

Market Street in Red Hook, offers second-hand "pre-loved" and new clothing, and regularly features fashion pieces by sought after brands, at prices that will please just about anyone in current costconscious times. Items sourced from vendors are either cruelty free, made in America, women owned products or sustainable products. Some recent showcased items have included: * A Free People cowl neck burnt orange sweater with an oversized look, perfect for winter and early spring. * Soft and cozy elephant print leggings matched with a Tahari tee * A LOFT long sleeve top with an accented neckline, ready to be paired perhaps with American Eagle Outfitters jeans, and brushed black shoes decorated with a white embroidered motif Caramel-leather Diba featuring eyeboots an catching flower pattern A light-coffee colored Wendy mesh cardigan by Bellissimo, paired with a check-patterned hair tie

Sarah's fashion knowledge definitely comes into play in the way she comes up with ensemble suggestions that create looks that are cozy, elegant and alluring, all at the same time. The shop operates on a consignment basis for some items, but Sarah also does some buying of new items. She says some of the most sought-after items at Shoppe

Girl are the self care products, sourced from different boutique producers and artisans. "I just got these sweet little goat soaps that are made from a woman in Tennessee, and girls have been loving those. I would say that the

self-care products in general are something that catches attention when people are looking around. Bath balms for example. Just things that help women to feel better or relax. Sometimes they'll ask what do you recommend I pair this with? People have definitely been coming in and making little kits for themselves, from the different unique items we have."

The ability to enlarge the experience by offering salon services in an individual tailored atmosphere is something that makes Shoppe Girl unique.

"My mom's salon is actually the home of the original ten dollar manicure, so that's one of her focuses," Sarah says. "She offers a variety of different services, including pedicures and acrylic full sets. She does it all, and it's one on one, so it's a really comfortable experience. It's not like a big salon, where you walk in and there's ten people in there. It's more of a cozy feeling, with more personal attention. That's the vibe here." Who Is That Shoppe Girl?

Lockdown fatigue may finally be hitting a tipping point, and Sarah says she's definitely noticed women wanting to look and feel their best in the world, even if they're still spending quite a bit of time in virtual meetings, etc.

"I feel like women are coming in and either looking for, like for comfortable options for their at home work, so I'm finding women are not searching so much for jeans, but just like a comfortable alternative, like a nice shirt and a pair of leggings, compared to before, where it was all about what their shoes looked like, what their accessories looked like. Now, it's just more about comfort, and a nice price, as well as second-hand. Because I feel like second-hand and being sustainable is on trend, so we're having success trying to go along with that. Definitely comfort is key right now."

When her business first opened, Sarah says she had a vision of her customer. But in the months since the store has been operating, that conception has evolved. "At first I was geared toward girls that were in their 20's, just starting out and maybe wanting a fashionable outfit, but might not be able to afford it yet, being that the world is kind of crazy. I just wanted to create a kind of affordable place. So my customer, I guess she's just trying to start out and be fashionable. I never really thought about it. I feel like she keeps changing, the girl who I envisioned in the beginning is now changing

something different, to which I think is interesting."

One thing that hasn't changed is Sarah and Rebecca's commitment to providing an in-person experience based on tailored and attentive service. Shoppe Girl does have digital presence, but it's not meant to be the focus of the business or just a generic sales experience.

"Right now I just have an instagram, facebook and Poshmark presence, where I sell to girls that are in the area," Sarah explains. "So, I'm trying to expand my Poshmark. Because I don't really know if websites are my demo. I don't personally look at websites, or social media. I'm just trying to create more of a social media story, and adding my own little personal touches to it." In an effort to respond to

Peace in Relationship By Naomi Fata

This year I am going to be writing a series on peace. Given the unrest in our country right now peace is something we are all longing for. However, it is the inner peace that is far more important than expecting peace in the world around us. Looking into the Bible only two people truly experienced unbroken peace-Adam and Eve before their sin. At the beginning of creation, they had a sweet fellowship with God. It was a relationship in which they were fully known. We were created for intimacy and relationship. I believe we underestimate the importance relationship plays in our inner peace. When anger, bitterness or shame enter a relationship it brings tension to the soul. Dr. Caroline Leaf, well-known author and neuroscientist, would say this causes toxic memory trees to grow in your brain. True love doesn't have guilt or shame because there is nothing to hide. Back at the beginning it says that Adam and Eve were naked and unashamed. (Genesis 2:25) This concept seems hard to grasp. To be naked before God and before a spouse, is to be vulnerable. I think about meeting someone for the first time, whether it be a friend or a partner. At first it is awkward and uncomfortable because you don't really "know" the other person. Initially in relationships we often try to act a part or only show our good side, because we are afraid of judgement or are hiding secrets that we are ashamed of. Over time the more you get to know someone the more comfortable you become. We have more inner peace with people that know and accept us. A healthy relationship with God brings us even greater peace, than our human relationships. Adam and Eve had the perfect relationship with Him. They were never afraid of His wrath

because they were so intricately

connected to him because there was a 'rift' in their relationship.

