



Ingredients 2 cups finely chopped broccoli florets 2 tablespoons water 1/2 cup shredded pepperjack cheese 1/4 cup mayonnaise 4 small button mushrooms, sliced 1 teaspoon garlic powder 4 large chicken breasts 1 teaspoon paprika salt and ground black pepper to taste Directions Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C). Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil. Combine broccoli and water in a microwave-safe bowl. Cook in the microwave on high power for 2 minutes. Drain. Combine cooked broccoli, pepperjack cheese, mayonnaise, mushrooms, and garlic powder in a large bowl. Season both sides of each chicken breast with paprika, salt, and pepper. Use a sharp knife to cut a slice through the middle of each breast to create a deep pocket, making sure not to cut all the way through. Evenly stuff each breast with broccoli mixture and place on the prepared baking sheet. Bake in the preheated oven until chicken is no longer pink in the center and juices run clear, about 35 minutes. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read at least 165 degrees F (74 degrees C).



New Pets

A new pet is exciting and can bring joy and comfort to a household. However, it can be overwhelming, depending on your experience and their medical needs. If you are a firsttime pet owner or if it's been a while, you may feel a little lost, especially with puppies and kittens. There are many aspects to caring for your new family member and your veterinarian can help you to understand what's important. Here are some areas to focus on when taking your pet for their check-up. Your veterinarian will want to know what food you are feeding to make sure it meets the requirements for your pet's individual age, breed, lifestyle and medical needs. You can discuss the ins and outs behind all of the diet-fads and find the right choice. A lot of owners ask about supplements and vitamins - most dogs and cats do not require these, but it does depend on the individual case. It is also important to know how to keep your pet from

becoming overweight – or, if you've adopted an overweight pet, your veterinarian can help figure out how to help them lose it. You can also find out what foods and plants might be toxic and what is safe to feed. You'll discuss what vaccinations they've received and if any more are indicated. Often, puppies and kittens will require several more booster vaccines to be completed. There are also other vaccines beyond the "core" ones that may fit in with your pet's lifestyle.

Often, dogs and cats will have had some sort of deworming and/or flea, tick and heartworm preventatives prior to coming to you. You can talk with your veterinarian about why this is important, which ones are safe, effective and fit your pet's environment so that you can continue to keep them protected. Many rescued pets will already

have been spayed or neutered, but in other cases, your dog or cat may still be intact. You will want to discuss the benefits of spaying/neutering and when the best time is for your pet. There are many other preventative

health topics, such as dental care, microchipping, and nail trims. Some rescued pets may come with preexisting conditions that will require continued care after adoption. You will also want to discuss what to do if your pet is having an emergency and how to set up an action plan if your pet needs care while you are away. Some veterinary hospitals have their own emergency department, but you may have to travel to a different hospital.

Aside from the medical aspect, you might need to work on housebreaking, obedience, and behavioral modification. Naturally, a lot of young pets need help to know what acceptable behaviors are, and in some older adopted pets, you may need to work on undesirable behaviors or help them with preexisting anxieties. Depending on the breed of dog or cat, you may need to groom them. You will also need to make sure you have the proper collars, leashes, crates, etc. and that you've effectively puppyor kitten-proofed your house.

Checking in with your veterinarian will allow your pet to establish a relationship with their doctor and will allow you to go over the questions you have. Be sure to bring any records you have of your new pet's previous medical history so your veterinarian has as much information as possible to help you move forward.

Bringing a new pet into your life can be immensely fulfilling and provide much delight, but it can be overwhelming, especially if you haven't had a pet in a long time. And even if you have, puppies and kittens can require a tremendous amount of care when they first come into your home. Thankfully, your veterinarian is there to help and there are many great resources available to assist you.

