for a fight or flight situation. Another type of corticosteroid, mineralocorticoids, helps regulate electrolytes sodium and potassium to

support blood pressure. If the adrenal glands do not produce enough corticosteroids, the body can have lifethreatening consequences. This is called hypoadrenocorticism, also known as Addison's (a disease which the 35th U.S. President, John F. Kennedy was known to have). Most of the time, both the mineralocorticoids and glucocorticoids are not being produced; but sometimes, only the glucocorticoids are deficient.

We do not always know why this happens, but the most common reason is an immune-mediated destruction of the adrenal glands. Other possible causes include trauma, infection, cancer, and medications to treat the "opposite" disease, hyperadrenocorticism, also known as Cushing's disease. Most pets will present as if they are in shock – they are often weak and dehydrated and will often have some degree of GI upset (vomiting, diarrhea, poor appetite). They can act painful and have high or low heart rates. Sometimes, signs can be more chronic and vague – they simply are "not doing well," but often they present as a crisis. Dogs are often relatively young (around 4-5 years of age) and female, but it is important to note that any dog can be affected. Certain breeds are more prone than others as well. This disease is very rare in cats, but typically will occur in those younger than 5 years old.

Diagnosing is not always straightforward and will require a special lab test to confirm. Depending on how much of the adrenal gland is affected and how low the hormone levels are, the baseline lab work can have vague changes. Often the kidney values are elevated and the blood sugar can be low. The electrolytes are often in disarray. A classic finding is very high potassium and very low sodium, however, if only the glucocorticoids are deficient, the electrolytes can be normal.

Home Euthanasia Service Hospice Care Acupuncture/Chinese Medicine In addition, a heavy whipworm infection can cause the same electrolyte changes and clinical signs. Therefore, a confirmatory to measure the amount of cortisol is used – this test will be normal in dogs with whipworm infections.

The treatment is replacing the hormones that the adrenal glands are not producing. The most common way to do this involves giving an injection every 25-30 days to replace the mineralocorticoids as well as a low dose of daily steroids to replace the glucocorticoids. Electrolytes are monitored often at first until the proper dose and frequency of medicine is achieved. Treatment is lifelong.

Prognosis with treatment is typically excellent. It is important to note that some stressful situations (either concurrent medical illnesses or psychological stress) could require a temporary increase in supplementation as the body will require more glucocorticoids to maintain normal functions.

COMMUNICATION AND LEADERSHIP: KEYS TO CONTROLLING CANINE BEHAVIOR

Many of the pets that end up in shelters are surrendered because of behavior problems that their owners believe to be unfixable. Oftentimes, these animals end up being put down, making death from behavior problems the leading cause of pet mortality, ahead of trauma and disease. However, every year, many thousands of dogs are unnecessarily euthanized because owners are not equipped to properly train a dog to adjust to life in a mixed pack (humans and canines) and to be a happy addition to their household. When a new dog owner acquires a dog expecting that the dog will automatically fit in and become a member of the family, the owner has neglected to consider the time and effort that is needed to train the dog. Without training, the dog can be led to think that he is the head of the household. That belief on the dog's part can set into motion the possibility that the dog's instinctual behavior will kick in. What does all of that mean? It means that a dog instinctively understands that every pack needs leadership to survive; leadership to provide for and secure the pack's wellbeing. If you can inspire your dog's confidence in your ability to provide for the pack's needs, then your dog will happily fall into a subordinate position in the pecking order. Problem solved! However, if you are inconsistent, easily emotional and/or manipulated and controlled, your dog will NOT view you as the best qualified member of the pack to be in charge. If that happens, your dog may see himself as the pack member who is best suited

to be in control. That's when problems arise because the dog's view of his position in the pack will then cause him to challenge, defy and disrespect your rules and expectations for behavior. This can lead to undesirable behaviors such as charging the door when the doorbell rings, barking, jumping, pulling on the leash and even aggression – which are the most commons reasons that dogs are mistreated, neglected and/or euthanized.

With more than one of every three households in the United States owning a dog, thousands of people are looking for help to solve their dog's behavior problems. Understanding the keys to pack behavior and following a few simple guidelines can help owners establish leadership and begin controlling their dog's behavior:

Because dogs crave strong leadership and know that some

one of the pack members, needs to be in charge, if they don't get it from their owners, they'll try to take charge themselves. Oftentimes, that pack member is not well suited to do the job which can lead to barking, jumping, aggression and pulling on the leash; all of which are examples of the dog taking charge. Whenever the dog attempts to take control, the owner needs to win all challenges to demonstrate that he/she is the best pack member to be in that leadership role.