Relational conflict started when Adam and Eve became discontent with their relationship with God. Their attention diverted away from Him, to a longing for what they did not have. Instead of enjoying friendship with God, the serpent encouraged them that it would be more profitable for them to be 'like' God, and convinced them to eat the forbidden fruit. This brought dishonesty into their relationship with God and caused them to hide from Him.

Think about your own relationships. If there is lack of peace is it because you are trying to hide, or because you are trying to be 'like' the other person rather than enjoying the relationship you already have? Relationships are complicated and filled with challenges but even the apostle Paul encourages us that as much as possible we should attempt to live at peace with all men. 



Feline Diabetes

Cats are unique creatures from their varying coat colors to their diverse personalities they are certainly different than their human cohabitants. They are obligate carnivores, meaning they have to eat meat, have 38 chromosomes (compared to 46 in people), and have a mechanism that allows them to purr. However, two areas of health that we can relate to them somewhat: diabetes and hyperthyroidism.

Diabetes mellitus in cats is similar to insulin resistance in

humans. With diabetes, the pancreas does not produce enough insulin, a hormone needed for the body to take up glucose from the blood. When the body does not have enough insulin, excess glucose builds up in the blood (high blood sugar, or hyperglycemia). Despite the excess glucose in the blood, the body feels as if it is starving. Common signs of diabetes in cats: weight loss despite a good appetite and increased drinking/ urination. Unregulated diabetes can lead to severe illness and complications. Diabetes is

treated similarly in cats as well – administering insulin as well as feeding a diet low in carbohydrates. Some cats can be managed with a diet change alone. It is very important to monitor sugar levels while managing diabetes as levels that are too high or too low are very dangerous. Cats with diabetes are more prone to infections, pancreatitis, liver problems, and other diseases, so they must be monitored very closely.

Similarly to diabetes, cats with a condition known as hyperthyroidism tend to lose weight despite a good appetite and will drink a lot. The thyroid gland is a butterfly shaped organ that sits at the base of the neck and is responsible for producing thyroid hormones which help regulate our metabolism. Thyroid disease is common in humans. An estimated 20 million Americans have some form of thyroid illness. While an underactive thyroid is very common in people, especially in women, cats tend to have trouble with an OVER-active thyroid. In addition to the signs above, they may also have vomiting, diarrhea and may even be hyperactive. Unregulated hyperthyroidism can lead to heart disease, blood clots and other organ damage. Hyperthyroidism can be managed in several ways. Diet, medication, surgery and even radioactive iodine can be considered.

Understanding that these diseases can affect our feline friends can help us to better recognize when they are sick. Cats will often hide their illnesses until the disease is very advanced and more difficult to treat. This makes early intervention and lab work essential for successfully treating these conditions to keep our cats happy and healthy and in our lives for as long as possible!

PREPARING YOUR PUPPY FOR HANDLING

Presented by Barbara Sweeney Fassett and Bark Busters Home Dog Training Dutchess County

During your puppy's life, there will be many times when it is necessary for you or someone outside your family to handle him physically in ways that may seem strange to him. As a dog trainer, I am frequently asked for tips to make handling puppies easier. At home, during quiet times, you can help your puppy become more comfortable with being handled in these different ways - and the earlier you start, the more relaxed he will be when these situations actually occur. Veterinarian Examinations Consider what it will be like for your puppy when he meets the veterinarian and try to mimic the examination process. Gently pat your puppy on different areas of his body while he is in a relaxed state. Touch around his eyes and ears, gently hold his feet and toes, lift his lips and touch his teeth, hold your hand against his chest, gently move his legs, etc. Take

your time with this kind of touch, and do it often so that it becomes an agreeable experience for your pup both at home and at the vet. Teach him to sit and lie down while you are examining him; it will make your vets job much easier if your pup is not squirming during his examinations. These days, as a result of Covid19 restrictions, most veterinarian's offices do not allow owners and their pets to enter the building and instead have veterinary office staff meet owners outdoors and the staff member will escort the dogs into the building. But someday, when health-related restrictions are lifted, and we are able to actually enter the vet's office, consider taking your puppy to the vet clinic at times other than for his appointments for vaccinations and check-ups (you may want to call your vets office first to make sure this is OK and find out when they are less busy). Swing by with him

and put him on the scale, then ask the staff if they would like to pet him and/or give him a treat. This way, your puppy will start to associate visiting the vet as a more positive experience. Groomer Visits

