<u>events/pinkster-festival</u>. Philipse Manor Hall State Historic Site, located at 29 Warburton Ave., Yonkers, NY, 10701, is open for tours Wednesdays through Sundays, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Dating back to the 1680s, Philipse Manor Hall State Historic Site sits near the confluence of the Nepperhan (Saw Mill) and Hudson Rivers, the site of a Munsee Lunaape village. Used by four generations of the Philipse family and worked by the people they enslaved and European tenant farmers, the Philipse Manor was once over 200,000 acres and helped make

the Philipse family the richest in New York. Loyalists during the American Revolution, they fled to England and the Hall was owned by several individuals before becoming the Yonkers Village Hall and later Yonkers City Hall. When a new City Hall was built in the early 20th century, the house was preserved through the generosity of Eva Smith Cochran and donated to New York State to serve as a historic site. Today, Philipse Manor Hall State Historic Site provides visitors with a balanced approach to interpreting the lives of Indigenous, European, and African people to understand the complex relationships that







Sausage, Peppers, Onions, and Potato Bake



2 teaspoons olive oil 2 pounds Italian sausage links, cut into 2-inch pieces <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup olive oil 4 large potatoes, peeled and thickly sliced 2 large green bell peppers, seeded and cut into wedges 2 large red bell peppers, seeded and cut into wedges 3 large onions, cut into wedges <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup white wine  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup chicken stock 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste Directions Gather all ingredients. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C). Heat 2 teaspoons olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat, and cook and stir the sausage until browned, 5 to 10 minutes. Transfer cooked sausage to a large baking dish. Pour 1/4 cup of olive oil into the skillet, and cook potatoes, stirring occasionally, until browned, about 10 minutes. Place the potatoes into the baking dish, leaving some oil in the skillet. Cook and stir green and red peppers and onions in the hot skillet until they are beginning to soften, about 5 minutes. Add the vegetables to the baking dish. Pour wine and chicken stock over the vegetables and sausage, and sprinkle with Italian seasoning, salt, and pepper.

of nearly 5,000 19th century photographic prints, collected by the artist Frederic Church between 1850 and 1900. Until now, this nationally significant photography and intact collection has been little-known and unseen by the public. "The Olana Partnership is thrilled to bring Olana's major collection of 19<sup>th</sup> century photography into public view and to partner with artist David Hartt to examine a theme that addresses the power of Church's vision for Olana," said Sean Sawyer, Washburn & Susan Oberwager President of The Olana Partnership. In *Terraforming*, artist and guest curator David Hartt reflects on the ways in which human culture and activity shape the land, eroding the boundary between human construction and the natural world, just as Frederic Church did in creating the 250-acre earthwork that is Olana. Through Hartt's selection of historic photographs from Olana's vast collection, the exhibition also explores what this global photographic collection tells us about Church's painting practice, travels, and ways of knowing and collecting the world. An installation of 48 original photographs within Olana's Sharp Family Gallery will include original and historically significant works by pioneering early photographers, including Eadweard Muybridge, William James Stillman, and Claude-Joseph Désiré Charnay. Throughout Frederic Church's 250-acre designed landscape, visitors will discover 6 largescale reproductions of historic photographs in locations chosen by David Hartt. The exhibition includes two new works by Hartt: a site-specific bronze sculpture to be installed outdoors in Olana's historic fern garden, and a sitespecific tapestry to be hung indoors in Olana's main house.

"David Hartt's curation of Frederic Church's photography collection reveals Church's apparent fascination the interactions of human and natural forces in the landscape globally,

and how he captured this through his shaping of the land at Olana," said Allegra Davis, Associate Curator with The Olana Partnership. "David's new site-specific artworks explore one aspect of how Church sought to bring the world home to Olana through the creation of a fern garden inspired by the tropical landscape of Jamaica." historic collection Olana's contains over 5,000 nineteenthcentury photographs collected by Frederic Church and is a treasure trove of early photography. Church's collection centers around nearly 2,000 travel photographs that span the continents and represent the full spectrum of his era's new photographic technologies. This unique collection survives today as one of the largest intact photography collections assembled during the nineteenth century in the United States, yet aspects of this collection also remain mysterious. About half of the photographs are not yet attributed, and the majority have never been publicly exhibited.