There are several ways to establish leadership. First, ignore all requests from the dog, such as nudges to be petted or played with. To do so, break eye contact. Then, when the dog has "given up," wait just a few seconds (10 or 15) and call him back to you to be petted or to play. When he responds to you



(versus you to him), he sees you as the leader. If he misbehaves, such as chewing on a child's toy, correct his behavior verbally. As soon as it stops, offer pleasant, high-toned praise. The dog will understand its mistake and respect you as the pack leader. In the wild, the leader always leads the pack; literally! Establish your leadership by always leading your dog-up and down stairs, through doorways, and especially on walks. Remember, the leader always leads. Too often, dog owners simply accept the disruptive, annoying or aggressive behavior of their

dogs because they think it's normal or don't know how to change it. More clients than I can count have said to me, "dogs bark"! Well dogs bark when they have something to say such as "get out of my yard". If the dog thinks it is his job to chase away intruders, then he will bark because it probably has worked in the past. When the dog barks at the mailman, he does not know that the mailman was leaving any way. The dog thinks the mailman left because the dog told him to! Barking at the mailman becomes learned behavior that the dog will repeat under any circumstances when the dog feels threatened.

Your job as a dog owner is to make your dog feel safe because you are in charge and he has nothing to worry about. Learning about pack leadership canine communication and

is incredibly interesting for most dog-lovers. Gaining a better understanding of the dog psyche strengthens the human-canine connection and learning how to communicate effectively with your dog in a language it understands - is a critical step in establishing leadership and control. 
When asked if he had one thing to say to a voter concerning who he was, and what motivated him, Michael thought about some wise words of his grandmother.







Ingredients

1 (8 ounce) package spaghetti 1 pound lean ground beef 1 (16 ounce) jar spaghetti sauce ½ cup butter, sliced - divided 1 (8 ounce) container cottage cheese 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened ¼ cup sour cream

1 (8 ounce) package shredded sharp Cheddar cheese

Directions

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Cook spaghetti in boiling water until cooked through but firm to the bite, about 12 minutes. Drain.

Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat. Cook and stir beef in the hot skillet until browned and crumbly, 5 to 7 minutes; drain and discard grease. Transfer to a bowl and mix in spaghetti sauce. Place 1/2 of the butter slices into the bottom of a 9x13-inch casserole dish. Spread 1/2 of the spaghetti into the dish. Mix cottage cheese, cream cheese, and sour cream together in a

Mix cottage cheese, cream cheese, and sour cream together in a bowl; spread mixture over spaghetti. Cover with remaining spaghetti and top with remaining slices of butter.

spaghetti and top with remaining slices of butter. Pour ground beef mixture over spaghetti and spread in an even layer.

Bake in the preheated oven for 30 minutes. Spread Cheddar cheese on top and continue baking until cheese has melted and is lightly browned, about 15 minutes more.

By Naomi Fata Too many times I have heard the flippant comments in my own mom circles, about how "I'm anxious and I can't help it." Or "I'm not sleeping because I am stressed." Most always there is a resignation that anxiety is commonplace, stress filling our lives is normal. Maybe blame is placed on the season of parenting we are going through, the evils of technology, our own wiring, and so much more. 

Old Dutch Village Garden Club Learns To Make Botanical Prints the Old **Fashioned Way**

The Old Dutch Village Garden Club held its monthly meeting the second Thursday in September at St. John's Reformed Church in Upper Red Hook. A large crowd was treated to a demonstration of cyanotype techniques by noted local photographer and Yoram printmaker Gelman.



Cyanotype is a simple and affordable photographic process first used in the 1840s by two British women, Anna Atkins and Ann Dixon, to publish botanical prints. They created the first published book of photographs. These days, the technique is most familiar to many in blueprints.

Mr. Gelman's demonstration was almost magical. He laid some grasses and ferns down on a paper coated with a sensitizing chemical, pressed it in place with glass and exposed it to the light in the meeting hall. SIx minutes later, the ferns and grasses were removed, and the paper was dunked in a water bath. Presto! The image appeared – white against a deep Prussian blue.

Several garden club members then volunteered to make their own images. The results were can be used to print on cloth. For the club's October meeting, member Connie Barresi will demonstrate creative ways to use dried flowers.







Design Work Begins for Philmont-to-**Chatham Rail Trail** Expansion

Work has begun to create a shovel-ready construction plan for a new section of the Harlem Valley Rail Trail in Columbia County that will link the village of Philmont to the town of Ghent and Chatham village.

The construction-ready documents are being designed by MKM Landscape Architecture of New York under contract to the Harlem Valley Rail Trail Association, the nonprofit community group that helps oversee the expansion and maintenance of the trail.

"We are thrilled to be taking the next step in the expansion of the Harlem Valley Rail Trail," said Phil Meeks, chair of the HVRTA board. "This new 8-mile section will dramatically increase the trail's footprint and bring it to central and northern Columbia County for the first time." The new paved trail section will traverse scenic woods

and farmland in Ghent and pass over a historic stone-arch railroad bridge constructed in the 1800s. It will terminate in the village of Chatham near the planned new Shaker Museum.

Funding for the \$500,000 construction plan comes from a state grant and local funds raised by the rail trail association, in cooperation with the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Construction Preservation. of the new section, whose cost hasn't been determined, will require additional government and local funding.

MKM Landscape Architecture has extensive experience in designing trails, including 2.5 miles of earlier extensions of the Harlem Valley Rail Trail.

The Harlem Valley Rail Trail currently consists of 26 paved miles that link the Metro-North Railroad station in Wassaic to Copake. The association's ultimate goal is a 46-mile continuous trail from Wassaic to Chatham following the path of the onetime New York and Harlem Railroad.
