

Wassailing and Yulesinging

The tradition of wassailing (alt sp wasselling) falls into two distinct categories: the housevisiting wassail and the orchardvisiting wassail. The housevisiting wassail is the practice of people going door-to-door, singing and offering a drink from the wassail bowl in exchange for gifts; this practice still exists, but has largely been displaced by caroling. The orchard-visiting wassail refers to the ancient custom of visiting orchards in cider-producing regions of

England, reciting incantations and singing to the trees to promote a good harvest for the coming year.

The word wassail comes from the Anglo-Saxon greeting Wæs bu hæl, meaning "be thou hale"—i.e., "be in good health".

Traditionally, the wassail is celebrated on Twelfth Night (variously on either January 5 or 6). Some people still wassail on "Old Twelvey Night", January 17, as it would have been before the introduction of the Gregorian Calendar in 1752.

In the middle ages, the wassail was a reciprocal exchange between the feudal lords and their peasants as a form of recipientinitiated charitable giving, to be distinguished from begging

The <u>lord of the manor</u> would give food and drink to the peasants in exchange for their blessing and goodwill. This would be given in the form of the song being sung. Wassailing is the background practice against which an English carol such as "We Wish You a Merry Christmas" can be made sense of. The carol lies in the English tradition where wealthy people of

treats to the carolers on Christmas Eve such as 'figgy puddings'.

Although wassailing is often described in innocuous and sometimes nostalgic termsstill practiced in some parts of Scotland and Northern England on New Years Day as "firstfooting"—the practice in England has not always been considered so innocent. Similar traditions have also been traced to Greece and the country of Georgia. Wassailing was associated with rowdy bands of young men who would enter the homes of wealthy neighbours and demand free food and drink (in a manner similar to the modern children's Halloween practice of trickor-treating). If the householder refused, he was usually cursed,

and occasionally his house was vandalized. The example of the exchange is seen in their demand for "figgy pudding" and "good cheer", i.e., the wassail beverage, without which the wassailers in the song will not leave; "We won't go until we get some, so bring some out here".

In the cider-producing West of England (primarily counties of Devon, Somerset, Dorset, Gloucestershire and Herefordshire) wassailing also refers to drinking (and singing) the health of trees in the hopes that they might better thrive. The purpose of wassailing is to awake the cider apple trees and to scare away evil spirits to ensure a good harvest of fruit in the autumn.

- Holiday retail sales crossed the \$1 trillion mark for the first time in 2018.
- The average American shopper spent \$846 on gifts in 2018 a 14 percent increase from 2017.
- The average holiday shopper purchased about 16 gifts in 2018.
- Holiday e-commerce sales were responsible for \$126 billion in 2018 a 16.5 percent increase from the \$108.2 billion generated in 2017.
 - In 2018, Cyber Monday generated \$7.9 billion in online sales — making it the biggest sales day in US e-commerce history. There's some good news for brick and mortars and local entrepreneurs. Black Friday, example, is still the largest shopping day of the year. It's the busiest traffic day of the year, so there's no doubt people are getting out of the house. And 56 percent of shoppers believe that Black Friday is when they can get some of the best deals on items like electronics, clothing and Local businesses are

They're using chambers of commerce, coordination with local municipalities, online resources and networking, to do it. 



Figgy Pudding

Ingredients

1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, plus more for greasing

1 cup boiling water, plus more as needed

3 tablespoons brandy

ound dried figs

3/4 cup granulated sugar

3 eggs 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour 1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon salt Confectioners' sugar, for dusting

Directions

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Grease an 11-cup Bundt pan. Melt the butter in a medium saucepan set over medium heat. Continue cooking until the butter turns golden brown, then transfer to a heatproof container and refrigerate until solid, about 1 hour.

In a medium bowl, pour the boiling water and brandy over the figs and soak until softened, about 30 minutes. Coarsely chop 1/2 cup of the figs, and set aside. Place the remaining figs and the soaking liquid in the bowl of a food processor and puree until smooth.

In a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, combine the chilled brown butter with the sugar and beat until combined. Add the eggs one at a time, and mix until combined. Add the fig puree, flour, baking powder, cinnamon and salt, and beat on low speed until smooth. Stir in the chopped figs. Pour the batter into the prepared Bundt pan, then cover

tightly with foil and secure with a rubber band.

Place the Bunt pan in a 12-by-17-inch deep roasting pan and set on the bottom rack of the oven. Pour 2 inches of boiling water around Bundt pan, then cover entire roasting pan with foil. Bake until the pudding is firm to the touch and a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 1 hour 15 minutes.

