

for her too, and learns to find her own voice. Mr. Mushnick is a humorous character, often bemused at the behavior of hapless Seymour, and Orin, the Dentist, has one of the classic humorous songs of the play. Audrey II starts off as a helpless

little plant, and becomes quite an interesting character. Chiffon, Ronette and Crystal sing the story to us, creating rising drama and atmosphere, as do the company.

The play has achieved cult status because of it's catchy unique characters, humorous dialogue, and the mysterious origins and power

4 links Italian sausage, meat removed from casings

done-in, skin-on turkey thighs

2 quarts turkey stock

4 medium carrots, diced 3 white onions, diced

1 celery stalk, diced

1 head garlic, minced

1 bunch fresh sage

1 bunch fresh thyme

Salt and freshly ground black pepper 20 medium Yukon gold potatoes

2 cups grated Gruyere

1 stick (8 tablespoons) unsalted butter 1 baguette, thinly sliced

#### **Directions**

Brown the Italian sausage in a large pot over medium-high heat, then remove and reserve. Sear the turkey in the pot until golden brown on both sides, then add the stock, carrots, onions, celery, garlic, sage and thyme. Bring to a boil, then lower to a simmer and cook, uncovered, until the turkey is cooked through and the vegetables are tender, 1 hour 15 minutes to 1 hour 30 minutes. Take the turkey out of the pot and allow to cool slightly.

Remove the meat from the bones, then chop into bite-sized pieces. Continue to cook the remaining liquid until further reduced. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Place the turkey, sausage, vegetables and reduced stock in 9-by-13-inch casserole dish. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F.

Fill a large pot with water and boil the potatoes until tender. Crush them with a potato masher, then add the cheese and butter. Place on top of the turkey and vegetable mixture and bake until the casserole is warm throughout and the potatoes have become slightly golden on top, about 30 minutes.

Serve with the baguette.



The screening will be followed by a special Q&A trailblazing Hudsonbased photographer Lynn Davis and climate scientist Anthony Leiserowitz, Ph.D. Meltdown (Fredric Golding, 60 min., 2021) is a timely documentary that merges art and science as it follows acclaimed photographer Lynn Davis and climate scientist Anthony Leiserowitz, Ph.D. to the town of Illulisat, Greenland, considered the "Ground Zero" of climate change. Coinciding with this special screening, two of Davis's large-scale photographs from her travels to Greenland are on view at Olana State Historic Site as part of Olana's first winter exhibition, Chasing



Icebergs: Art and a Disappearing Landscape. Chasing Icebergs, which runs through March 26, traces the 19th century artist Frederic Church's quest to paint icebergs off the coast of Newfoundland and Labrador. ## An Ambitious Life

The best business advice in the world will always tell you to envision where you want to be a year from now or five years from now. Isn't this what we tell young people finishing high school and heading off to college? Ambition would be considered a good thing, wouldn't it?

Yet sometimes the message of the Bible seems to offer a contrary ambition. In the book of Matthew Jesus says, "Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant."

Ambition typically stirs up in the heart and mind a focus on a specified outcome. It has little to do with serving someone else. Further on in the same chapter

Sitting right next to Jesus in a place of honor is a bit of an ambition. But a place next to Jesus is not one that can be earned through works. Jesus responded to this request saying, "I have no right to say

who will sit on my right or left.

My Father has prepared the place for those He has chosen."

No amount of good works,

meals given to the hungry, church services attended or offerings put in the plate will amount to a guaranteed place of honor.

