

Staatsburgh State Historic Site, will be open for tours Thursdays through Sundays in September and October, and will also be open on Labor Day and Columbus Day. Tours will be offered by advance reservation only; reservations can be made at www. bookeo.com/StaatsburghSHS The cost for a tour is \$6; \$4 for seniors and students; children age 12 and under are free, and payment is onsite upon arrival.

The 30-minute tours of the mansion's main floor will cover the part of the house designed for entertainment at Ruth and Ogden Mills' frequent and very luxurious house parties. Due to a capital project, the dining room and the library-the mansion's two largest currently partially de-installed.

The 79-room mansion overlooking the Hudson River is in the hamlet of Staatsburg, between Hyde Park and Rhinebeck. A time capsule of the Gilded Age, Staatsburgh retains its original furnishings and opulent décor. The historic




estate grounds surrounding the mansion, now Mills Memorial State Park, offer scenic walking paths as well as woodland trails and picnic opportunities.

The mansion was redesigned by the famous architect Stanford White in 1895 and decorated in the styles of 17th and 18th century France. In this

TunnelTeller by Alicja Kwade Opening Reception at Art Omi on Sept. 11 On view now in the Sculpture

Architecture Park & Art Omi announces the addition of TunnelTeller, immersive outdoor an Alicja sculpture by Kwade, to the Sculpture & Architecture Park. An opening reception will be held during the Fall Opening in the Sculpture & Architecture Park on Saturday, September 11, from 3 to 6 PM. The Fall Opening also commemorates the opening of To Feel Myself Beloved on the Earth, a solo exhibition by Jeffrey Gibson in the Newmark Gallery. TunnelTeller will remain on view at Art Omi through 2026. TunnelTeller is an immersive, interactive structure designed to challenge the viewer's notions of space and perception. This large-scale maze consists of concrete walls and steel, emphasizing human intervention and industrial construction, opposing the surrounding idyllic landscape. Walking around and through the structure, viewers are confronted by polished surfaces that distort their reflections, and large steel tubes that intersect the walls and walkways, inviting the viewer to look through them as telescopes. Through these openings, and dispersed through the maze are both natural vistas and thoughtfully placed blue stone spheres, reminiscent of the sky. With their placement inside the tubes and just outside of certain openings, it appears

that the sky is falling through the structure, resulting in a kind of "world-making machine." Kwade About Alicja Based in Berlin, Alicja Kwade (b.1979, Poland) has long been engaged with value systems, philosophical questions about the essence of reality, and with attempting to examine, if not resolve, issues of inherently subjective concepts such as space and time. In her sculptures, installations, photographs, and

films, Filotographs, and films, Kwade probes the structural properties of everyday objects and the veracity of matter. Through this work, she aims to reveal possibilities for alternate realities while examining social agreements and supposed truths. **About Art Omi**

Art Omi presents the works of contemporary artists and architects over 120 acres of fields and forest, offering the opportunity to experience a range of large-scale works in a singular outdoor environment, as well as in the Newmark Gallery. lavish setting, Ruth Livingston Mills hosted parties for the elite of Gilded Age Society. Guests included people such as her cousin John Jacob Astor, her neighbors Fredrick and Louise Vanderbilt, and her twin daughters' close friend Alice Roosevelt. President Theodore Roosevelt's eldest daughter. Visitors to Staatsburgh see a remarkable relic of a vanished era. Still decorated with the Millses' antique furniture, gilded decoration, Asian carpets and art, the mansion vividly recalls the atmosphere of the Gilded Age. Visitors learn what it was like to be among Society's elite, to attend one of Ruth Mills' exclusive weekend parties, and to be looked after by an army of servants. Staatsburgh received the History



Award for Distinction from Dutchess Tourism, Inc., and is a Trip Advisor Site of Excellence.

Staatsburgh State Historic Site and the Ogden Mills & Ruth Livingston Mills Memorial State Park are located on Old Post Road in Staatsburg, off Route 9 between Rhinebeck and Hyde Park. The historic site is one of 6 sites and 15 parks administered by the Taconic

Plein Air Painters (NYPAP), and International Plein Air Painters (IPAP), and currently teaches workshops in pastel and plein air techniques across the country.

The Olana Partnership's virtual Young at HeART: Memoir as Sight and Sound course will explore Martin Johnson Heade's 19th century paintings by studying the artist's commitment to the vivid representation of the natural world and applying it to their own writing. During this six-week course, Emily Sachar will teach participants to craft a memoir essay of 1,500 words that will consider such essential topics as: the narrative arc, describing a setting, creating a reliable narrator, and writing dialogue.

