Sonny Landreth (Friday, 19): Α slide guitar virtuoso, Landreth has been acclaimed listeners and fellow professionals alike. Landreth apprenticed with zydeco king Clifton Chenier's

Eric Clapton says, "Sonny Landreth is probably the most underestimated musician on the planet, and also probably one of the most advanced."

Landreth's innovative guitar techniques have opened doors to new sonic textures and a complex

tonal vocabulary, all bound by the bayou rhythms of his longtime bandmates. His expressive, ethereal guitar work can be heard on hundreds of recordings from artists ranging from John Mayall to John Hiatt.

"All told, the different elements of this project came together and I'm really happy about it," Landreth says. "Blacktop Run is probably the most eclectic recording I've done. And sonically, I think this is the best album we've ever made."

Matt Schofield (Friday, Aug 16): Matt Schofield, a Britishborn musician currently living in the US, is always pushing the envelope and changing the British

Blues heritage. After more than 30 years of touring and 20 years into his solo career, Schofield—a multi-award-winning guitarist, vocalist, composer, producer, and band leader—has left no doubt about his status as one of the most significant and unique guitarists of his age.

His legendary career has taken him and his band to almost countries worldwide. Acclaim from the industry and critics alike follows; he is the first guitarist inducted into the "British Blues Awards Hall of Fame" and has won three times as "British Blues Guitarist of the Year" and "British Blues Album

Classes are designed to teach the basics of Embroidery, Landscape Painting, Shibori Dyeing and Visual Journals through Collage as well as providing guidance on the use of the tools and materials.

The series launched in June with a beginning Embroidery class taught by Chloe Whittaker. A second Embroidery Class will be held on July 20th at 10:30 AM. Learn the art of decorating fabric using a needle and

thread. Embroidery hoops are a fantastic and traditional way to learn basic embroidery skills. Participants will master several essential stitches and complete an embroidery hoop which they can then display in their home. All materials will be provided. Suitable for older teens to adults. Class size is very limited, registration strongly recommended.

On August 3, and August 10th at 10:30 AM artist Liz Albino will lead workshops Landscape **Basic** Painting. Students will explore basic landscape painting and composition emphasizing foreground, middle ground, and

background. Materials will be provided. Suitable for ages 10 to adults, no prior art experience is necessary. This is a singular class, participants are asked to choose either the August 3rd date or the August 10th date. Registration strongly recommended.

On August 17th at 10:30 AM artist and author Diana Rupp will teach a Shibori Dyeing workshop. This class focuses on the Japanese resist-dyeing technique that involves twisting cloth and binding it to create a vast array of patterns on fabric All art materials will be provided. Class size is limited, registration recommended.

In October, (dates TBD), artist David Dew Bruner will teach a workshop on the Visual Journal through Collage. Through the art of collage and mixed participants explore how to create a visual diary. No prior art experience **Participants** necessary. are encouraged to bring old magazines, books and fabric to use in class. Some materials will be provided. This class is suitable for adults 18 and over.

Arthritis in Cats

Last month's article discussed osteoarthritis in dogs. It is important that cats are discussed separately, not because their arthritis is much different, but because their signs can be different and the treatment options are bit more limited. As with dogs, arthritis is a degenerative condition of the joints. It is chronic, progressive, and can affect any joint space, including the cartilage, joint capsule and associated bones. In cats, it typically affects the spine, elbow, hips and knees. Arthritis can be primary – associated with aging and "wear and tear", or secondary - the consequence of some initiating factor such as a trauma or a congenital malformation such as hip dysplasia. Primary arthritis is more commonly diagnosed in cats, whereas secondary arthritis is more commonly diagnosed in dogs. Cats are very good at hiding their pain, making arthritis a drastically underdiagnosed

condition. There are signs at

home that can indicate there

may be a problem. Cats may no

longer jump or seek out higher

locations. They may avoid the

litter box, especially if it's in

a "far away" location such as

down in the basement – or if the

sides of the box are relatively

high requiring them to take big steps to get in/out. They may also have a personality change they could be more withdrawn/ less social or start growling/ biting/scratching more. Cats who stop grooming (greasy coats, matted fur, dirty back ends) may have arthritis as the cause as they cannot contort their bodies to reach their entire coats.

A diagnosis can often be made on physical exam by palpating thickened joints, decreased range of motion, muscle loss, and sometimes painful reactions. However, radiographs are also very helpful. They can uncover more cases and assess the severity of arthritis. Studies have found that 90% of cats over 12 years old had radiographic evidence of arthritis, whether or not they had signs noted at home or on exam.

