

It reminds me of the verses in Matthew 7:7-11. If we as infallible beings know how to give good gifts to those we love, how much more so does our perfect Father, whose love for us is beyond measure, know how to give good gifts to us as His children. Children can be known to have a short attention span, but I have noticed that between November 1st and Christmas Day, they have no trouble holding the expectation of what they will receive. Why then do we have such difficulty eagerly waiting and looking forward to the presents that God gives us as His children? Dr Timothy Jennings writes of the gift giving scenario in his book Could It Be This Simple? A Biblical Model for Healing the Mind, as he points out that children don't have a sense of fear or uncertainty about whether there truly will be presents, but long before they see the presents they have joy and excitement knowing that it will be there for them. (p82) This is because they know that the giver of the presents is reliable. Perhaps the real question is: do we know and believe with all our hearts that God is reliable? This season we celebrate one of the gifts we have already received - Jesus! Yet, how often do we marvel at the miracle? Those who lived at the time before the birth of Christ, had only the promise and no evidence of His coming, yet they believed that God was reliable. Look at the long accounts of faithful men and women in Hebrews 11, as the names of Old

mentioned as acting (anticipating, hoping, and believing) by faith. Christmas Day is fixed on the calendar each year. We know December 25th will come once a year. It's true we do not know the day or the hour that all of God's gifts and promises will come to pass but let us believe from our hearts that God is reliable. He is the giver of God gifts! We don't need to shrink back in fear thinking that He will not do as He said. Instead let us live with joyful expectation, by faith. And be sure to put your trust, hopes, dreams and expectation in the most precious gift of the season - Jesus, who came so that you might have eternal life. 



KEEPING THE HOLIDAY SEASON FUN & SAFE FOR YOUR DOGS

It is hard to believe but the holiday season is once again rapidly approaching, and I would hope that we can all have happy and safe celebrations. Please keep in mind that good times with family and friends; decorations, parties, gifts and all the excitement that goes along with the holidays can be stressful for our dogs that don't quite understand what is going on. While we humans try to get more done in the time we have, our dogs may only see an upset to their normal routine, trees growing in the living room and, in many homes, an unusual amount of kitchen activity that produces amazing aromas.

HOLIDAY FOODS

While the array a food that comes

from our kitchen are treats to be had by the humans, they can be dangerous when consumed by our dogs. These include fatty or spicy foods, bread dough, fresh herbs, alcoholic beverages and sweets of all kinds, especially those with chocolate or xylitol. dangerous Particularly are cooked poultry bones that easily splinter, and bone shards can cause choking or get stuck in your dog's gums. Ask your trainer or veterinarian for suggestions.

Secure all trash cans and discourage your dog from foraging. While a small taste of turkey or sweet potatoes can make your dog happy, don't over do it. **DECORATIONS ARE NOT**

PLAYTHINGS

plants are Many holiday poisonous, such as holly, mistletoe, poinsettias and amaryllis. Keep them out of reach from your dog. Snow globes can contain antifreeze, which is extremely toxic to dogs. Keep any antifreeze products away from your happy,

tail-wagging dog. If there is an antifreeze spill, send your dog out of the room while you clean up the liquid. Dilute the spot with water and floor cleaner to ensure your dog does not lick the area later. Don't leave lighted candles unattended. A lit candle knocked over by a swinging tail can burn your pet or cause a fire. CHRISTMAS TREES CAN

BE HAZARDOUS

Anchor the tree to the ceiling or wall to prevent it from tipping over. Hang non-breakable ornaments near the bottom of the tree. If ingested, tinsel can twist in your dog's intestines and be deadly. Don't use it!Christmas tree water may contain preservative chemicals, which can trigger severe indigestion in dogs. Stagnant clean water can breed bacteria and cause nausea or diarrhea to the pet which imbibes. Don't let your dog drink water from the base of your tree.Sweep up fallen pine needles regularly, as they can puncture holes in a dog's intestines if ingested. **HELP YOUR DOG FEEL**

SAFE AND RELAXED

Most dogs get excited when guests arrive. To help your dog be calmer, exercise him prior to the festivities. After 30 minutes of walking or playtime, your dog will likely be relaxed or want to nap.As a general rule, don't allow the family dog to greet unfamiliar guests since unusual activities and commotion can cause him extra stress.Give your dog a break from the hub-bub by putting him in his crate or in a quiet room with his bed. Allow him to rejoin the festivities after guests have arrived. Don't put your dog outside, especially in cold temperatures, where you might forget about him.Pets stressed by unfamiliar events typically pant more, so keep your dog's water bowl filled with freshwater. PETS LIKE PRESENTS TOO Help your dog stay busy and out of the holiday trimmings by giving him fun, safe gifts. Shop for puzzles, games and toys that require your dog to think and keep him entertained. **A FINAL NOTE**

Please, please, please don't give a pet as a surprise gift.