David Hartt is an Associate Professor in the Department of Fine Arts at the University of Pennsylvania. His work unpacks the social, cultural, and economic complexities of his various subjects and explores how historic ideas and ideals persist or transform over time. His solo exhibitions include The Histories at The Hammer Museum, Los Angeles, Coloured Garden at The Glass House (currently on view), New Canaan, Connecticut and the group

exhibition, *Reconstructions:* Architecture and Blackness in America at The Museum of Modern Art, New York. His work is also featured in the public collections of several museums including The Museum of Modern Art, New York, Whitney Museum of American Art, New York, The Museum of Contemporary Photography, Chicago, The J. Paul Getty Museum, Los Angeles, The National Gallery of Canada, Ottawa and The Stedelijk Museum, Amsterdam. TERRAFORMING: Olana's Historic Photography Collection Unearthed was curated by Artist David Harrt, Will Coleman, The Olana Partnership's former Director of Collections & Exhibitions, and Allegra Davis, Associate Curator, The Olana Partnership, with support from Ida Brier, Archivist/Librarian, The Olana Partnership. The exhibition was organized in Hudson River View - May 2023- 7

# A Picture of the Father By Naomi Fata

There was once a restless young man, who longed for adventure. He wanted to get away from the farm life that he had always known. Maybe he was tired of living in the shadow of an older brother, or weary of being recognized by everyone in his small town. Perhaps he wanted to strike out on his own for adventure, as many young people do. Whatever the reason might have been, he went to his father and asked for the money to make it on his own. In fact, he asked not just for some money but for his whole inheritance.

The father agreed, which isn't particularly common among parents. Most of the time we want to hold the reins of control when young people are still adolescence. I wonder if the father was nervous about what the young man would do with the money. But the father let go. He let his son go off to seek his fortune - to

make his own life for himself. The father let go of control and allowed his son to make his own choices. Those choices didn't turn out so well. In fact, the son wasted all of the money and found himself in desperate need of a job because he didn't even have money left for food. The young man found a job feeding pigs, just so he could also eat some of their slop to keep himself from starving.

One day as he was feeding the pigs it occurred to him that even if he were a servant on his father's farm he would have better lodging and food than he did in his current state. So, he swallowed his pride and went back to his hometown, hoping and believing that his father would hire him on. Bynowmaybeyou'verecognized this as a paraphrase of the Biblical account of Luke 15:11-32 (the account of the Prodigal Son).

There are so many life lessons to be learned from this, but let's focus on just one for now. I think of the courage it took for the son to go back. In order to return he had faith in the relationship that he had with his father. He believed in the character of the father enough to trust that his father would not throw him out.

This story is intended to be an image of what God the Father is like. He doesn't control us. When we fight against the restrictions placed on us asking Him to let us go our way, He let's us go. But all the while He awaits our return. If you have gone your own way, chosen your own path, and have

come up penniless, emotionally battered, and empty, He is still waiting to welcome you back. For those who grew up with harsh fathers, who were criticized for every glass of spilt milk, who never had a bedtime story on his lap, going back to the Father can feel intimidating. There is fear of rejection, and anger. But God the Father isn't like that. He is waiting with open arms to welcome you home. Will you go home to Him? # Grape Toxicosis in Dogs

By Julianne Porter, DVM Last month, we discussed a toxicity that mainly affects cats (lilies). In this month's article, the focus is on a toxin that seems to target dogs, found in grapes and raisins. Both interesting and concerning, there is a lot that is unknown about grape toxicity in dogs. Not all dogs seem to be affected, and the dose that can cause problems doesn't always seem to be the same either. For over 20 years, veterinarians have observed kidney failure in dogs following grape and raisin ingestion. This reaction occurs from both seeded and seedless grapes. Toxicity has not been reported from grape juice or wine ingestion, but it is still unknown whether those products have toxic potential. Likewise,

grapeseed extract has so far not been associated with toxicity. The toxic principle in grapes/ raisins has not been confirmed. Studies have investigated heavy metals, fungal infections and pesticides to no avail. More recently, tartaric acid has been implicated. Tartaric acid is found in cream of tartar, tamarinds, as well as grapes. Dogs ingesting cream of tartar and tamarinds have been found to develop kidney failure similar to the kidney failure that dogs develop after ingesting grapes. Furthermore, tartaric acid levels are not consistent in all grapes, which possibly reveals why some dogs are affected while others are not. The amount needed to cause kidney damage is also not straightforward. Veterinarians have seen toxicity with as little as 0.3 ounces of grapes per pound of dog, although it's likely the

