from home, has undeniably led to some relaxed standards in the way people present themselves. Zoom meetings just don't inspire the same attention to attire and personal appearance, as being out in the world.

But that dynamic is starting to change. Restrictions are easing, even in New York. UPI reported in mid-March that nation-wide COVID-19 cases were underestimated by half, according to a study of antibody testing. Most of those were asymptomatic cases, and the data spells good news for things like herd immunity, as well as the actual lethality of the virus.

Locally, schools are resuming more in-person classes. There are new promising coronavirus treatments that have been recently approved by the FDA. And vaccines are more readily available for people who want them.

"I noticed last week people were so excited. 'Look what I got!' And they showed us. 'I got both my shots!', or "Or, 'I got my first shot," says Valarie. "And we're hoping, the more people are getting vaccinated, the more people are going to come out."

She says along with that optimism, people are looking again at styling options. It might not be the same vibe as prepandemic, but there are definitely ways to achieve that professional touch in a budget-friendly way.

"A lot of people with the pandemic, they've let their gray grow out," Valarie notes. "I don't mind some of it. A good way of doing it is hiding a little, or just giving yourself a fresh. A Creative Response to Small **Business Adversity**

The frustrations and anxiety of many small business owners, who often feel very personally responsible for the workers they employ, has definitely weighed on Lester and Valarie during difficult times.

"Sometimes, people don't understand what COVID did to our industry. We were allowed to open back up last June. That means we were closed for four months. I had five upcoming weddings. Gone. And I can't sell haircuts online. Even restaurants didn't have to completely close down for four months. They were still able at least to do to-go

"And they still haven't lifted

any of our operating related restrictions. Lester literally had to change his whole shop. And you can't just go to Target and buy that for \$99. It's a huge cost to make those changes. Just to have that separation. There's extra cost for cleaning and disinfecting."

Those kinds of costs proved too much for Valarie at her former location. She had no choice but to end her business there, and it happened quickly.

Lester meanwhile, said his shop

was facing serious headwinds as well. "With the proms and the weddings everything is still at a halt. So those kinds of things went into our decision to come together." There are still limitations that

affect the bottom line, when it comes to following coronavirus protocols, Valerie points out. "There's a difference in the amount of people that we used to be able to do. With a color process for example, a client could sit, and I could do another person's haircut, or vice versa. You can't multitask like that now. You have your max capacity, and people have to wait."

But for all the adversity, Lester and Valarie agree that things are currently looking up, and their merger is a big part of that.

"With the vaccine coming out and everybody that's getting vaccinated, we have confidence that our business will pick up," says Lester. "We're starting to see a little light at the end of the tunnel. But we can't project what's going to come next. Even our higher ups don't know what's going to come next. We're just going to take everything day by day, and wish for the best."

Safe Sitter Program for Adolescents

The Safe Sitter Program, a

program for youth ages 11-14,

will take place on Saturday, May

1 from 8:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Extension Education Center, 479 Rt. 66, Hudson, NY 12534. The Safe Sitter Program gives young adolescents the skills to provide safe, nurturing care for children and to respond appropriately medical to emergencies. It also teaches introductory employment skills and important life skills. Topics that are covered include Babysitting as a Business,

Success on the Job, Child

Care Essentials, Safety for the

Injury Sitter, Management, Preventing Problem Behavior, Care of Choking Infant and of Choking Child. Participants will also have handson manikin practice of rescue skills and participate in small group interactive learning, roleplaying and games to enhance the discussion topics. Youth who have a contagious illness, such as a cold or fever blister, cannot take the class because of the use of CPR mannequins to practice rescue breathing.

Safe Sitter was founded in 1980 Indianapolis pediatrician, Dr. Patricia A. Keener, after colleague's 18-month-old choked to death while under an adult sitter's care. Dr. Keener developed Safe Sitter as a medically accurate instructional program designed for young adolescents. She updates curriculum regularly.