A cute puppy might seem like the perfect gift choice, but many of these holiday presents end up in animal shelters. Owning a dog takes a genuine commitment of time and responsibility, and adoptive owners must be ready to participate in training and other activities. If you are absolutely certain the recipient is up to the challenge and wants the responsibility, seriously consider giving a leash and a collar or a note saying a dog of the recipient's choice will come with it. This helps ensure the lucky person gets just the right pet to bring into the family.

The world has become more "pet friendly" allowing pets in public places, driven by the desire for owners to keep their pets with them as much as they are able. Despite this social shift, there may come a time when a dog or cat needs to board at a facility. This may occur because the owners may be going to a place where pets are still not allowed, they may be traveling where they cannot properly care for their pet, there could be an emergency where an owner needs to be in the hospital, or they could be undergoing construction on their home that does not make it safe for their pets to be there. Whatever the reason, owners should be as prepared as they can for boarding their pet. Planning for boarding: Contact the boarding facility well in advance as many facilities book up quickly. Inquire about the specific requirements for your pet such as vaccines, negative fecal test results, etc. Some places will also require pets to be on flea/tick prevention. Ask the facility if they require you to bring your own food, bedding, bowls, etc. or if the facility will provide those. If your pet needs medications or a special



diet, make sure the facility is comfortable administering those. Be sure the staff can reach you if there is an emergency or if your pet becomes sick during the stay. If you may be unreachable, leave the contact details for a person who can make decisions while you are away. Finding the right place: Connect with the boarding facility you plan to use and ask how they are set up. Do they walk dogs together or allow them to interact during the stay? How much exercise do they offer and how big are the kennels/cages? What is their protocol if your pet gets sick? How do they prevent pets from escaping? It is also important to know their hours of operation and how many staff members are involved. Ask if the facility offers tours. If possible, have your pet board for a weekend to see how they do and meet the staff. Not every boarding facility is set up to cater to all pet personalities. A pet that needs socialization and exercise will need a different environment than a pet that prefers quiet and no interaction with other animals or one who needs close medical monitoring. Aftermath of boarding: Most pets will settle in quickly and do quite well. However, it is common for some to have decreased appetites or even gastrointestinal upset (vomiting/diarrhea) during their

stay. Their routine, surroundings, and caretakers are different, so it can cause some anxiety. Some pets will have trouble urinating or defecating outside if it is not what they are used to. Pets can also be vocal and aggressive due to their stress. In any of these situations, the boarding staff should be trained to recognize these issues and have a protocol to address them. Sometimes it will require special food or supplements; sometimes it will require special medication to help keep the pets calm; rarely it can be severe enough to warrant ending the boarding stay early or not boarding in the future. Be sure to talk with the boarding staff when you pick your pet up to find out exactly how they did. Boarding can be stressful, but with proper planning and communication between your you and boarding facility, it can go smoothly and be an invaluable service.







discuss her father's time during the McCarthy era with author Peter Biskind, a Crandell board member. Tickets are \$20 and will benefit the theater's upcoming restoration and renovation. High Noon, written by Carl Foreman, is an untraditional Western starring Gary Cooper, Grace Kelly and Katy Jurado. The film eschews familiar Western tropes like chases on horseback, saloon fights and breathtaking vistas for more immediate, emotional scenes that culminate in a dramatic final act. The heroine (Kelly) even rescues the hero (Cooper), which upset several critics in the buttoned-up 1950s. But the film's backstory is even wilder. John Wayne declined the leading role after reading Foreman's script, which he felt was a thinly veiled screed against blacklisting, something Wayne vociferously supported during the House Un-American Activities Committee Hearings led by Senator Joseph McCarthy. Cooper won an Academy Award that year for his role, but didn't attend the ceremony. John Wayne, of all people,

accepted the Oscar on his behalf. The documentary short High Noon on the Waterfront (14 min.) will precede the feature. The short visually renders a dialogue between Carl Foreman (voiced by Edward Norton) and Elia Kazan (voiced by John Turturro), highlighting their very different views and actions during the McCarthy era. Dr. Amanda Foreman is the author of the prize-winning bestsellers Georgiana, Duchess of Devonshire and A World on Fire: An Epic History of





Two Nations Divided. In 2016, Foreman served as chair of The Man Booker Prize. That same year, her BBC documentary series, The Ascent of Woman, was released. Her next book, The World Made by Women: A New History of Humanity, is scheduled to be published by Penguin Random House in 2025. Peter Biskind is the bestselling author of Easy Riders, Raging Bulls: How the Sex-Drugs-And Rock 'n Roll Generation Saved Hollywood. His latest book, Pandora's Box: How Guts, Guile and Greed Upended TV, was released this fall. He is the coexecutive and co-artistic director of the 23-year FilmColumbia film festival, held annually at the Crandell Theatre.