Instead, Jesus wants us to learn the heart of a servant. It might be an oxymoron to have ambition to be the best servant. That very ambition would produce an attitude of pride. As you look around, whether it be at those in the workplace, those

who teach the children, those who

lead your church, may we all have an attitude of humility. Before thinking words of criticism over how things could have been done better, maybe it is time to be thankful that they showed up with what they have to offer. Maybe its time to extend grace to the imperfection of others, rather than comparing ourselves, thinking we come out on top. Who ever wants to be great

must be a servant of all. If you want to live a successful life in the eyes of God, you must learn from the greatest servant who ever lived: Jesus. ## **Urinary Tract** Infections

Urinary Tract Infections (UTIs) are fairly common in affecting human medicine, approximately 10-15% of people assigned male at birth, and 50-60% of people assigned female at birth. It is important to know that our animals can get UTIs as well. While this article will focus on dogs and cats, many other animals can have UTIs, including rats, guinea pigs, rabbits, cows, pigs, horses, sheep and goats. In these animals, however, the infection is often secondary to an underlying issue such as nutrition, genetics, trauma,

or poor husbandry, rather than a primary bacterial infection.

A UTI typically involves a bacterial infection of the kidneys, ureters (tubes that connect from each kidney to the bladder), urinary bladder, prostate (in male dogs), and/or urethra (the tube that goes from the bladder to the external environment. Most of the time, a UTI will occur due to bacteria entering the urinary tract from the external environment, and ascend into the urethra and bladder. While the urinary tract has defense mechanisms to help prevent infections, this is not always enough to stave off bacteria. Although any pet can contract an infection, older pets, females, and pets with illnesses (such as diabetes mellitus,

kidney failure, and those who have compromised immune systems) will be at a higher risk.

Signs of a UTI are straining to urinate, urinating only small amounts at a time, urinating in inappropriate places (outside of the litter box for a cat, or inside the house for a dog), and blood in the urine. Some pets will lick their genitals or act uncomfortable. Because the infection is confined to the urinary tract, pets are not typically "sick" - meaning they often do not have a fever, they are not lethargic, and they do not have a poor appetite. The exception to this is if the infection invades the kidneys – that location does tend to have more signs associated with general malaise.

Because the above signs can also be seen with other urinary issues, such as stones, tumors, sterile cystitis (inflammation in the bladder without infection), or even behavioral problems, it is important to try to confirm an infection before starting treatment. The primary test performed is a urinalysis. A sample of urine is analyzed to look for the presence of red blood cells, white blood cells, and bacteria. It will also look at the concentration of the urine, if there are any crystals or glucose, or if there are any cells from the lining of the kidneys. Additional testing, such as a urine culture & sensitivity, radiographs, and blood work maybe performed as well depending on the individual case.

Treatment typically involves an antibiotic to clear up the bacterial infection. Pain medication is sometimes added on if a pet is particularly uncomfortable. For chronic or recurrent infections, probiotics and other supplements are considered. It is important to note that cranberry extract and d-mannose are typically only helpful for treating and preventing UTIs specifically caused by E. coli. While E. coli is commonly involved in UTIs, it is not the only bacteria that dogs and cats are affected by.

Most of the time, UTIs are cleared quickly. When there are repeat or persistent infections, we need to look at the overall health of the pet and determine if there are any underlying causes that are predisposing them to infections.

## NATURAL DOG **BEHAVIOR**

Presented by Barbara **Sweeney Fassett and Bark Busters Home Dog Training Dutchess County** 

As I've stated in previous writings, there are differences between dogs and people. It's pretty obvious that this is true. What may not be as apparent is that many of the issues that people call us about are "natural" dog behaviors. They are not human behaviors. When the dogs that live with us do these things there is a disconnect between our world and Rover's. But dogs are dogs so these things are natural to them. Let's look at some examples.