Those wishing to participate should register early as there are limited spots. Send a check for the fee of \$60 to CCE of Columbia and Greene Counties, 479 Rt. 66, Hudson, NY 12534. The registration deadline is April 23. The fee must be paid before the day of the program or the individual is not enrolled. When the fee is received a registration packet will be sent to the participant to complete and bring to the session. The fee is all inclusive but the participants should bring a bag lunch. 





Preparing to Transition: An Opportunity to Change for the Better by Charlotte Michos, RN,

MS, CNS, CLNC

Collectively, how has this pandemic impacted our mental status and function? experiences in getting through the "COVID Era" have varied. Then, of course, we have different baselines with our mental health. But we have all been touched with a "collective trauma," since this pandemic is a global health issue and has caused major disruptions and various traumas

in many aspects of our lives. Our mental health problems are linked to numerous stressors during these times. Top on the list is the illness and death of our loved ones. We should all take a moment of silence right now and never forget this as we move forward. We had too many leaders throughout 2020 who were too cavalier about this loss. The remaining list of pandemic stressors is exhaustive: job loss and loss of healthcare coverage, financial struggles, restricted socialization, cancelled events, challenges with childcare and education, threats of (or actual) loss of housing, feeling unsafe in general, loss of trust (fill in the blank), travel restrictions, feeling alone, and more. For some of

us it took time to find coping

mechanisms; for others it started right away, and perhaps some, not at all. Personally, I decided it would be "walking through the virus," and as I write this, I will be celebrating my one-year anniversary with the friend who decided to join me. My husband also initiated the idea of staying connected (through ZOOM cocktail parties and weekend hikes) with our dear friends – two other couples. We shared so much together. These choices "saved us." A place to begin in order to counter these stressors is to keep active, connect with others, be mindful of our surroundings and state of mind, utilize relaxation techniques, serve others, be grateful for small things, seek help when needed, and keep learning. A key component to caring is: Before caring for others, take care of yourself.

What has become fuzzy during the pandemic is whether the anxiety and depression related to these stressors will escalate and create long-term mental health problems or that the response to these stressors will be determined as adaptive – what is expected to happen during a pandemic – and many of us will return to our "normal" mental health status.

But statistically, depression is increasing. In JAMA's 9/2020 edition, the population study results found that symptoms of depression increased three-fold during the pandemic. Per March 2021's Lancet, a systematic review and meta-analysis concluded that 1 in 5 healthcare workers have experienced moderate depression, anxiety and PTSD during the COVID-19 pandemic (https://journals.plos. org/plosone/article?id=10.1371/ <u>journal.pone.0246454</u>). The red flag for disaster-related mental health issues is how many stressors does an individual have to deal with? What we

hurricane crises is that there is a cumulative effect of the stressors, which occur both during and after the disaster. The groups that are historically hit the hardest with large-scale collective traumas are women, minorities, the elderly, and the poor. During COVID (as compared to other disasters), there has been a noteworthy exception: young adults are reporting more stressors than older adults with this pandemic. These populations are not considered weaker; rather, these are the groups of people who are either hit the hardest with stressors; they are more vulnerable; and/ or they are forced to take on more responsibilities, along with making more sacrifices. One of the biggest challenge areas will be for those who were sick with COVID-19. One in five survivors were recorded as having a first time diagnosis of anxiety, depression or insomnia (https://www.reuters.com/ article/uk-health-coronavirusmental-illness/one-in-five-covid-19-patients-develop-mentalillness-within-90-days-studyidINKBN27P34P). We still do not know the many COVID-related ramifications, especially determining the impact on mental and cognitive functions. People recovering from COVID have reported a variety of physical symptoms (such as muscle weakness and pain), but there are an assortment of brain function issues such as problems with concentration, cognitive function, memory, as well as anxiety, sleep disorders, depression or PTSD post-traumatic stress disorder (https://www.medpagetoday. com/infectiousdisease/ covid19/86556). These issues are especially complicated for those people who were seriously ill and required hospitalization in the ICU. "These patients may experience post-intensive care syndrome (PICS) that could manifest as a combination of physical, cognitive, and mental health impairments following an ICU stay for a critical illness" (https://www.medpagetoday. <u>com/infectiousdisease/</u> c o v i d 1 9 / 8 6 5 5 6). We need to evaluate these varied aspects of mental health as we move forth with the transition that follows this pandemic. During our recovery phase, too many people are isolating their perspectives by only looking at their own nations - or even their own states or towns; that perspective is naïve and fruitless. Realistically, the road to recovery must be collective or all of us will continue to suffer. The virus that caused this pandemic knows no boundaries, despite one's thinking in those terms. The solution to our recovery is "collective care" (https://www.

