Red Apple Realty FIFTY Years of Service to the Area

Especially in this day and age of franchises, consolidations, and high-tech mergers, it is a rare accomplishment to start, own and operate an increasingly successful family business for half a century. It takes a rare and accomplished individual to do it.

Frank Starkes, born and raised in Claverack, opened the familiar location of Red Apple Realty on 23B in March of 1971 (see old newsprint photo as best as can be done here), just a stone's throw away from where he was born, and he is just that rare, accomplished individual. His father had come to Hudson in 1914 as a skilled mason and worked with concrete, ornamental plaster and beautiful stonework, some of which can still be seen in Hudson today.

Frank already had one career at GE as an Industrial Engineer and had started a second business as an insurance broker for National Grange Mutual out of his home, where he and his wife Jean (now married 62 years, high school sweethearts in Hudson) lived and thrived. When he retired

from GE in 1968, he and Jean had four daughters and he got his real estate license and worked for two years for Irving Price at Hudson Michael Realty before opening up Red Apple Realty.

The reason it is well to mention "familiar location" is that, literally, the "tree" and sign that was designed by Frank and erected fifty years ago is a landmark in Columbia County. People give directions to other places by siting it. It was so unusual and built so solidly, with steel piping



(individual, corporate, partnership, etc.), QuickBooks Online ProAdvising services, bookkeeping, and payroll needs by holding virtual meetings, teleconferences, and installing secure locked drop-box outside the office to make as contactless possible."

Sarah also mentions that if you did in fact receive Unemployment **Insurance** payments from New York State in 2020, "Make sure to download vour 1099-G form from the

Department of Labor website, as it is not typically mailed anymore."

Sarah also shares that you'll need to remember to include the amount of both of your stimulus payments, "As there is the potential that if you did not get enough or didn't get any stimulus payment at all, you could be eligible for the recovery rebate credit when you file your tax return this 2020 tax filing season."

Regarding COVID-19 relief, FSC has been assisting clients





And to cap it off, a Mars Landing Event took place on February 12th where youth got to share their experiences and then watch a REAL Mars Rover landing!

The Dogs and Cats of COVID-19

There are very few things we can get excited about when we think of the COVID-19 pandemic. It's been with us now for the last year and has given us little to be happy about. However, there is at least one phenomenon that most of us can get excited about: pandemic dogs and cats. During the pandemic, many of us have

been working or attending school remotely from home, giving our pets 24/7 access to us. As the confines of the pandemic slowly fade and we seek a return to some semblance of our previous lives, we want our pets to be well adjusted and to feel safe at home alone. Pets should learn at a young age how to spend time alone, otherwise separation anxiety may develop. Again, try for planned breaks from your pet, even if they're short ones, and seek outside help from a trainer and other available resources to get your pet accustomed to spending time away from you.

Lastly, for your COVID dog or cat, don't let the pandemic stand in the way of scheduling your routine veterinary visits well in advance. Due to the significant increase in numbers of pets adopted over the past year, and safety guidelines requiring a shift to veterinary curbside care, appointments at many veterinary facilities may take longer to secure.

These few considerations aside, I cannot think of a better time to adopt a new furry family member, nor can I think of a time when their companionship and love have ever been needed more. I hope you're enjoying this time with your COVID animal companions as much as my family and I are!

HOW TO SHOW YOUR DOG AFFECTION... WITHOUT CREATING **BAD HABITS**

The bond between a dog and a human is truly special. Pups are not only sources of joy and treasured members of our families, but also nonjudgmental sources of unconditional love. It is no wonder we feel the urge to lavish them with affection and attention!

But years of experience have taught us something hard to believe: it can be possible to love your dog too much. Even the most passionate dog lover should know the difference between loving and spoiling their furry friend – and how to express affection in positive ways that don't reinforce bad habits. Dogs Need Boundaries - While a hands-off approach to puppy parenting may seem like the kindest thing to do, dogs crave rules and structure; they look for a leader to provide it for them. Establishing and reinforcing boundaries is not only healthy (as dogs left to their own devices can become aggressive, demanding, or very protective

of things, including you, the

owner), but can be done using a

foundation of trust and respect, rather than fear and dominance.