There are options to help discomfort, the progression, and improve overall quality of life. A big help is weight management as overweight cats are more prone to arthritis due to the added pressure on their joints and less active lifestyle. Supplements aimed to protect the joint cartilage are not always as effective as we'd like them to be and the efficacy studies are lacking, however some owners report improvement on supplements that contain glucosamine and chondroitin or polysulfated

glycosaminoglycans. Omega 3 fatty acids (mainly EPA and DHA) are helpful as they reduce pro-inflammatory Just as with dogs, flaxseed oil containing alpha-linolenic-acid, is not helpful. Humans are able to convert ALA to DHA and EPA, however cats are not able to perform this conversion, making flaxseed an ineffective source.

A difference between dogs and cats is the use of nonsteroidal anti-inflammatorties (NSAIDs). These are used often in dogs to provide anti-inflammatory and pain relieving effects. However, these are not as well tolerated in cats. There are few NSAIDs approved for use in cats and only one licensed for long term use outside of the United States. Using NSAIDs in cats is not completely off the table, but it must be approached cautiously with serious discussion with your veterinarian first. Corticosteroids are also controversial for treating arthritis, as they haven't been shown to relieve pain in cats. Because of the limited availability of using NSAIDs and steroids, pain medications (analgesics) are commonly used. There are several analgesics that can be considered, both oral and injectable.

Modifying the home by using ramps/steps, moving the litter box and providing one with lower sides or an opening to walk in, and offering soft bedding in multiple locations may also help. In dogs, physical therapy (including LASER and acupuncture) and surgical techniques are relatively common, but in cats these areas are just beginning to be explored. Our pets cannot verbally tell us that they are not well, so it is up to us to look for cues and have them evaluated at least annually. If arthritis is suspected, it should be addressed as soon as possible – the earlier the above treatments and modifications are implemented, the more rewarding the results. Every kitty is unique, and their treatment plan should be tailored to them.

SUMMER SAFETY **TIPS FOR YOUR DOGS**

For all of us living in the Mid-Hudson Valley, we are aware that the months of July and August can be "dog days"; days that characterized by high temperatures, humidity frequent thunderstorms. arrival of summer also means that as temperatures rise, we flock to the outside to soak up the warm weather, and of course, we take our dogs along with us because, who does not love being outside in summer? However, you and I can voice when we get too hot and can find ways to cool ourselves down. Our pets cannot. Below are some important reminders about your dog in the summertime heat and how to keep them cool and comfortable. Tis the season for sunscreen

Did you know that dogs with light colored coats can get sunburned? Believe it or not, it's true! Dogs can also suffer from sunburn and skin cancer, so ask your veterinarian about a pet safe sunblock, preferably one that they cannot lick off. Ouch! Pavement is HOT!

Because we wear shoes, we likely do not notice how hot asphalt or concrete can get in the heat. During summer months, protect your dog's paws by walking on dirt or grass and sticking to early morning or late evening walks. To cool themselves down, a dog relies on the sweat glands in his or her paw pads, and if the ground they are working on is too hot, they won't be able to get the relief they need. A good test is to place your hands on the asphalt and if it feels hot to your touch is likely too hot for your dog's paws. Please don't leave me!

It's perfectly natural to want to take your dog along for a car ride while you take care of a few quick errands. However, what many do not know is that your car's interior temperature is significantly higher than the outside temperature. So, while you're walking through the parking lot in 75° temperatures, inside your car, where you left your furry friend, it's a sweltering 118°! Even if you crack your windows, your vehicle will quickly become an oven, and your pet will be in unsafe temperatures. It only takes 15 minutes in extreme heat for your dog to suffer brain and organ damage. While we understand the urge to bring your pet along for the ride, please do not leave your pets alone in the car for any amount of time!

To cut or not to cut? Ask your vet or groomer if a haircut will help your dog stay cool this summer. For some breeds, a long coat is a dog's best defense against getting sunburned and protecting them from skin



Additionally, a long coat can keep your pet warmer in the winter and provide insulation in the summer depending on the breed. So be sure to check with the professionals before you give your dog a summer cut that may end up putting them more at risk.

Water, water, water! Keep cool, fresh water available to your dog at all times. If your dog stays outside during the day, leave water in a shady area, in a non-metal bowl as those can heat up the water quicker. If you're going out for a run or traveling with your dog, bring extra water for him to drink. Dogs can experience the symptoms of heatstroke in a short amount of time, so it's always a good idea to be a step ahead and do what you can do to prevent it from happening. Pool safety!

God's Corner

Creating Margin

By Naomi Fata

In sewing, you never want to sew too close to the edge of the fabric. If you do, a little wear and tear will cause the seams to come apart. It makes for an unstable garment, pillow, quilt, or slipcover. This is called seam allowance. For example, manufactured sewing patterns have a standard seam allowance of 5/8th inch, intending for the needle to be stitching 5/8th from the edge of the fabric. A common mistake among my novice students is to drift close to the edge of the fabric as they progress down the seam.

Seam allowance is like margin. Too little and the unraveling will begin. The goal of sewing is to connect pieces of fabric securely together—the goal of faith is to form a secure attachment to the father. This brings peace. Textiles fall apart without enough seam allowance. Without margin, you don't have the time or space to care for your own soul, which is your connection to God, to yourself, and to others.