have learned from 9/11 and the

cdacollaborative.org/blog/4ways-to-transition-responsiblyduring-a-global-pandemic/). This is not a time for "business as usual," nor will we likely go back to the "way things were."

Will we address income inequality and recognize the need for technology-enabled workplaces as well as safer workplaces? Will we invest in the necessary economic and social forces that

HV Sheep & Wool from page 1 exigencies of COVID-19. But Mary says that hopefully, the farm will once again host some get togethers outdoors in the coming months. "We had to stop the get-togethers, because we could not socially distance with that many people inside. Once spring comes, and we're able to sit outside to do it, we will probably restart it. I think people are wanting to get back at it."

Mary's farm has also been a place where boutique crafters and artists could go to rent her equipment to do things like make vibrantly colored felts from roving. And up until now, the farm has also processed wool from the sheep's back all the way to the farm's own line of yarns and felt and roving products, as well as crafted items.

"The processing part is changing, as far as my business and what we do. We will no longer be processing our own wool in-house, into yarn," Mary explains. "We will wash it, and then send it out to another mill, because I'm closing down our mill. With that part of things, it wasn't so much the pandemic. I'm just getting too old for it," she laughs.

But the Hudson Valley Sheep and Wool Company will continue to stock an excellent selection of high quality yarn and felting, as well as ancillary supplies needed for rug hooking, knitting, spinning, needle felting and more. It carries select brands such as Berocco, Mountain Colors, Rowan, Bergere de France, Bartlett, Universal Yarns, Tahki Stacy Charles, Pura Bella, The Fiber Co. and Cestari. The yarns include 100% wool, Superwash wool, wool/alpaca blends, wool/mohair blends, silk, merino wool/silk blends, mohair and mohair/silk blends, cotton and flax.

Mary's property is a peaceful and pastoral setting, and its sloping hills and flatter fields are often dotted with grazing sheep. When she purchased it, it was a cattle farm. She'd learned to knit and craft from her mother, and soon began raising sheep, with the idea of making a business around processing wool.

Right around this time of year is when the sheep on the farm are shorn of their winter coat. "Very shortly, we should be shearing all of the sheep. We currently have just under a hundred sheep. The shearers come in, and do all the sheep in one day. And then we are processing that wool."

The Shetland and Icelandic breeds at the farm are both known for producing quality, versatile wools. The Icelandic actually has two coats, a fine coat and an outer coarse coat. Mary says the coarse coat is typically used to make things for outerwear. The inner coat is similar to Merino, a softer wool that's easy on the skin. The inner fiber can even be used for babyware, including blankets.

There are many advantages of wool-made products. "Wool is sustainable," Mary points out. "The sheep keep producing it. You shear them, and the next year, you shear them again. Wool is also much warmer. It traps the air, and provides great insulation. It's also fire retardant. That's one of the reasons why the military has used it."



Mary's store currently features crafted wool items and other fabric wares. There are durable twined rag rugs in a selection of patterns and colors. Felted pillows feature everything from abstract color designs, to homey scenes and flower patterns.

Christmas, holiday and patriotic themes also abound. Quilt-piece style pot holders come in many varieties and patterns, and so do aprons. Baby blankets are crafted with delicate motifs, and there are sweaters, mittens, vibrantly colored dip-dyed hats, scarves and more. Items are also available via an Etsy store "homesteadwool" (search Etsy.com).

In addition to a great selection of crafted fabric items, the store also carries supplies for crafters, and products from local farms. There are beeswax candles, honey, and maple syrup. Unfortunately, some items have been harder to stock during the pandemic. But there are usually farm fresh eggs available at the store.