Cool the pudding for 10 minutes, then invert the Bundt pan over a plate to unmold the pudding. Sprinkle the pudding with confectioners' sugar and cut into slices to serve. the coaches that would stop at

Cannabis Toxicity in **Pets**

The Cannabis sativa plant has two famous varieties – hemp and marijuana. They are, technically speaking, the same plant (Cannabis sativa) but hemp varieties contain less than 0.3% THC and marijuana varieties contain more than 0.3% THC. (tetrahydrocannabinol) is the psychoactive chemical lends marijuana all of its recreational effects and some of its medicinal effects. The other important compound is cannabidiol, or CBD. While marijuana is grown for its THC and CBD, hemp is grown for its fibers (for textiles and other industrial uses) and its CBD. CBD appears to be a relatively safe compound in pets and humans. We encounter problems

when CBD is in very high concentrations or is incorporated into edible products, most notably chocolate (which is toxic for dogs). There are now many CBD products marketed for pets. It is important to remember that the FDA does not recognize these products as legal medicinal products. Therefore they are not regulated, companies are not required to show evidence that they are effective and there is no regulation of how much CBD they contain. Veterinarians cannot legally prescribe these products and most have not formally investigated for safety and efficacy. This is changing and we expect to see this market expanding. THC, on the other hand, is responsible for many cases of pet intoxication. This has become an alarming problem in states with legalized recreational marijuana

products. Many edibles are meant to be ingested in small amounts but since dogs cannot read labels, they tend to eat way too much. This is a problem particularly in small dogs, as deaths related to toxicity have been reported. Clinical signs of marijuana intoxication occur within 30-90 minutes after ingestion. Symptoms can linger for several days because THC is stored in the body's fat deposits. Intoxicated dogs are uncoordinated and sleepy. They often have dilated pupils, a slow heart rate, low body temperature and in some cases urinary incontinence. The classic symptom is the "startle reflex" the dog will look like it is about to fall asleep on its feet, then startle abruptly as it is about to fall over. Cats may have alternating episodes of sedation and agitation and even aggression. Dogs and cats may also have seizures. Your veterinarian will likely check your pet for signs of other toxins that can look similar in the early stages. It is very important to let your vet know if there is a chance of exposure to marijuana or other recreational drugs. Your vet will also watch for signs of chocolate toxicity pancreatitis, depending on what the edible base was. Treatment involves sedation, maintaining a normal body temperature and heart rate, controlling seizures. Pets are usually hospitalized intravenous fluids on medication injectable

and the culprit is usually edible

until the toxin wears off. As edible marijuana products become more available, it is important to keep them stored safely away from your pets.

These include fatty or spicy foods, bread dough, fresh herbs, alcoholic beverages and sweets of all kind, especially those with chocolate or xylitol, an artificial sweetener.

are cooked poultry bones. Cooked bones easily splinter, and the bone shards can cause choking or get stuck in your dog's gums. Instead, give "dog bones" specifically designed for dogs to chew. Ask your veterinarian or trainer for suggestions. Discourage your dog from

foraging in the garbage. Secure all trash cans. It's natural that you do want to share holiday treats with your dog. While a small taste of turkey or sweet potatoes can make your dog happy, don't over do it. Too much of a good thing can make him sick.

DECORATIONS ARE NOT PLAYTHINGS.

- Keep your pets away from holiday plants, many of which are poisonous, such as holly, mistletoe, poinsettias and amaryllis.
- Snow globes can contain antifreeze, which is extremely toxic to dogs. Keep any antifreeze products away from your happy, tail-wagging dog. If there is an antifreeze

spill, send your dog out of the room while you clean up the liquid. Dilute the spot with water and floor cleaner to ensure your dog does not lick the area later.

- Keep electrical wires and batteries out of your pet's reach. Chewing or bitanything electrical can cause shock or burns.
- Don't leave lighted candles unattended. A lit candle knocked over by a swinging tail can burn your pet or cause a fire.

CHRISTMAS TREES CAN BE HAZARDOUS.

- Anchor the tree to the ceiling or wall to prevent it from tipping over.
- Hang non-breakable ornaments near the bottom of the tree. Avoid putting tinsel on your tree. If ingested, tinsel can twist in your dog's intestines and be deadly.
- Don't let your dog drink Christmas tree water. The water may contain preservative chemicals, which can Continued on page 15



Staying Connected: Did We Forget All The Benefits?