In life, you may start off with good intentions of what your priorities are and even a plan for how to keep those. But as opportunities arise and life happens, your attention can quickly get diverted. Before you realize it, you lose margin.

The words of Psalm 37: 3-5 can be foundational for the beginning of forming margin. "Trust in the Lord and do good; dwell in the land and enjoy safe pasture. 4 Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart. 5 Commit your way to the Lord trust in him and he will do this:"

When your delight is in a relationship with Your Father, rather than in the busyness of activities, we can learn to set boundaries, say no, and live purposefully. Identity doesn't come from the external activities, but from an internal connection with God.

Sewing a straight line with enough seam allowance takes focus, maintaining margin in your life also requires diligent attention. Take the time to think about who you want to be, what you envision for your relationships (both with God and others) and build time and space around these things. Often summer can give you the opportunity to pause from other commitments and give you the space to consider your responsibilities.

Pray: Lord, I want to have more margin in my life, but sometimes I just don't know where to begin. Please grant me the wisdom and strength to know where to implement margin. Amen.

Italian Sausage-Stuffed Zucchini

Ingredients

6 medium zucchini (about 8 ounces each)

pound Italian turkey sausage links, casings removed

2 medium tomatoes, seeded and chopped

1 cup panko bread crumbs 1/3 cup grated Parmesan cheese

1/3 cup minced fresh parsley

2 tablespoons minced fresh oregano or 2 teaspoons dried oregano 2 tablespoons minced fresh basil or 2 teaspoons dried basil

1/4 teaspoon pepper

3/4 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese Additional minced fresh parsley, optional

Directions

Preheat oven to 350°. Cut each zucchini lengthwise in half. Scoop out flesh, leaving a 1/4-in. shell; chop flesh. Place zucchini shells in a large microwave-safe dish. In batches, microwave, covered, on high 2-3 minutes or until crisp-tender.

In a large skillet, cook sausage and zucchini flesh over medium heat 6-8 minutes or until sausage is no longer pink, breaking sausage into crumbles; drain. Stir in tomatoes, bread crumbs, Parmesan cheese, herbs and pepper. Spoon into zucchini shells. Place in 2 ungreased 13x9-in. baking dishes. Bake, covered, 15-20 minutes or until zucchini is tender. Sprinkle with mozzarella

cheese. Bake, uncovered, 5-8 minutes longer or until cheese is melted. If desired, sprinkle with additional minced parsley.

June 2024 Commercial Garden of the Month

by Linda Glowienka

Every month in the summer, the Old Dutch Village Garden Club (ODVGC) highlights outstanding gardens in Red Hook. This year, the Garden of the Month for June is the Red Hook branch of the Rhinebeck Bank, at the corner of Route 9/South Broadway and MM Ham Memorial Firehouse Lane. This beautifully designed columned red brick building sits on a diagonal on about an acre







of land. Entry is from either street, so that you get varying views of its lovely gardens.

The perimeter borders are deep and architectural. Evergreens and tall flowering bushes lean from the building, providing a 'garden wall' against the bank. The next level of the garden is formed by mid-sized clusters of daisies, allium, various lilies, and native grasses. Lastly, in the front of the border are low-growing plants - monkey grass and a variegated ivy with tall wispy flowers like Queen Anne's Lace that add a third dimension to the ground cover.

In addition to the building's border gardens, there are a number of outlying 'little' beds in different shapes and sizes, giving an appealing structural impression to the otherwise flat lawn areas. Adding to the ecological pluses,

there is a variety of pollinator Continued on page 14



to reduce air conditioning costs and shield interior furnishings from the sun's harsh glare may want to consider adding awnings.

"The sun's rays through glass are responsible for almost 20% of the load on your air conditioner," says Michelle Sahlin, managing director of PAMA on their website. "Awnings reduce direct solar gain through windows."

The American Society of Heating and Air Conditioning Engineersrecommends homeowners use "optimized and/ or moveable external shading devices, such as overhangs, awnings, and side fins" to minimize a building's heat load. A fabric awning reduces heat gain by 55% to 65% during those hours when the sun shines directly on southern-facing windows or glass doors. That



figure jumps to between 72% and 77% for western exposures.

These organizations take their science very seriously. Another study, entitled, Outdoor Thermal Comfort Improvement with Advanced Solar Awnings: A Subjective and Objective Survey - by the Building and Environment periodical (May 2022) reviews the psychological advantage of awnings.

late 1800's and has grown and changed with the times. "Who would have predicted that awnings can now be made from woven acrylic vs. sail cloth canvas and controlled by motion sensors!"

On another note, Sausbier's can provide service for your fire extinguishers and fire suppression systems. The investment in the fire extinguisher/fire suppression business was originally for off