Jumping up is an activity that starts with puppies playing with each other. They jump on

and wrestle each other to prepare themselves for adult life when they'll have to figure out their place in their pack. Jumping can be an expression of dominance. If Rover jumps on you or a guest, he's not just saying hello, which is what a lot of people think. He's actually saying that the house is his and that he is making the rules. Or he may actually be challenging you to "play" for leadership. Barking is a natural

behavior. Almost every dog will bark. Dogs bark for a variety of reasons. It is part of their normal communication technique. But when dogs bark inappropriately it can drive us crazy. One thing I find really interesting is that in a pack consisting of only dogs, there is usually very little barking but in the humancanine packs, (our family), there is often a lot of barking

Mouthing and nipping are also behaviors that dogs learn to do as puppies. It's very similar to jumping. Puppies and dogs are designed with thick loose skin to handle that kind of play. We're made differently however. Pups will usually learn bite inhibition from the reactions of their littermates or from the older dogs. We however, don't react the same way. They don't get the message from us that nipping is inappropriate.

Coprophagia or eating poop is a behavior that we find absolutely disgusting and wonder why on earth they would do that. Even eating poop is a natural dog behavior. A mother dog will stimulate her very young puppies to toilet by licking their genital and anal areas. When they go, she consumes the excrement in order

to keep the "den" area clean. The pups are too small to go anywhere and she doesn't want them lying in their waste. She also is likely to want to eliminate the scent of her pups and keep them safe from predetors. This is most likely how dogs start to learn to keep their sleeping area clean. It's also most likely when dogs learn this behavior.

These activities and many others that we're called to help people with are all natural activities from Rover's perspective. They don't understand that there is nothing wrong with doing them. They aren't doing them to make us mad, although that is often the result. They are just doing things that are either instinctual or learned behavior, often as young puppies.

When we work with people and their puppies and dogs, we start by helping them understand Rover and how he looks at the world. We know Rover is a dog. Rover however, also thinks WE are dogs. In rover's mind we are handicapped dogs. Rover knows he's faster than we are, his hearing is about

#### Columbia-Greene Humane Society/ SPCA

Curtis Rist, 63, of Greenport was arrested on Monday, February 20, 2023 on two counts of animal cruelty. Greenport Police received a complaint from an individual who saw multiple dogs in a yard in "terrible condition." The report claimed that the dogs' coats were so matted that they

could barely move. Greenport Police responded to the call and found five dogs, all in deplorable condition. The police contacted the Columbia-Greene Humane Society/SPCA (CGHS/SPCA) for assistance. After discussions with Greenport Police and Humane Society officials, Rist agreed to surrender the five dogs to the CGHS/SPCA.



Upon arrival at the shelter, the five Mini Goldendoodles were examined by shelter staff and a veterinarian. Two of the five dogs were in a condition that needed immediate attention. One dog, a 5-year-old named "Wally," was so matted that it was described as an "exoskeleton." It took a veterinarian and two veterinary technicians two hours to peel the matted shell off of Wally. He was anesthetized during the shaving procedure due to the pain he would have had to endure. All five dogs, ranging in age from four to ten years, are expected to make a full recovery and will be placed up for adoption. 

will investigate the different habitats and ecosystems that exist at Olana through games, scientific observation, and special guest visits. Together, students will uncover the secrets of the natural world and explore how to relate to their surroundings. A special guest visit by Columbia Land Conservancy will give campers the chance to wade into Olana's man-made lake and discover what exists beneath the surface! Guest chefs from The Sylvia Center will also show us how to create delicious snacks with local-fresh produce!

The third week *Invent Like an* Artist will take place Monday, July 24 to Friday July 28, and focuses on art making. Students will take a trip around the globe and explore the cultures and places that inspired Frederic Church. Together, students will invent creative ways to make art in 2D and 3D, using place, nature, and history as inspiration. Students will also explore Olana's new exhibition by visiting inside Olana's Historic House and hiking to artworks in the surrounding landscape.

The fourth and final week, Think Like a Farmer will be held from July 31 to August 4, focusing on farming and food. Students will dig into the history

of Olana and the Hudson Valley as an agricultural center and learn more about how communities have farmed this land throughout time. Together, students will learn about where our food comes from and how different growing practices play important roles in our own lives. We will even get up close and personal with Olana's beehives during a special visit with beekeepers from Fox Farm Apiary. Special guest chefs from The Sylvia Center will also help us create delicious snacks with local-fresh produce!