Getting together with friends is fun, but did you also know it has health benefits? The holidays are coming up and instead of getting consumed with the hustle-bustle, take time just to enjoy feasting and socializing with others. "Gathering is good for our body and our spirit" (https://www.nytimes. com/2019/11/18/smarter-living/ <u>holiday-meals-family-tips.</u> <u>html</u>). Even though it may seem obvious, researchers have concluded that social connection is good for our health; so turn around your thought process this holiday season and instead of feeling like there are too many bad habits related to the holidays, eat, drink, and be merry! A healthy diet and exercise

are important prescriptions for good health, but so is our social connection. For those of you who enjoy alone time – no worries. Social connection is about quality time, not quantity. On the other hand, social isolation is risky business, with researchers concluding that it is equal to the physically-linked risk factors of smoking, obesity or lack of exercise (https://www. <u>ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pmc/articles/</u> <u>PMC3150158/</u>). A more apparent observation is that social connection leads to better mental health; people are less depressed and less anxious when they stay connected (The Happiness Track, by Emma Seppala).

What is the meaning of social connection? Researchers define it as: "the feeling that you belong to a group and generally feel close to other people. Scientific evidence strongly suggests that this is a core psychological need essential to feeling satisfied with your life" (http://www.liherald.com/ islandpark/stories/the-powerof-human-connection, 102632).

Dr. J. Martino et al – in their study addressing the power of human interaction characterized social connection as a "dose of the human moment—a positive contact with other people." As with Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs, social connection is considered a vital human need, and it is now utilized as treatment and prevention, along with medical therapies, for various health conditions such as depression, obesity, anxiety, addictions, etc. (https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/ pmc/articles/PMC6125010/).

How powerful is social connection?

1. A lack of social connection is worse for our health than smoking 2. Having social connections increase our chances of longevity by fifty percent. Social connection can help us ward off disease. Feeling connected boosts immune and system inflammation. 4. People who are connected with others have lower rates of depression. Our self-esteem and empathy, improves when we feel connected to others. (https://www.inc.com/ jessica-stillman/5-wayssocial-connection-makes-

you-healthier.html) What about our connection with our physicians and other healthcare providers? Doctor-patient relationships have changed, and we need to be mindful of maintaining a connection. We see more specialists, more tests are done, computers are being utilized more in health settings, and hospitalists (instead of our own doctor) see us when we are hospitalized. Although these advancements improve our health in some ways, they also lead to being more distanced from our doctors. For example, it's great that our medical history is stored in the electronic medical record for easy access to our providers, but it also tends to lead to less "face-time" with our doctors. The advanced technology with equipment and testings, have helped in the advancement of our treatments, but this also takes away from the basics of being "touched and examined" by our doctors. Having hospitalists, who are better trained to deal with patients in the hospital setting, is an asset, but we also lose the connection of our primary physician (who knows us well) being with us

when we are hospitalized https:// www.health.harvard.edu/blog/ keeping-the-human-connectionin-medicine-2016121210837. In conclusion, we need to seek a balance of utilizing the advancements in medicine wisely and still maintaining our connection with doctor and other providers.

Interesting that social connection is part of town Although planning. town planning has changed as a result of economics, people's interest in downsizing, desire to be within walking distance to schools, stores, restaurants etc., there is also a link to social connection. I have a friend who is a town planner, and she has addressed the fact that many areas of our country are changing the design of their towns because of the way people want to live. More people are living closer to their village and town centers in traditional neighborhood developments (TND), where they can be in proximity to each other, socialize, share recreational facilities, and overall build better community relationships. **Perhaps** researchers will find that these

communities are healthier. As society discovers the benefits of the simplicity of social connection, we might see changes in the way we live, socialize, do business, and take care of our health. Currently our digital and success-driven world doesn't seem to be working for us and it has the potential to result in "connected disconnection." The outcome is loneliness, and with our elderly population, loneliness becoming an epidemic known as the "hidden killer" (https://medium.com/thriveglobal/the-science-of-humanconnection-and-wellnessin-a-digitally-connectedworld-611eb8c1b51c). We are gravitating toward reconnection to each other, and science had discovered that we are getting healthier and feeling better as a result. After all, "the most precious commodities on this planet are our health, love, and happiness. Regardless of what we accomplish and accumulate in life, we are unable to take it with us" (Marina Rose, in 2017's The Science of Human Connection and Wellness In A Digitally Disconnected World).

As you celebrate this season reflect on the love of God, who sent His Son for you. Don't turn away from His love, instead open your heart to receive it. 

Since both Mary and Joseph were of the House and Lineage of David they had to go to Bethlehem. Mary was in her ninth month of pregnancy when they traveled the ninety miles to Bethlehem! When they got to Bethlehem, they checked the Inn and there was no room in the Inn (Luke 2:7).

Jesus was born somewhere near the Inn and placed in a Manger! He was born in a very humble setting. The Eternal Word became a man. The Birth of Jesus was Announced Shepherds outside Bethlehem. The Angel appeared to the Shepherds and said, "... Fear not: for, behold, I bring