Start early with short sessions at home, using a brush well suited to your puppy's type of coat and always brushing the hair in sections and in the direction of the hair growth. Be consistent, make the experience pleasurable and go slowly. Keep some treats in your non-brush hand to distract your puppy. Stop brushing when he seems more concerned with the brush than the treats. Get your puppy used to the feeling of water by placing him in a bathtub or shower with a towel or rubber bath mat so that he doesn't slip. After he seems comfortable, gently turn the water on and dab a little on his back with a washcloth.

Don't rush into using a handheld shower and run the risk of frightening your pup. By taking it slowly he will help him enjoy the grooming experience. Be careful to use shampoos and conditioners that are pet friendly. Don't use shampoos that may strip the natural oils off his coat. Tooth Brushing

Proceed slowly, over the course of days or even weeks. First, apply a little doggie toothpaste on your puppy's toothbrush and place it in his mouth. If he doesn't like the taste try another brand. Next, apply toothpaste on your fingers and explore the inside of his mouth, without actually brushing. When your puppy is comfortable with the above, try lightly brushing his rear teeth, moving forward in his mouth to his front teeth. Trying to use a circular motion, be careful to massage but not scour his gums.

Your puppy may clamp down on the toothbrush, but resist trying to pry his mouth open. Instead, relax your hand. Eventually your puppy will have to change his bite on the toothbrush. With experience you can discern a rhythm in the puppy's oral motions as he opens, licks the brush and clamps down again. When you do, start brushing a few teeth at a time until you are able to apply the paste to all of his teeth. Generally, the enzymes in the toothpaste will do a lot of the scrubbing for you. Nail Clipping

To prepare your puppy for a nail clipping, first let your puppy get used to the smell and sound of nail clippers and have his feet held, gently massage between his toes and nails. To start, just touch the clippers to your puppy's nail to see if he is comfortable with them. This may be enough for his first session. Following the above steps, trim the smallest possible amount

calmness. You may need to distract him by holding a treat tightly in your hand while you clip; reward him with a treat when you are done. For some puppies, asking a friend or family member to hold or distract him may also be beneficial. If you opt to continue with do-it-yourself nail clipping, always make very small clips so as not to cut the nails' "quick" (the area where the nails blood supply begins), which is difficult to see on dark nails. If you feel uncomfortable or unsure at all, stop and take your dog to a professional. Don't try to do all these handling activities in one session or by yourself. If your puppy is uncomfortable, just do one task at a time or ask for help from a trusted professional. Be sure to maintain a light and playful attitude; overly reassuring your puppy during the process may make him think there is a reason for him to become anxious. Respect any growls or defensive body language signs from your puppy, and always start with a call to your veterinarian if you suspect your dog is having an abnormal reaction to a situation that should not be causing him pain. Professional dog training will also help you establish a bond with your puppy as he grows in his trust of you and your relationship. Please know that every puppy has different needs when it comes to physical handling; when in doubt, ask your veterinarian, groomer or trainer for advice or assistance. Also, keep in mind that a tired puppy is more likely to be a wellbehaved puppy. Handling him is

John Jay Homestead offers lecture in honor of Black **History Month**

John Jay Homestead State Historic Site will present a lecture entitled, Slavery and the Jay Family: A Seven-Generation Story on Wednesday, February 24th at 7:00 PM. Founding Father John Jay was descended from three generations of enslavers. Jay himself is something of an enigma: he argued for abolition in the new state of New York as early as 1777 but did not abolish slavery in his own household for another four decades. His descendants include three generations who were abolitionists civil rights activists. and This illustrated program, presented via Zoom, examines the arc of slavery through seven generations of the Jay family. It is a story that goes back to the introduction of slaves into the Dutch colony of New Amsterdam and ends just months before the 13th






