



Spencertown Academy Arts Center announces a call for submissions to its annual Regional Juried Art Exhibition. This year's theme is "Homes, Hamlets & Villages: Style and Lifestyle in Small Towns and Rural Communities." The guest jurors are Carrie Chen (Carrie Chen Gallery, Great Barrington), Linden Scheff (Carrie Haddad Gallery, Hudson), and Wednesday Nelena Sorokin aka Nelena Soro (artist and instructor at Berkshire Art Center and Springfield Museum). The deadline for submissions is Wednesday, August 16 and the exhibition will run from September October 30 through 29.

"Centuries of settlement in the Hudson Valley (and nearby Berkshire hills) have resulted in a region that is rich in heritage and visual character. 

4th of July Safety Tips for Dogs

Independence Day celebrations can be great fun for humans, but the noise and visual stimulation can be traumatic for a dog. By following a few precautions and being aware of your dog's perceptions of the world, you and your dog can have a safe and happy holiday experience. Following are some Independence Day pointers to protect your dog and keep it safe! If you are going to a fireworks display, leave your dog at home where he will be the most safe and comfortable. If you do bring your dog to an event,

don't leave him in the car. A partially opened window does no supply sufficient fresh air, and it creates an opportunity for your pet to be stolen.

Dogs don't generally like fireworks. The bangs, explosions and bright lights - accompanied by screams, sirens, and other howling dogs – create confusion and fear. It's not uncommon for a dog to run away from home after being frightened by fireworks.

Don't leave your dog outside. Bring your dog inside to protect it. If this is not possible, cover the crate or kennel with a blanket to offer your dog a little protection from the bright flashes and loud bangs. Always remember a dog's sense of hearing is acute - more than 10 times more sensitive than humans'.

Keep your dog away from doors. Your dog may be under significant stress, which could result in unnecessary injury to your dog and/or others or cause your dog to dart out the door and get lost or hit by a car. Create a special area or "den" where your dog feels safe. A properlyintroducedcrateorkennel can be a great den for your dog.

Keepwindowsandcurtainsclosed to reduce noise and bright flashes.

Turn on a TV or radio to distract your dog from loud noises and help it to relax. Choosing soft, comforting music usually works best. Some dogs become destructive when frightened. If you don't use a crate, be sure to remove any items in the room that your dog could destroy or that could hurt him if he chewed them.

Try to stay with your dog during the majority of the fireworks, if possible. A dog often reacts more intensely to loud noises and flashing lights when you are not there.

Always have identification securely on your dog, in case it gets out. Consider talking to your veterinarian about a micro chip that would be injected under your dog's skin to permanently identify him in the even he loses his collar and tags. Consider hiring a pet sitter to stay with your dog while you are away from home. Independence Day is a great time for celebration. By taking some precautions, you and your dog can have a safe and happy holiday experience. And the results? **Happy Dogs = Happy Families**

Seizures in Dogs and Cats

If you have ever witnessed any animal or person having a seizure, it can be very frightening. This article will briefly outline the types of seizures that can affect dogs and cats and how we typically approach diagnosis and treatment. Seizures are caused by excessive electrical activity in the cerebral cortex of the brain. This can result in widespread or focal effects. Generalized seizures involve the entire body. Pets generally will fall over, lose consciousness, and stiffen/contract their bodies. They may also paddle or kick their legs. Focal seizures typically involve only one body part. Pets often don't lose consciousness, but they will have an involuntary behavior (i.e. chewing or holding up a leg). The key here is involuntary – they cannot stop it and owners cannot coax them out of it. Psychomotor seizures result in abnormal behavior (vs. an abnormal movement). The pet could just stare blankly or have an episode of rage where it does not recognize anyone. It is important to note that seizures can be difficult to tell from cardiovascular events/ fainting. In both, animals can involuntarily fall to the ground, stiffen, and urinate/ defecate. Often, seizures will be preceded by an aura (a feeling associated with an impending

seizure) and followed by a postseizure period where the pet is disoriented or even blind. With fainting, they are usually up and normal quite quickly. However, there can be exceptions to both events, so it is not always clear.

Seizures can be caused by genetic predisposition, congenital defects. infections, toxins, tumors, and trauma. The age that a pet first has a seizure can clue us into the possible cause. In pets less than 6 months of age, infection (canine distemper, toxoplasma, neospora) and congenital problems (liver shunts) will fall into this category. Very young pets can have trouble regulating their blood sugar, and low sugar can cause seizures as well. If the pet's age is between 6 months and 6 years, the diagnosis is often primary epilepsy. In pets older than 6 years, tumors of the skull or brain would be the most common cause. If your pet has a seizure, be sure they are in an area that they cannot hurt themselves - away from stairs or a cliff, away from sharp furniture. Do not try to pet them as you could be injured. If you must move them, use a blanket to protect yourself and avoid their face. The next best thing you can do during an event is video record them. If the seizure lasts more than 5 minutes or your pet has

multiple seizures in one day, it is best to take them directly to your veterinarian as some seizures will not stop without medical intervention. Prolonged seizure activity can cause the body temperature to rise dangerously.