Humans and dogs speak two

different languages - Humans use touch like handshakes, hugs or

kisses to communicate greetings, connection and affection and

dogs communicate affection with

gestures too, including nuzzling,

nudging or snuggling. sometimes our human gestures of affection mean something different to our pups. Hugging can be construed by dogs to be dominance or assertive, similar to mounting, so make sure to respect your dog's space and go slowly over time with hugs to avoid being overhearing. Be gentle – Petting from humans can be calming to our dogs.

Pawing between dogs, however, is an expression of assertiveness. That's why gentle petting – like a chin stroke – is best, especially when used to reinforce good behavior. Be mindful of your children, who may be overly physical with their affection, and keep movements slow, calm and deliberate especially with new

Dogs learn by association If a dog has ever been hit, pinned down, rolled over, kicked or overhandled in the past, it is important to rebuild trust slowly and gently. This may mean little or no physical touch until your pooch shows through body language that he is ready for such attention. A bond with your dog that is built on trust, love and respect is the foundation of healthy, lifelong relationships – That's why the right kind of affection, at the right time, is so powerful.

We can love our dogs as much as they love us, give them the attention they deserve and be conscious of reinforcing positive, desirable behaviors. 

As he investigates, he discovers the many ways in which his own life and his friend's family have been shaped by his country's recent violent past. His journey leads him all the way back to the 1960s and a world on the brink of change: a time before narco-trafficking trapped a whole generation in a living nightmare.

Our Bodies Were **Designed To Move**

Just like food or breathing, movement is critical to life. The body was designed to move and many body and mind functions suffer if we remain sedentary. Our doctors and other healthcare providers should literally write out a prescription for "physical activity" to treat many of our health problems, including pain. Better yet, physical activity prevents many health problems. If you still have doubt, 13 studies reported by the Mayo Clinic concluded that "We are sitting ourselves to death" and "Those who sat for more than eight hours a day with no physical activity had a risk of dying similar to the risks of dying posed by obesity and smoking" (https:// www.mayoclinic.org/healthylifestyle/adult-health/expertanswers/sitting/faq-20058005).

We live in a society that sits too

much. Sitting is now considered more dangerous than smoking (<u>https://www.startstanding.org/</u> sitting-new-smoking/#extended). "More than 25% of U.S. adults sit for 8 hours/day or more. Almost half of those people do not exercise at all and here is a list of what results with sitting too much:

- Blood flow slows and of course fat builds up in the blood vessels = Sitting too much leads 147% increased risk of cardiovascular events such as heart stroke attack and Insulin resistance occurs = Sitting too much leads to 112% increased risk of diabetes (https://theheartfoundation. org/2019/08/10/is-sittingthe-new-smoking/) Results in nearly 50% increased risk of death from any cause • Leads to obesity =
- Americans are considered overweight and/or obese, which leads to increased morbidity and mortality. People may think that by working out several times per week they can negate the damage done by extended periods of sitting. Unfortunately, this does not work because sitting is an independent risk factor (https:// www.startstanding.org/sittingnew-smoking/#para1). So hours of sitting is not offset by one or two hours of exercise. Here are a few tricks to break

More than two-thirds of

up sitting time (And the focus is: If you can stand, don't sit and if you can walk, don't stand):

- Set a timer to get up and move every 30 minutes (stretch, walk, stand).
- Try a standing desk. When you get a phone
- call, stand and talk. Park far away from the building that you enter

Instead of sitting in a

conference room for a casual-work meeting, take a walk and talk (Why stand more? Here is the math: You burn approximately 50 calories more per hour by standing. If you stand 3 hours/ day X 5 days/ week, that's 750 calories burned. In a year's time that is equal to 30,000 calories, which is a loss of 9 pounds. With this information, a standing desk might be more appealing and it might also help to motivate you to stand while on the phone