A Small Business Working **Through Some Tough Times**

Mary says store traffic has taken a huge hit during the pandemic, and her business has been affected in many of its aspects. Sourcing supplies has become more difficult. But when she speaks about the situation, she voices as much concern for other businesses she knows, as she does for her own farm.

"It's not just the really small businesses, like mine. Larger businesses suffered greatly, too. We get chickens' manure to use on the fields as fertilizer, from a farm up the road. And they lost 50 percent of their business in NYC. It's an egg business, and they lost a lot of their sales. And they're a relatively big business. So it's not just us, the small business person. Larger businesses also took a hit."

Another factor affecting her farm has been the stoppage of local and regional events that traditionally brought in travelers and traffic to the farm.

"All the outside venues and events like Clermont, they have a festival every April. they can't do it. People are not visiting those places where there are large crowds. That has killed them, and that has killed us as participants."

Despite the hardships, Mary noted that business traffic is slowly coming back. she hopes spring weather will "We accelerate that trend. socially distance and wear masks. It's a very large space, so we've felt fairly safe doing it that way. That part of our business stayed steady. It was the customers to our shop, who've been worried about getting out into the public, that really dropped off. We're very hopeful that this spring will turn all this around. I'm really looking forward to spring. I'm done with this winter."

create healthier communities with changes in developing safe housing, good schools, livable wages, gender equity, clean air, drinkable water, a fair economy...? Although we may be utilizing the virtual lifestyle more, will we promote the value of daily face-to-face interactions? Will we redesign our living space, especially our workplace? Perhaps the focus of the office will change in order to promote team interaction and collaboration as opposed to individual work. This also includes "co-working space" with different businesses recognizing the need interaction and collaboration. Will we be able to develop systems for tracking public health safety and yet protect data privacy and security? Will we seriously look at existing inequalities in society and demand new ways for us to thrive in 2021 and beyond?

Although we are certainly not at the post-pandemic stage yet, we should be preparing for the

transition involves a process, and one that we will all be going through, regardless of the variations in our mental health status. COVID-19 is a global health issue that resulted in humanity experiencing a collective trauma. As human beings, we all "share the same sorrows, the same hopes, the same potential" (https:// www.bbc.com/worklife/ article/20201118-coronavirushow-will-it-affect-inequalitiesmental-health). Perhaps we can begin to change society's norms and recognize that humanity can only thrive if we accept that we are one community in need of cooperating with each other. We have been drilled with the concept of "survival of the fittest," but in reality all life forms in nature are dependent on each other and require cooperation in order to survive. So it is in the wake of this pandemic that we have the opportunity to change for the better.

1 boneless beef chuck roast (3 to 4 pounds) 1 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon pepper 1 tablespoon canola oil

1-1/2 cups water 1/2 cup reduced-sodium soy sauce

1/4 cup honey 3 tablespoons cider vinegar 3 garlic cloves, minced 2 teaspoons ground ginger 1 teaspoon ground mustard 1 large onion, halved and sliced 2 tablespoons cornstarch 2 tablespoons cold water

Directions

Sprinkle roast with salt and pepper. In a large skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat. Brown roast on all sides. Transfer meat to a 5- or 6-qt. slow cooker. In a small bowl, mix water, soy sauce, honey, vinegar, garlic, ginger and mustard; pour over meat. Top with onion. Cook, covered, on low until meat is tender, 7-9

Remove roast and onion to a serving platter; keep warm. Transfer cooking juices to a large saucepan; skim fat. Bring cooking juices to a boil. In a small bowl, mix cornstarch and cold water until smooth; stir into cooking juices. Return to a boil; cook and stir until thickened, 1-2 minutes. Serve with roast.