Emily Sachar is a Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist and the author of the memoir, Shut Up and Let the Lady Teach (Poseidon Press/Simon & Schuster). which chronicled the author's year teaching public school in one of the most challenging urban New York City districts. Ms. Sachar has also written travel memoir for Newsday, the Long Island newspaper, and Cowboys & Indians, a West Coast lifestyle magazine. Her 15 years' experience as a reporter at Newsday earned her more than 25 writing awards, including two as the prestigious grand prize winner of the Education Writers of America. Ms. Sachar teaches writing and art history through Bard College, NYU and the State University of New York.

Plein Air Pastel is funded by Aroha Philanthropies and part of a two-year grant to fund creative aging courses at Olana. books that inform and engage children. The "Lasagna Method" of Gardening By Pat Owens

The Old Dutch Village Garden Club is honored to present the August/September Garden of the Month Award to Linda Disgasper at 30 Aspinwall Road, Red Hook.

Four years ago, Linda, who is a master gardener volunteer at Dutchess County Cornell Extension, relocated some forsythia shrubs from her front yard. Believing that "a garden is a journey, not an end", she has since created several wonderful garden spaces on her own journey around her property: flowers in the front and side and vegetables in the rear.



Within a basic structure of shrubs, including boxwood and Alberta spruce, she has sprinkled varieties of perennials and annuals. There is a beautiful bed of sunflowers, dedicated to her partner and garden companion. A combination of sun and shade gardens line the walkways.

Linda is currently cultivating a slope garden to avoid difficult mowing. She makes a twofoot-deep layer composed of cardboard, dried leaves, and grass clippings which she calls the "lasagna method" which she will plant with various ground covers.

She uses Neem oil for Japanese beetles, Green Gobbler, vinegar-based herbicide, а and Plant Tone fertilizer in all gardens.

Being a volunteer herself, Linda encourages "volunteer" flowers in her garden and often swaps plants with neighbors.





1 cup shredded Swiss cheese 3 cups shredded cheddar cheese

Remove from refrigerator 30 minutes before baking. Preheat oven to 350°. Bake, covered, until heated through and a thermometer inserted in center reads 165°, about 45 minutes. Uncover; bake until cheese is melted, 10-15 minutes.







<u>Is It Bacterial</u> or Viral? by Charlotte Michos, RN,

MS, CNS, CLNC

How can you tell the difference between a bacterial and a viral infection? It is hard to judge, based on symptoms, since they can cause similar outcomes such as coughing, fever, fatigue, inflammation, sneezing, headaches and even vomiting or diarrhea (https://www.webmd. <u>com/a-to-z-guides/bacterial-</u> and-viral-infections). Although bacteria and viruses are both categorized as microbes and can spread infections in the same manner (coughing, sneezing, skin contact etc.,) they are significantly different structurally and the treatments are not the same. Bacteria are complex, tough organisms, single-celled, and have rigid-walls with rubbery membranes for protection. An important difference from viruses is that bacteria can reproduce on their own. Also noteworthy is that most bacteria are harmless and many are beneficial; the bacteria on our skin and inside our body have a protective role and fight off disease. They can also survive extreme environments, whether it is variation in temperature or even radioactive waste materials. Bacteria have existed for over 3.5 billion years (https://www. webmd.com/a-to-z-guides/ bacterial-and-viral-infections). Viruses in contrast are small; they do not have a strong cell wall. They cannot survive on

their own; they require a host in order to replicate and survive. Most viruses are harmful to humans, and these pathogens attack specific cells in the body such as the lungs, blood and liver. Diagnosing: Is it a viral or bacterial in origin? With some illnesses, such as colds, a distinction as to whether it is bacterial or viral in origin is not critical; you can "ride out the common cold." Sometimes a simple examination can determine the source of an infection such as chicken pox (viral) or a staph skin infection (bacterial). Other times a good history can determine the likely infection: influenza during flu season. However, there are other times that a determination has to be made in order to treat a condition such as meningitis, pneumonia, or a serious gastrointestinal infection. The detection approaches are too complex to discuss here, but in general bacterial cultures are more routine since bacteria reproduce on their own and will continue to grow in the petri dish in the lab. Since viruses require a host to reproduce and survive, viral testing often involves eliciting an antibody response, by utilizing such tests as DNA/RNA (PCR) or antigen detection (https://ec.europa.eu/ research-and-innovation/en/ horizon-magazine/pcr-antigenand-antibody-five-thingsknow-about-coronavirus-tests). Treatments: Typically antibiotics are used for bacterial infections and antivirals are used for viral infections. Examples of familiar bacterial infections are: strep throat, Lyme disease, cellulitis, mycoplasma, bacterialmeningitis, gonorrhea, TB and tetanus. Well-known viral infections include influenza, common cold, warts, HIV, chicken pox, viral meningitis, viral hepatitis, and of course, now we all know about Covid-19 (https://www. healthline.com/health/bacterial-