WATCH FOR SIGNS OF FROSTBITE OR HYPOTHERMIA

Puppies, smaller dogs, older dogs and those with short coats should not be left out doors below 40°F. With proper shelter, other dogs can be safe down to 20°. However, be alert to signs of frostbite or hypothermia. Dogs' ears, paws and tail are especially susceptible. If you suspect frostbite, bring your dog into a warm location and soak the affected area with warm water for about 20 minutes. In the meantime, contact your Continued on page 11



Barkbusters from page 7 veterinarian. Always wipe your dogs' feet after a walk in the snow to remove ice balls and salt deposits from the road. Signs of hypothermia are shivering, lethargy, low heart rate and unresponsiveness. If you notice any of these signs, bring your dog into a warm area, place a light blanket over him, and call your veterinarian. Short hair dogs such as Chihuahuas, greyhounds and even Pit Bulls might need a sweater or other protective gear. Leaving the warm temperature of the house to go outside can result in immediate chilling for these dogs. PROVIDE A PROTECTIVE SHELTER

If your dog stays outside much of the time in the winter, make absolutely certain that the doghouse meets certain minimum criteria. First, it needs to be raised a couple of inches off the frozen ground or concrete. The inside needs to have a blanket, cedar shavings or straw. Add a flap to the door and face the dog house away from the wind and weather. Place the dog house under an overhang or other shelter to keep snow off its roof. The size of the dog house should be large enough so your dog can sit and stand, but small enough so his body heat will be retained in the house. Provide water frequently and in plastic dishes to ensure the dog's tongue

does not get stuck to cold metal. KEEP OLDER, ARTHRITIC DOGS INSIDE

Older, possibly infirm or arthritic dogs should not be left outside under any circumstances! Escort the older dog outside for toileting and use a leash if the ground is covered with ice or snow. Older dogs can easily fall and seriously injured himself. Keep your dog safe! YOUR DOG MAY NEED

SOME ADDED NUTRITION

Dogs will use more calories in the winter if they remain active. This will require the amount of food to be increased by approximately 10%. However, many dogs become less active in the winter because their owners don't walk them as frequently or they are not outside as often. If that is the case, do not increase the amount of food. Like many of us who are less active during the winter, less active dogs may be inclined to add on a few extra pounds during winter months, which should, of course, be avoided. The bottom line is, pay attention to your dog's appetite. If he seems hungrier, give him a little more food. If he is a couch potato in the winter, cut back a bit or give him healthier treats. ELIMINATE THE

POSSIBILITY OF POISONING After a walk, be sure to clean your dog's paws. Salt that is spread on roads and sidewalks can be toxic to pets. Please don't use any products unless the packaging specifies that it is "pet friendly" and be sure to wipe your dog's feet if he has been walking in areas where you don't know what may be on the ground. Many dogs become very sick or even lose their life from drinking antifreeze. Dogs like the sweet taste of antifreeze. When left in the garage, dogs may seek out a plastic antifreeze container that was inadvertently left on the floor and may try to open it. Make certain that all antifreeze containers are well out of reach of your dog. TRAIN YOUR DOG DURING

THE WINTER MONTHS

Dogs that spend less time outside during the winter can become lethargic or, in some cases, may become hyperactive. The best way to keep your dog active or to use his excess energy is to engage him in activities that require him to use his brain and to think. Providing 10 to 15 minutes of daily training on basics such as sit, stay, come, and walking on leash energize the lethargic dog and cause a hyper dog to be more tired out. Providing a few minutes of activity twice a day is even better. Engaging your dog, keeping him active and getting him to use his brain is a

do what it has always needed do-build systems and to enact policies that protect the health of entire communities Atlantic (The 12/16/21). The future behavior of the virus is unknown. We could experience endemics - with the holding of the virus in a tenuous stalemate. But there are other unknowns: If two variants or more end up co-circulating, then what we are seeing now is little league action compared to the major league action of what can happen with multiple variants at the same time. Like the previous variants, Omicron requires individuals to think and act for the collective good, and we have failed at this. We are witnessing defiance (like two-year olds having their temper tantrums) with too many people acting irrationally and stubbornly. We know the measures that work and even our public leaders are in denial. Yet our doctors and nurses are begging us to listen because they have the knowledge. We might want to believe that it will only impact the healthcare workers (and that in itself is a disgrace that many don't care), but this crisis will trickle down

to all of us. "Self-interest is self-defeating, and as long as its hosts ignore that lesson, the virus will keep teaching it." (The Atlantic 12/16/21). Sources