Lab work is often performed to try to rule out metabolic and infectious causes of seizures. If infection is suspected, additional specific tests may be performed. The pet's history, age and breed can also help narrow down possible causes. Ultimately, an MRI and spinal tap may be indicated to determine the cause.

Treatment is focused on underlying addressing the cause, if one can be found. Anti-convulsant therapies may be indicated depending on how often seizures are occurring, how long they last, and how violent they are. There are a few different medications and supplements that may help - your veterinarian can discuss each to determine which is best for your pet. Diets with medium chain fatty acids as the fat source will have anti-seizure effects as well, so that should be a component of your pet's treatment.

Observing a pet having a seizure can be frightening. If this occurs, your veterinarian can help by providing diagnostic treatment options. and

Bonding With Our Father

One of my best friends adopted two small children from Ethiopia about ten years ago. Before the adoption she and her husband knew that frequently orphaned children have a challenging time attaching to adoptive parents. In part this is because they have not had two main caregivers; they have had many. Up until now, the children had not had parents to whom they belonged, so they viewed everyone as a potential "caregiver". After the children arrived, they frequently practiced babywearing, to help the children bond. That first year was primarily dedicated to forming that secure attachment. Last month I wrote on how our

attachment to our earthly fathers relates to our view of God. Much like children who have been adopted, we must learn this form of attachment to God. After all the Bible so frequently references our adoption into his family. Look at Romans 8: 15 "You received God's spirit when He adopted you as His own children."

Thinking of the practice of baby wearing to form that bond between parent and child, it is something that takes time. Time for the relationship to grow and attach. Within our culture, both secular and religious, there is a strong emphasis on accomplishment, productivity, and instant gratification.

However, growing in trust, forming bonds, and building relationship (both with God and with others) is a longterm investment that doesn't always have visible rewards. "Doing" often takes precedence over "being". Perhaps even in terms of "doing" for God, versus "being" with God. I wonder if perhaps too often the next steps of faith are focused so heavily on learning doctrine and the moral way to live according to the Bible, with very little emphasis on truly bonding to God as our Father who loves us. One of the very first steps to forming this

bond is beginning to know from our hearts, not just our heads how much God wants to know us. We are the apple of His eye, created in His image. Just like parents are overjoyed when their adult children want to spend time with them, God is overjoyed when we truly enjoy being with Him.

One of the biggest challenges to being authentically in the presence of God, is ourselves. Think of Adam and Eve in the garden, after they had sinned, they felt shame and hid from God. In shame we often hide from our relationship with Him.

Sit with Him, let Him wash the shame away. Find identity in being called His child, through the miracle of adoption.

dishes and fresh prepared culinary counterpoints. The flavorful spices and sauces of Indian fare are also something that must be experienced. Mohammed and his nephew Muhfuz say that customers definitelytendtodevelopfavorites.

"So people mostly like the Chicken Tikka Masala," says Muhfuz. "And Chicken Korma is a very popular one, everybody likes it. It's very, very sweet. People like sweet, you know, we make it sweet. If people like spicy, we make it spicy. But it's so delicious, there is coconut, almonds. So sweet."

Mohammed adds, "Some people say 'we don't like spicy'. We have the mild food too. We have mild and hot, whatever they want, we can make it."

Lamb, known as an especially healthful meat choice, makes another appearance as a central ingredient of a Lamb Mushroom Curry. Shrimp lovers will enjoy the Shrimp Biryani, which contains coconut milk and rice. And lentils, a staple of near eastern and mediterranean cuisines, is featured in dishes like Lentil Dahl, which is renowned as a healthful curry based soup.

There are other vegetarian entrees as well, such as Alu Motor Gobi (fresh cauliflower, potato and peas cooked with onion, tomato and herbs), Chana Shag (spinach and chickpeas) and a mixed vegetable curry.

House specialties include a wide selection of Indian Breads that are baked fresh to order. Garlic Nan is always a favorite, but there are also Paratha and Poori styles. And as the Red Hook Curry House menu says, "An Indian meal without breads is not complete."

Their appetizers will also not disappoint. Choose from meat or vegetable Samosas, Bhujia (onion fritters), Kebabs, Papadum (spiced lentil wafers), to name a few, or try an assortment from one of their popular mixed platters.

Diners can opt to start a meal with Chicken, Vegetable, Coconut or Mulligatawny soup.