a 20 pound dog could develop toxicity with 6 ounces of grapes (about 35-40 grapes). With raisins, it is lower - just 1 ounce of raisins could affect a 20 pound dog. There is no specific test for grape/ raisin toxicity. Dogs typically present with vomiting, decreased or no appetite, and increased urination. Lab work reveals elevated kidney values as the most consistent finding. The clinical signs, lab work findings, and history of ingestion (if known), allow for the diagnosis of this toxicity. Toxicity tends to occur relatively quickly - signs can develop within a couple of hours and lab work changes can occur within 12-24 hours, but may take up to 72 hours. Treatment focuses on rapid decontamination - vomiting is induced if the dog is not already vomiting, and activated charcoal is typically administered in hopes to bind remaining toxins. Then, dogs are given fluid therapy to try to treat the acute kidney damage that has occurred. They require at least several days of hospitalization and frequent lab work monitoring to track their progress. Unfortunately, the prognosis is quite poor if kidney failure occurs and even worse if dogs stop producing urine altogether. Dogs often succumb to the disease within 5 days of ingestion. However, if decontamination and fluid therapy is initiated early, the prognosis is better. Therefore, if you think your pet ingested grapes or raisins, getting them to the veterinary hospital as soon as you can will be the best chance at survival. While this is a toxicity that seems to target dogs, it is important to point out that anecdotally, cats and ferrets have been suggested to be susceptible. Therefore, it is best not to feed grapes/ raisins to these pets as well.

# TIPS FOR BRINGING HOME A RESCUE DOG

For a variety of reasons, rescue groups and shelters face a neverending stream of pets in need of temporary foster care and alternate "furever" homes. If you are one of those individuals opening up your heart and home to a needy animal, thank you, thank you, thank you! In the hope of easing that transition, I would like to pass along some tips to help create an environment where you, your family and your new adopted pet can thrive. Have a set of house rules. Dogs need order and leadership. They are pack animals, so you must be the "pack leader". Your dog needs to know that you're the boss and that there are established rules in his new home. It is best to get him on track from the beginning. Hold a family meeting to create rules about caring for the dog. Will he be allowed on the couch, the bed, and in all rooms of the

house? Where will he sleep and eat? Who will walk him and clean up after him? As a family, you must all be consistent with your decisions or you will confuse the dog, usually resulting in the dog making his own rules.

Have the necessary items your dog will need from the start: identification tags, collar and 6-foot leash, food and water bowls, food, toys, a crate and bedding and basic grooming tools.

Bring your new dog home when you can be there for a few days so you can get to know each other and establish rules.

At first, limit your dog to one room or area. Allow him time to familiarize himself with the smells and sounds of his new home. Try to limit your time away from home during those first few days. Spending time with him will help him to become more comfortable in his new, unfamiliar home.

Keep your dog on leash for the first few days so you can immediately teach what behaviors are and are not acceptable. NEVER leave the leash on your dog when he is unsupervised. Expect house training accidents. Your dog is in a new territory and is establishing a new routine, so accidents probably will happen. The key is to be consistent, supervise your new dog and maintain a routine.

Dogs instinctively like to den, and a crate makes the ideal place for your dog to sleep and get away from household chaos and commotion. A crate also makes house training, and training in general. The crate should be roomy enough to allow your dog to stand up, turn around, and lie down comfortably. An alternative is to confine him in a smaller, dog- proofed part of your home, such as a laundry room or mudroom. You can use a baby gate or dog gate to block off the area from the rest of the house. Give your dog a space of his own to settle in comfortably.

Most rescued dogs have been given basic vaccinations and many have already been spayed-neutered. If you have adopted your dog, as opposed to temporarily housing him, it is important that your dog be examined by a veterinarian within a week or two after adoption for a health check and any needed vaccinations. Talk to your vet and create a plan for spaying/neutering, if that hasn't already been done.

For the first few days, limit guest visits to allow your dog to get comfortable with his new family. When you do have guests, ask their help in training your dog by instructing

them not to pay attention to him until he is calm. One way to communicate this request is to post a sign on your front door informing visitors that you have a new "dog in training" and that you need their help. Oftentimes visitors do not understand that the way they engage the dog can serve to un-do your efforts to provide clear and consistent boundaries and expectations for your dog to live by. Get guidance for training your dog. Awell-trained dog is a happier dog and a joy to have around. Dogs <u>NEED</u> a pack leader. If they don't find one, then they will

try to become the leader, which can create numerous behavioral problems. Thus, you, and all of the humans in your home, need to be the pack leader. Practice obedience training, set rules then apply them calmly and consistently, and praise, praise, praise your dog's good behavior.