Jesus: The Ambassador of Peace





Parasite Season Is Coming Soon

Along with spring and warmer weather we all must remember that fleas, ticks, and heartworms will again be a problem for our pets. In addition to causing irritation and discomfort, fleas can commonly cause many more chronic and serious problems. Fleas bite and suck blood from their host and many dogs and cats will develop an allergy to the bite of the flea. This results in severe discomfort, skin irritation and often serious skin infections that can be difficult to treat and resolve. When fleas are not controlled on our pets, they can also infest the house and bite humans. Remember, just because you don't see fleas it does not mean they aren't there. Fleas are very good at hiding on your pet and in your home. Oftentimes, fleas will jump on a pet, bite, and then jump off undetected. though their bite may not leave any immediate evidence, the flea will often leave behind eggs, which increases the likelihood of an infestation on the pet and in the home. To eradicate fleas from your pets and home you must treat every pet in the house and maintain treatment consistently for at least 3 to 4 months. It is relatively easy and effective to rid fleas from your pets and your home using safe and effective prescription flea preventative medication under the direction of a veterinarian.

In the Hudson Valley, ticks are a major parasite problem for humans and pets. Adult deer ticks are very small, but can often be seen on your pet from October through May. In May, the ticks enter their 6-month nymph phase and are no bigger than the period at the end of this sentence. The most common diseases they are known to transmit in our area are Lyme disease and Anaplasmosis, and the nymphs cause the majority of cases in both humans and pets. These nymphs inhabit grassy areas and are found even in mowed lawns in the middle of town. These diseases can cause

joint pain, fever, neurological problems, abnormal bleeding, and sometimes irreversible kidney failure. Because we cannot always see or catch the ticks before they attach, the best way to avoid disease is to use safe and effective products to kill them on your pet before they transmit any disease.

Lastly, mosquitoes in our area transmit deadly heartworms, which cause severe damage to the blood vessels of the heart and lungs. These worms can grow to 14 inches in length and live up to seven years in a pet's heart and lungs. Their presence is not often discovered until there is substantial and irreversible cardiovascular damage and it is too late to treat. This makes both testing AND prevention very important.

Thankfully, there are many safe and effective prescription products that will prevent these parasites from infecting your pet. Flea and tick products come in chewable tablets, topical liquids and collars. Heartworm preventatives can be found as tablets, topical liquids and The duration of injections. these products varies ranging from 1 day to 12 months. Your veterinarian and veterinary staff are well educated to help you decide the best products to use for your individual pets. The chemicals in these prescription products have been tested and used for many years, are targeted to affect only the parasites and are backed up by the manufacturer when purchased through licensed veterinarians.

Preventing these parasites from affecting your pet is much safer and cost effective than treating the diseases that these insects carry.

Recent media outlets have implicated Seresto, 8-month collars in causing illness and death in dogs. To date, there has been no official scientific confirmation regarding these accusations, however, if you have questions regarding the use of Seresto collars you should call your veterinarian for advice.

SPRING HAS SPRUNG!

A little prevention goes a long way, so speak with your vet and follow these easy safety tips to enjoy spring in all its blossoming, blue-skied glory with your pup! HEARTWORMS, **FLEAS AND TICKS**

Heartworms, fleas and ticks can be especially prevalent in springtime. Heartworm disease is a serious (and potentially fatal) parasitic illness transmitted by mosquitos. The American Heartworm Society guidelines recommend all dogs be tested annually for heartworm infection

as larvae take 6-7 months to become adult worms. Your vet can both test for and create a preventative medication program to keep your dog heartworm-free. Fleas and ticks can trigger a host of problems, from flea allergy dermatitis to Lyme disease and rocky Mountain Spotted Fever. In large enough numbers, both

ticks and fleas can cause a dangerous amount of blood loss, especially in young dogs. The most common prevention options — monthly spoton topicals and oral tablets— are popular due to both convenience and effectiveness. As with all medical issues, prevention is preferable, so be sure to check with your vet for

Gardening is a natural fit for springtime, but a little petproofing can go along way. Many plants and gardening supplies can be poisonous and even fatal to our pups, so consult your vet or simply Google information for a list of toxic plants in your area and consider not planting these items – or know how to recognize them and keep your dog away if they occur naturally. Avoid pesticides and use natural alternatives instead. Similarly, if you have treated your lawn

with fertilizers, herbicides or insecticides, don't let your dog walk on it until these often-toxic treatments have completely dried. You may also consider not gardening with your dog present. Your observant pup may think that digging and playing with plants is acceptable canine behavior! **SPRING ALLERGIES**