Each week will run Monday-Friday, 9 am to 3 pm. Registration will close on Wednesday, June 14, 2023. investment. It's an office space with a one-bedroom apartment upstairs. And then there's a garage that is fronted on another side street. So, I saw the potential there, and of course, being in the [real estate] business, I had to act

As part of the purchase decision, Catherine decided to close a small office location in Pine Plains.

She says the Red Hook building purchase ensures that Mondello can remain competitive in a field where large corporate owned real estate agencies have become the

That's good news for locals, and would-be locals, in what remains one of the most sought-after regions to reside in the nation.

Because few firms have the experience and the flexibility that characterize Mondello Upstate Properties.

#### The Local Market Follows Its Own Unique Conditions

Real estate markets in many parts of the U.S.—and some parts of the Hudson region have cooled off, due to economic and interest rate policies over the past year.

But Catherine says towns like Red Hook, Rhinebeck and other nearby towns continue to see micro-market conditions that are bucking that trend.

"The housing inventory is still low," she notes. "There are more buyers than there are sellers. Especially in the Red Hook area. What's happened with the current interest rates, there are some people that have basically been priced out of the market. Whereas, maybe six months ago, they could work that into their payment. But now the payments are higher than what it was. So they can't afford the homes."

Buyers from urban centers like NYC have continued to show strong interest in purchasing locally, according to Catherine.

For Mondello, part of competing on behalf of clients means keeping up on what's going on at a granular level, including what inventory is out there, but also what might be coming on the market, and where hidden opportunities, in terms of communities and properties,

"I have my three daughters working with me, Miranda,

Angelina" says Catherine. As well as my sisters, Margaret and Terese who have helped build the business to where we are today. We have managed to really hold our own with the big franchises. We've been right up there in the mid-Hudson MLS in the Hudson Valley, with sales and listings. So we've been falling into the top 15 percentage, which is pretty good, out of about 280 offices in the region. I think people look at that, and it makes

a difference."

Asked if she sees the tight local market perhaps becoming a little friendlier to buyers via increased housing initiatives, she mentioned some possibilities, but said a lot of uncertainties surrounds those potential options.

"Certainly, new construction [could] help. But that's also very expensive. So, buyers for the new construction are going to be somebody that has deep pockets.

"As far as zoning, I know Red Hook right now, they're looking to buy up open spaces. There's some farmland just outside the perimeter of the village. In fact some of it I think takes in the village, that they're looking to purchase, to do some affordable housing. But I don't know what that means. It's sort of a gray area. But I do know that really anything that has any quality, there's still a lot of investors out there, that are buying fixeruppers and flipping them.

"This area, the Red Hook, Rhinebeck area of the Hudson Valley, things just keep going up."

#### From Bedroom Business to **Local Institution**

Speaking to Catherine, it's evident that she not only enjoys what she does, but that she and her family have a determination to build upon the humble beginnings and hard work of her mother Audrey, who founded Mondello in 1974.

As Catherine tells it:

"My mom started Audrey Mondello Real Estate from her bedroom with a notebook, a phone and one referral, after working as a real estate agent, but deciding to earn her Brokers license and open her own business out of her basement in Gallatin, Columbia

"Her children answered phones and entertained clients while Mom was out on appointments. We were taught early on that Mom's business paid the bills, and that a 'closing' meant pizza as a treat on Friday night.

"Eventually my mother purchased a multifamily up the road on Jackson Crs in Gallatin and opened a more sophisticated office. Her daughters, including Terese, Margaret and myself decided to get licensed and join her in the business, after becoming mothers ourselves and looking for the same flexibility.

"In 2009 mom decided she was ready to retire, and turned the business over to her three daughters. We decided to move into the Village of Red Hook as Mondello Upstate Properties LLC. 