Mohammed says steaming pots of Indian Chai, made from a traditional family recipe, are popular no matter the weather or time of year.

Guests with special dietary concerns such as allergies can be accommodated, by letting their server know about any requirements or Mohammed says preferences. they avoid using cashews in their dishes, due to many people having a cashew allergy.

One of the great things about Red Hook Curry House is that Maksuda is always creative in the kitchen, making sure

the restaurant menu changes things up frequently so those dining "don't get bored, but can always find favorites." Be sure to ask about the chef specials that are not on the regular menu. These can include Tamarind Chicken, Malai Kebab, Salmon Curry, and seasonal culinary surprises. Another standout feature of Indian cuisine is that with the emphasis vegetables, intriguing on sauces and surprising spices, there's also less fat than many American restaurant go-to's.

Mohammed shares that "Indian food is a popular food, because people who try it are sometimes more used to eating hamburgers, or something like that. And that is very fatty food. There are many Indian dishes that don't have that kind of fat."

Of course, good health doesn't prohibit splurging now and then. And the desserts at Red Hook Curry House are worth the cheat.

Options include Rasmalai (homemade cheese with sweet cream), Glob Jaman (fried saffron rice-ball in syrup), Rice Pudding and Malai Kulfi (pistachio pudding cake). And then there's always of Mohammed's one favorites: Mango Ice Cream. The People Are What Make It Special Mohammed says the part of the business he enjoys the most is

meetingthe"verynicecustomers."



Inaugural Class of CMH Nurse Residency Program Celebrates Graduation

Program Prepares New Nurses to Provide Bedside Care and Lead Rewarding Careers

Columbia Memorial Health (CMH) today announced the graduation of 10 nurses from CMH's inaugural Nurse Residency training program. A study published by the Institute of Medicine entitled *The Future* of Nursing: Leading Change, Advancing Health concluded: "Learning experiences that build professional relationships, incorporate strong support from preceptors, mentors, and nursing leadership, provide respect, and build confidence, are all linked to positive perceptions of job satisfaction and are integral components of a healthy work environment which has been identified as a predictor of improved nursing retention."

CMH President and CEO Dorothy Urschel said: "The combination of an aging population and a considerable national workforce shortage has placed a great deal of burden on our nurses, especially those who have just started their careers. We developed this program to better prepare our nurses to succeed clinically and professionally, and to respond to the needs of our nurses and nurse candidates to help them lead rewarding and fulfilling careers as caregivers." The next class of new nurses will begin training in July, with subsequent classes every six





Red Hook's Memorial Park is Garden of the Month

How did Red Hook's Memorial Park come to be? In 1942 Oakleigh Cookingham donated a long narrow strip of land to the Village of Red Hook. It sits close to downtown. The community came together and decided the best use of this park would be create a memorial for Veterans of Foreign Wars and to those who had made the ultimate sacrifice for their country. Harold Fell and his wife volunteered to search the cemeteries that served the Red Hook area to determine who had served in a foreign war and who had died serving overseas. Next came planning the monuments

and garden that would honor these veterans. The first monument was wooden and began to deteriorate. Stone monuments were designed to replace the original wooden monument. Today there are stone monuments to honor those who served in each of the wars from WWI through Vietnam and for those who died during those wars.

There is a long brick path between two rows of monuments that bear the names of community members who wish to honor or remember family members and friends. Each brick is a \$100.00 donation. The funds from the brick donations will be used to create stone monuments to honor those veterans who served in the Desert Storm, Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts. There are bricks still available and may be obtained through Red Hook VFW Post 7765, 30 Elizabeth Street,



Red Hook, NY 12571, 845www.vfw7765.org. 758-6212, VFW members have volunteered to create the garden that surrounds the monuments.

There are granite posts with a chain linking the posts that are placed a distance away from the first row of monuments. Lavender and yellow day lilies have been planted all along this chain which gives it a soft welcoming look. The distance between the lavender plants and the large monuments has created a space that creates a feel of reverence. During Memorial Day services this open space is used for placing wreaths and 31 American flags in remembrance of those who have died in foreign wars. Next to the first row of monuments there are perennials and annuals that give a splash of color. Along the

brick path more colorful flowers compliment the stone monuments.

Everyone is encouraged to visit this Memorial Park to see how many wonderful details have been placed among the monuments and flowers. There are benches, stone pavers for each branch of the military, flags on

tall poles and other details that depict the pride and reverence of the community for those who have served and died in Foreign Wars. This beautifully planned and executed garden has been honored as Garden of the Month for June 2023 by Old Dutch Village Garden Club. Nancy Bendiner, Bill Moore, Claudine Klose and the archives of Historic Red Hook provided the history behind the Memorial Park.




