on Sunday morning to feed the kids. "The students change into comfortable clothes, swim in the college pool, play basketball and volleyball and have lots of fun."



ones". Yet another possibility is that the month was named after Lucius Junius Brutus, the founder of the Roman Republic. June was called sera monath by Anglo-Saxons,

translated into "dry month". June used to be the fourth month in the year. Before Julius Caesar came to power, the calendar year only had 10

months. In 46 BC he created the Julian calendar by adding two more months to the year, which made June the sixth month.

No other month in the year begins on the same day of the week as June.

June has both the longest and the shortest days of the year, depending on where you're standing! If you live in the northern hemisphere, then June 21^{st} is the longest day of the year. If you live in the southern hemisphere, then the 21st is the shortest day of the year.

The first day of summer in the northern hemisphere is June 21st.

Beat the Heat and Be Mindful

Bites and Stings

By Julianne Porter, DVM Most of us know that when the warmer weather approaches, it means contending with fleas, ticks, and mosquitoes. We have a lot of options to help protect our pets from these critters, but there are other things that bite and sting to be aware of. In our area, this mainly refers to wasps, bees, ants, and flies. Pets who encounter these insects may develop a swollen face, swollen eyes, and hives after a sting. You may or may not witness the sting – many times we don't realize anything is wrong until our dog comes up to us with a puffy face! Flies and ants can cause red spots to appear on the skin, which sometimes can cause the pets to be itchy. We mostly notice this on their bellies and inside of their legs as those locations are where they bite and where the fur is thin.

Many times, antihistamines are enough to resolve the issue and provide comfort. If your pet is in discomfort, there are other medication options to consider. If you can locate a stinger, gently remove it and use a baking soda paste as long as the pet cannot lick the area. Your veterinarian can help you find the best treatment course. Most pets will be back to normal within 2 days.

The Northeast does not see many venomous spiders, snakes, or ants, but they do exist in different geographic areas of our country. Fire ants are mainly in the warmer climates and can be extremely aggressive. Their bites can cause red bumps that can turn into pustules. If your pet encounters fire ants, gently brush the ants off (wearing gloves) and use a cool compress to soothe the affected area. Call your veterinarian to discuss the appropriate treatments as these bites can be very painful and become infected. Out of the 17 species of snakes in New York, only 3 are venomous and are relatively uncommon. While venomous snake bites will require immediate veterinary attention, bites from most of the snakes in our area will only cause local irritation and infection. However, it is always good to check with your veterinarian. Thankfully, most snakes will try to avoid us and our pets and only bite as the last resort. Similarly, the spiders our pets encounter will typically only cause local inflammation and nothing more serious.

Just as with people, there are rare occasions when a more severe reaction or even anaphylactic reaction can occur. If you notice any vomiting, diarrhea, weakness, or trouble breathing, please seek immediate veterinary care. Most of the time this will occur quickly after the bite or sting.

While most bites and stings our pets encounter will cause minimal inconvenience, it is good to know how to approach these situations and when to seek veterinary care.

Summer is finally in view and with that comes vacations, picnics and barbeques and lots of outdoor activities. My Dakota loves all of the outdoor fun and any opportunity she can find to be wet. For me that means that my best way to keep her entertained and comfortable when we are outside is to either invite her into our pool or fill her toddler-size wading pool with water and a few toys. She is pretty good at entertaining herself given those resources. Without clean water and some toys, Dakota is very likely to wander off to the pond on our property for a quick dip to cool off in what I consider to be less than desirable water. While the pond is an ideal breeding ground for the tree frogs, and provides shelter for an occasional family of ducks, it is not the place that I want Dakota to swim. "Waterproof" Your

For those dogs that enjoy a swim there are a few things to keep in mind: If your dog has had a dip in a lake

or river, rinse her off to avoid ear mites, eye infections and pesky clingy insects which can embed themselves into her fur.

If your dog loves to jump into your swimming pool, make sure she knows how to get out safely. When a dog falls into a lake or river, her instinct tells her to turnaround and get out from the point at which she fell in. However in a swimming pool, a dog may drown if she follows this instinctive action. Therefore, teach your dog where and how to get out of the pool regardless of where she went in. Not all dogs like or know

how to swim. If your dog





When people think of faith in Christ, they automatically think of church attendance. After all we think of churches as a place to worship God and to learn more about Him.

Within the walls of church, it is possible that "faith becomes doing just because that is what has

always been done, not because of a deep heart compulsion to do so." (Beyond Head Knowledge, 75) Church attendance is good, but God is more concerned about your heart relationship with Him than He is with the number of times you sit in church this year.

Religion itself has a way of making one feel compelled to live by a set of rules. In the Old Testament God gave the Israelites a set of 10 commandments to live by. These rules are good, but they are not a means of earning salvation or favor with God. In the Bible Jesus chastised the Pharisees (a group of Jewish religious leaders) for the trying to live according to the letter of the law rather than believing in Christ.