Spring allergies are a natural, sometimes inherited consequence of blooming plants, grasses and flowers for humans and dogs alike. Dogs often develop itchy skin (a condition called atopy) instead of sneezing, however, so be on the lookout for persistent scratching. Licking and biting

which may mean your pup is seeking relief from discomfort. Oral medications are a great option if your dog shows signs of atopy for less than three months per year. In more severe cases, your vet can perform a skin test to pinpoint the allergies. In either instance, visit your veterinarian for diagnoses and recommended allergy treatments.

SMELLY DOGS

Smelly dogs may be a sign of a number of things: dental disease, ear infection, oily skin or a blocked anal gland. To tackle a potential issue, first identify where the smell is coming from. Mouth odor, for example, may indicate dental problems, digestive illness or underlying internal diseases like kidney issues or diabetes. If you notice discolored teeth or worse doggie breath than usual, ask your vet for a dental exam. If the skin inside your dog's ears is red, sore to the touch or emits a bad odor, have your vet check for an ear infection. Dogs with flaky dandruff or an oily, waxy feel to their coat along with a strong odor may have seborrhea, a common skin disorder that can be prevented through frequent baths with a medicated shampoo. Lastly, an infected anal gland can also be a source of odor and discomfort and may require veterinary attention for treatment.

Angela Lanuto Team from page 1 bring some tips of the trade to help buyers try to get an upper hand on this very tight housing market.

Another episode of *Keeping* It Real, Is Now A Good Time?, takes sellers through the current real estate market and helps them understand the speed at which the market is as a whole and how individual transactions are moving. "Sellers who bought their home five years or even a decade ago are being blindsided by how quickly an offer comes in when they list their homes for sale and how quickly a closing date is set. It used to take months, sometimes a year. Technology has made everything move more quickly and real estate has really changed because of it. In many cases the increased speed makes things easier for sellers who are ready to move on. But sometimes, they're not expecting it. We want sellers to be comfortable with the changes they're making, and that means helping them prepare for how the process might go," says Lanuto.

"The Dutchess County properties sold stats from the end of 4th Quarter are staggering," says Morelle, "and what we are seeing is that the real estate market across the whole Mid-Hudson Valley Region is also booming in counties like

Columbia, Greene, and Ulster. I've seen people rendered speechless by the statistics," she proclaims, "they need someone to interpret what those numbers mean for them."

Angela and Allison are unflaggingly cheerful, genuine, and informative during their 10 minute episodes - they chat with



viewers and each other while real estate market statistics run across the bottom of the screen newsnetwork-style, displaying sales statistics; Average Sale Price up 37.83% and Number of Sales are up 32.11%, for Dutchess properties. After watching a couple of episodes, I sat down to talk with Angela and Allison myself.

You ladies talk a lot about inventory. It seems to be the market watchword at the moment. Why is it so important?

In real estate a low inventory cycle can mean permanent value growth. In order to actually close a real estate sale when a buyer needs a mortgage, the bank requires an appraisal of value. An appraiser arrives at a value for a home based on other recent sales that are similar

to the house in question; there Banker's survey suggests it need to be several similar homes



that have recently closed at a comparable price for the bank to approve a mortgage. Because there has been such an increase in sales this year, and because the demand has driven up prices, there are now comparable sales that justify a higher sales price for properties that are entering the market this spring. Even if the inventory increases as Coldwell

will, local homeowners will be

justified in listing their homes at a price point that is significantly higher than it would have been a year

or two ago. With homes selling so quickly does it really matter who sellers work

with - I mean their home is going to sell, right?

It's important to choose your real estate representative carefully because anyone can say 'I sell real estate'. But remember: you may be purchasing or selling the most expensive asset you will ever own and you want to be guided by someone experienced






