





The Harlem Valley Rail

Trail Association has received a \$125,100 Parks and Trails New York Partnership Grant to boost its outreach and the trail's expansion by hiring a professional marketing, fundraising and communications firm.

I am frequently asked which breed of dog is the most difficult to train and my answer is always the same because the difficulty level is not as much about breed as it is about "fit". Honey bees

It is well known that veterinarians care for many different species of animals. However, you may be surprised to know that they also are involved in the health of honey bees.

Apis mellifera Linnaeus is the scientific name for the Western Honey Bee, commonly known as the European Honey Bee. Interestingly, honey bees are not native to the United States, yet our agricultural economy relies heavily on them. Honey bees were imported to the U.S. in the 17th Century and have been making their mark ever since.

in maintaining the health of honey bees. In 2017, the federal government issued the Veterinary Feed Directive (VFD). This requires that farmers work with a licensed veterinarian when using a VFD medication, such as an antibiotic. Since honey bees are vulnerable to bacterial infections such as American and European foulbrood, fungal infections, viruses, varroa mites, tracheal mites, hive beetles, as well as hornets, ants, and mice, among other pests, veterinarians are necessary to oversee the proper use of antibiotics and other medications. They help identify, treat, and prevent viral, bacterial, and parasitic infections.

Honey bee education is slowly expanding in veterinary medicine. Michigan State has a bee club, Cornell University and U.C. Davis have honey bee health courses, Purdue hosts a workshop on bee medicine, and NC State hosts the Honey Bee Veterinary

Consortium Conference. Veterinarians and beekeepers are not the only ones who can contribute to keeping honey bees safe and healthy. Planting native pollinator friendly flowers such as common yarrow, purple coneflower, black-eyed Susan, and milkweed, among many others, will provide much needed pollen for bees. Reducing or eliminating pesticides will also help keep the bee population safe. Air pollutants can also pose a problem - these can interact with scent molecules released by plants which bees need to locate food, making the bees slower and less efficient. Honey bees are a vital part of our economy and everyone plays a role in helping to keep them healthy.

Love Through Hearing

By Naomi Fata "Being heard is so close to being loved that, for the average person,

they are almost indistinguishable." ~ David Augsburger

As we enter the month of love, approaching the top engagement day of the year – Valentine's Day - have you considered what it looks like to love well? I don't just mean the romantic love of our life, but all the people in your life. According to the quote by David Augsburger loving well means to hear those we love, because listening (and hearing) is an act of love. Have you ever been in a

conversation with someone only to find their attention completely diverted to their cell phone? How does the lack of attention make you feel? In the past few months, I've become even more acutely aware of how much attention these screens are stealing. Often in a restaurant I see all the parties scrolling their phones rather than engaged in conversation. The actions seem to communicate that the person on the other side of the screen is more important than our real-life presence. According to ExplodingTopics. com 47% of Americans admit they are addicted to their phones, the average person checking their phone 352 times per day, with 71% of people spending more time on their phone than with their romantic partner. I am equally guilty of engaging in a distraction on my screen while conversing with family, or friends. But with growing awareness of how inconsiderate it is to those I love. Did you know that God delights to hear you? 



After numerous x-rays it was discovered that Barney was suffering from an advanced stage of osteosarcoma (bone cancer).





The gift giving is a part of Zonta's an annual initiative which has been stepping up to support and care for survivors of domestic violence since the Club was formed in 1984. Fun-