In John 5, there was a man who had been crippled for 38 years. Jesus healed this man on the Sabbath. The religious people were offended because Jesus broke the Sabbath (which is one of the 10 commandments) by healing on the Sabbath. Rather than being in awe of the power of God, which worked through Jesus to heal the sick, they were caught up in the fact that Jesus broke the law.

Which bring us back to the question, "why do you attend church?" Paul encourages us to not neglect meeting together (Hebrews 10:25). Church is a means by which Christians meet, but it can't take the place of knowing Christ for yourself. Doing the Christian thing of going to church could lead to a culture of Christianity without belief from the heart. It is good to do the right thing and to believe with your heart. But before you focus on the outward acts of faith be like the Psalmist David who wrote "as the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, O God." (Psalm 42:1)

Seek Him because you want to know Him. If you attend church and read the Bible, attend, and read with an attitude of seeking God, rather than the perspective of trying to attain holiness by your actions.

Best known as the man who secretly rigged a wire between the towers of the World Trade Center, Philippe Petit has performed on the high wire at majestic sites all over the world, including Notre Dame, the Eiffel Tower, the Sydney Harbour Bridge, Lincoln Center and Grand Central Station. He personally rigs every wire on which he walks and has thus become a self-taught engineer and master rigger. His life depends on knots. In this hands-on workshop, Philippe will share a selection of loops, bends, hitches, binding knots and termination knots you probably don't know you cannot live without. Philippe shows knots in action. He gives each participant a yard of cord, which everyone ties, and everyone succeeds. Because Philippe's methods are original and based on mnemonics, they are simple to learn and unforgettable. Students will learn vicious knots that will never come undone. For example, shoelace knot that will never loosen, improvised handcuffs, and how to secure your drooling camel to a palm tree and yet in half a second be able to flee an attacking caravan. The Hudson Area Library History Room in collaboration with the Jacob Leisler Institute for the Study of Early New York History presents The Persistence of Indigenous Enslavement in Dutch and English New York and New Jersey, a talk by Linford Fisher on Thursday, June 9, 6-7:30pm.

important roles in the histories of Dutch colonialism and the colonies that later became New York and New Jersey. This public talk delves into one aspect of these histories and interactions, namely, the enslavement (and, at times, transshipment) of local Indigenous populations. Drawing upon colonial records and newspaper ads, Fisher argues that enslaved Indigenous people were present in these places far longer than we might expect and in ways that suggest a more diverse enslaved and unfree labor force than we previously imagined.

is the Principal Investigator of a digital project titled Stolen

Relations: Recovering Stories of Indigenous Enslavement in the Americas, which is a communitycentered, collaborative project that seeks to broaden our understanding of Indigenous experiences of settler colonialism and its legacies through the lens of slavery and servitude. Fisher is the author of more than a dozen articles, book chapters, and essays on a diverse array of topics. He is currently finishing a book-length project, tentatively titled America Enslaved: Native Slavery in the English Caribbean and the United States, on Native American enslavement in English colonies in North America and the Caribbean and, later, in the United States, between Columbus and the American Civil War.



Teriyaki Shish Kabobs

Ingredients

1 cup sugar

1 cup reduced-sodium soy sauce

1 cup ketchup

2 teaspoons garlic powder

2 teaspoons ground ginger

2 pounds beef top sirloin steak, cut into 1-1/2-inch cubes

2 to 3 small zucchini, cut into 1-inch slices

1/2 pound medium fresh mushrooms

1 large green or sweet red pepper, cut into 1-inch pieces

1 small onion, cut into 1-inch pieces

2 cups cubed fresh pineapple

Directions

For marinade, mix first 5 ingredients. In a large bowl or shallow dish, add half the marinade and the beef; turn to coat. Cover and reserve remaining marinade. Cover and refrigerate beef and marinade over-

On metal or soaked wooden skewers, thread vegetables and, on separate skewers, thread beef with pineapple. Discard remaining marinade from beef bowl. Grill kabobs, covered, over medium heat until vegetables are tender and beef reaches desired doneness, 12-15 minutes, turning occasionally.

In a small saucepan, bring reserved marinade to a boil, stirring occasionally; cook 1 minute. Remove vegetables, pineapple and beef from skewers before serving. Serve with sauce.

a parked car, dogs can suffer brain and organ damage in as little as 15 minutes. Remember that your light colored dog's coat can invite damage from the sun's ultraviolet rays, leading to sunburn and possible skin cancer. If your dog is lightcolored and/or she lacks black pigment around the eyes, ears and nose, keep her out of the bright sun. Talk to your veterinarian about sunblock for your dog preferably in the formula she can't lick off.

Dogs should always have access to cool shade and fresh water in the summer heat.