1. Burning obviously helps to fight obesity We know that exercise lowers the risks for cardiovascular diseases and diabetes, but did you know that exercise reduces risks for cancer? Excessive sitting has been linked to breast, prostate, lung, colon, endometrial and ovarian cancers (https://www.startstanding.org/ sitting-new-smoking/#para5) Exercise reduces our risk for Alzheimer's Disease and dementia Physical activity is recommended to counter anxiety and depression When we move our body we have less pain, especially neck and back pain, with back pain being the most common American health problem and the #1 reason for loss work-(Cornell University Department of Ergonomics). Do you want to take charge of your life and design a strategy to manage your back, or do you want your back to rule you? (A Consultation with the Back Doctor by Hamilton Hall, MD) Physical activity (specifically walking) has proven to reduce physical and mental disabilities in older adults (http://jama jamanetwork.com/article. aspx?articleid=1875328) With less sitting and more standing and movement, we improve our posture, which has enormous impact on our health including less pain, fewer problems with joints and muscles, improved breathing and even better

Since exercise is not optional, how can we get motivated? Fear and feeling like we "should" exercise are shortterm motivators. It helps to find a physical activity that you like or at least prefer to do. You will be more motivated to be physically active if you like what you are doing. Even if you don't like exercise, when you start feeling better after establishing a routine of physical activity, you develop a good habit. You get hooked;

digestion

let it become a way of life. Walking is a good place to start. For most people it is simple and doable. As far back as 1913, George Trevelyan (Founding Father of the New Age Movement) said: "I have two doctors, my left leg and my right leg." Our healthcare providers have to help get the public on board with physical activity and less sitting by incorporating the process into everyone's personal healthcare Starting out with a prescription for exercise (rather than pills) is a good beginning tactic. I dedicate this article my hiking partner: "walking



God's Corner

Learning Peace with Jesus as Teacher

At times spiritual peace may seem to be a mythical concept, that comes completely via a supernatural impartation. part this is true because only Jesus can give lasting peace.

Late philosopher and spiritual formation teacher, Dallas Willard, believed that we should not only see Jesus as our Savior but also as our teacher. While Jesus gives peace in a supernatural way, He also teaches us how to live. When we cultivate a life that embraces Jesus as our Savior and as our teacher, peace is a by-product or a fruit of the Spirit that will grow in our lives (Galatians 5:22-23)

This month let us think about Jesus as our teacher (in April the focus will be Jesus as Savior). There are several main ways to learn from Jesus: through the Bible, through the Holy Spirit and through Bible teachers/speakers/ preachers. It is important to remember that the Holy Spirit and Bible teachers should never be contrary to the Bible.

Psalm 1 is a great starting place for learning wisdom from Jesus'. This Psalm outlines a way of life, that will yield peace. Don't listen to the counsel or advice of wicked people. (Verse 1) Think about the people in your life. Who do you lean on for advice? Are they people who have moral character or are they people whose own lives are a disaster? Delight in God's Word, the Bible. (Vs 2) Spending time reading the Bible and asking God to help you understand the wisdom it contains will give you greater peace because what you think on (read) is what you will become.

The Psalmist then outlines the benefits of following this way of life. You will be firmly planted, and prosperous. (vs 3) When I think of firmly planted, I think of stability. This could look like stability in your family life, in your workplace, your friendships,

or your credit history. Going

back to the words of wisdom of verse one, listening to wise counsel will yield stability.

This Psalm is just a small nugget of wisdom that the Bible gives. Sometimes the wisdom of the Bible can sound confusing and you need help understanding it. That is one reason why God gave us the Holy Spirit at the time of salvation, so that when we need help understanding we can ask. What situations are you anxious (Remember anxiety about? is the opposite of peace.)

Take time this week, and this month to search the Bible for teaching on how to use wisdom in this situation. Seek advice from a person who you know is walking in the wisdom of the Bible and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you what you don't understand. A peaceful heart is a lifelong journey, with Jesus as your teacher you will grow in

Jesus said, "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32). It is a blessing to be free from fear. The Lord Jesus will help us overcome the fears that we face!