Rules of the Road

I like to take an occasional road trip with my dog and Dakota travels well. She generally lays quietly on the backseat of the car. She does not sit in the front passenger seat nor do I allow her to stand between the two front seats with her feet on the center console. She wears a harness that is designed specifically for the car that is padded and secured to the seat belt in the back. It provides protection for her in the

event of an accident, prevents her from becoming a projectile in the car or from her leaving the car if a door were to open unexpectedly.

An alternative to securing her in the backseat would be to install a pet barrier to keep her in the back of the vehicle. A barrier, however, would not prevent her from jumping out of the vehicle if a door opened or glass shattered.

Allowing your dog to hang it's head out of the window is not safe. Imagine for a minute what might happen if your dog were hit in the eye by an insect when your vehicle is travelling at 40 or 50 mph! If you must transport your dog in the bed of the pick up, be sure she is contained and safe, preferably in a crate or carrier secured to the truck. An unrestrained dog in the vehicle is dangerous to everyone in the car including the dog herself.

As thunderstorm season creeps up on us, we want help dog owners know how to manage their dog's fear of the booming thunder. Thunderstorms are a common fear in dogs, causing many to panic and run away, become destructive, or even hurt themselves. Dogs can sense that a storm is on the way, and they often begin to show signs of anxiety even before the storm can be heard. While cause thunderstorms may panic, dogs can be trained to manage their reactions and feel calmer through all the noise and bright flashes.

The following tips can help you and your dog manage reactions to help relax

during storms, fireworks or other loud disturbances that may be frightening to him.

Always keep proper identification securely fastened to your dog's collar in case he gets out. Talk to your veterinarian about implanting a universal microchip in your pet for lifelong identification. Remember to update your veterinary clinic and animal shelter with your correct contact information.

Give your dog a safe place to stay during storms. Inside your home, create a quiet den-like area where your dog can feel secure. A properly introduced crate or kennel can be a calming refuge for him. When a storm is brewing, lead your dog to his special place to help him feel calm and protected. If your dog lives outside, cover his doghouse or dog run with a blanket to shield him from the bursts of lightning. Outside dogs can get lost or even injured if they escape their fenced yards in fear during storms.

Dogs can pick up fear or discomfort with storms from their family pack members, so it is important that you develop a calm, matter-of-fact attitude. Let your dog stay close and try to distract him with activities like play or brushing. Do not try to reassure him in a sympathetic voice—this will sound like praise and may increase his nervousness and confusion.

Some dogs become destructive when frightened. A crate is always the best way to keep your dog safe

and your belongings intact. If you don't use a crate, remove any items in the room your dog could destroy or could hurt him if he chewed them.

During a storm, keep windows and curtains closed to reduce noise and bright flashes. Turn on a TV or radio playing soft music at normal volume to distract your dog and help him to relax.


Keep your dog away from doors that lead outside. Your dog may be under significant stress, which could result in unnecessary injury to others entering your home or cause him to dart outside and get lost or injured.

Your dog may become incontinent due to his extreme fear and the rush of adrenaline he experiences during a storm. Be prepared for this, and don't react if it occurs.

Dogs that continue to panic in thunderstorms may have to be reconditioned by creating artificial storm with environmental recordings. While reconditioning can be a time-consuming procedure, it can have a high success rate. A qualified Bark Busters dog behavioral therapist can help your dog be calmer during storms.

In the most extreme cases, medication in conjunction with training may be the best solution to help your dog cope with his fear of storms. Consult with your veterinarian about possible treatments.

"On this guided walk, you'll be able to imagine what it would be like to be a guest of Ruth Livingston Mills for one of her very exclusive parties at Staatsburgh," says site educator, Don Fraser: "On a beautiful afternoon, you might stroll along the Hudson, or sail the river on the Mills' yacht, or take a carriage drive. The grounds would present you with stunning vistas and lovely gardens, but tucked out of view, the estate staff would be shoveling coal, laundering piles of cloths and linens, or tending to animals, and all that would be invisible to you."

The tour will be about one mile of mostly level terrain, with some uphill walking. The program, including the walk, discussion, and looking at historic photos, will take about 1½ hours. Visitors may also enjoy strolling the grounds of the site, picnicking by the Hudson River or hiking the woodland trails in adjacent Mills and Norrie State Parks.

Staatsburgh was the autumn home of Ruth Livingston Mills, a prominent figure in New York Society, and her husband, industrialist and philanthropist The mansion Ogden Mills. was redesigned by the famous architect Stanford White in 1895 and decorated in the styles of 17th and 18th century France. In this lavish setting, Ruth Livingston Mills hosted parties for the elite of Gilded Age Society. Guests included people such as her cousin John Jacob Astor, her neighbors Fredrick and Louise Vanderbilt, and her twin daughters' close friend Alice Roosevelt, President Theodore Roosevelt's eldest daughter.

Staatsburgh State Historic Site and the Ogden Mills & Ruth Livingston Mills Memorial State Park are located on Old Post Road in Staatsburg, off Route 9 between Rhinebeck and Hyde Park. The historic site is one of 6 sites and 15 parks administered by the Taconic