<u>vs-viral-infections#viral-</u> infection-examples). Antibiotics fight off bacterial infection vs antivirals, which help to alleviate the symptoms but do not totally ward off the viral infection. We tend to take antibiotic treatment for granted. Historically, the discovery of antibiotics was literally revolutionary. Prior to WWII, infections struck down children, the elderly and even adults in the prime of life (http:// www.remappingdebate.org/ article/return-our-old-enemiesuntreatable-formantibiotics). But now we have to be careful with overuse because it can lead to the development of resistant organisms. Remember, bacteria have been around for billions of years. These antibiotic-resistant bacteria (now even stronger) can easily be transmitted to others, and for some people the result is severe disability or even death (https://www.hopkinsmedicine. org/health/wellness-andprevention/antibiotics). We are in constant need of new antibiotics to counter this problem, but antibiotic development is not a big money-maker. Pharmaceutical companies profit with the production of drugs that have to be taken long-term (i.e., statins) rather than with antibiotics, which are taken predominantly on a short-term basis (https:// hopkinsinfectiousdiseases. jhmi.edu/research/researchareas/antibiotic-resistanceand-stewardship/). Here is a list of the most serious life-threatening infections that the Infectious Diseases Society of America (IDSA) has identified as a group of drug-resistant bacteria. The acronym - ESKAPE - is used to represent the fact that these pathogens are "escaping" the effects of antibiotics: E= Enterococcus faecium... causes a variety of wound, heart and urinary tract infections S=Staphylococcus causes MRSA aureus ...

Vaccines are preventative; they are not a form of treatment like antibiotics or antivirals. Let's go back to the beginning when I said that viruses (pathogens) need a host (like us for example) in order to live. "The pathogen's job is to evade the immune system, create more copies of itself, and spread to other hosts." (https://www. historyofvaccines.org/content/ articles/viruses-and-evolution). We can build antibodies to fight off viral infections (like the common cold), but if mutations occur then the virus' outer surface changes and the previously

produced antibodies cannot fight the mutated virus. Because vaccines are given less frequently (prevention) than repeated antibiotic-usage, (treatment) there is not an overuse problem. In contrast, to regular influenza, the Covid-19 virus is atypical because it jumped from the animal-to human kingdom and it has the potential to cause serious symptoms and death. As we know, the bad news is that this resulted in a pandemic; the good news is that scientists at the National Institute for Health (NIH)Vaccine Research Center (VRC) were already carrying out vaccine studies for years in order to figure out how to develop protection against coronaviruses, which is what Covid-19 is (https://covid19.nih. gov/news-and-stories/vaccinedevelopment). The outcome of those years of research was the development of an effective vaccine. Basically, the mRNA in these vaccines "teaches" our bodies how to build proteins, which triggers an immune response to fight the Covid-19 infection. Unlike other vaccines, no form of a virus (live or attenuated) is used. The mRNA is synthetically produced and cannot enter our body cells. Soon after the mRNA "teaches" our body to produce an immune response against Covid-19, it dissolves. It cannot exist in body temperatures of 98.6 F; remember that these type of vaccines have to be stored in extremely cold temperatures or they begin to break down. It helps to know how viruses and bacteria are different! 

What do I feed my pet?

"What do I feed my pet?" It's a common question that we are asked at almost every new pet exam. It seems that everyone you ask will have a different opinion on the best food to feed. There is a lot of marketing involved in pet foods (it is literally a \$99 billion dollar industry) and it can be completely overwhelming trying to pick – especially

when every brand is vying for your money. So, how do you know what food is the best? In simple (but vague) terms,

pick a food that provides all the essential nutrients in all the right amounts and proportions for your pet's species and life stage. And make sure it is from a reputable company. Easy, right? The first step is to make sure it has an AAFCO statement. AAFCO (The Association of American Feed Control Officials) sets the standards for a pet food, defines the ingredients, standardizes the feeding trials, and determines the minimum/ maximum nutrition required for different life stages. Without this statement, we don't know if the pet food is adequate or even safe. Look for companies who employ a veterinary nutritionist and whose diets were formulated by a veterinary nutritionist.

Also, try to look past the trigger words/statements such as "no fillers", "no corn", "no byproducts", "natural", "human grade" etc. Nothing in pet food is a filler - every ingredient has a purpose (a true filler would have no nutritional value). Corn is a well-rounded grain that provides energy while being high in essential fatty acids, vitamins, and is highly digestible when cooked. By-products are defined as something that is produced in the making of something else (i.e. molasses is a byproduct of refining sugar). In pet food, byproducts are the edible parts of the animal other than muscle meat. It is not feathers, beaks, horns, hooves - those are illegal to add to pet foods. Liver is a by-product. The claim "natural" only means the ingredients came from plants, animals or mined sources and were not chemically/ synthetically made. The ingredients can still be processed. And there is no definition for what human grade means – it has nothing to do with the quality of the ingredients. When companies put these claims on the label, it is a marketing strategy.

Lastly, many people think feeding grain free is better. For a few pets this can be true, but it is not always beneficial. In some instances, it can be detrimental. Most food allergies/sensitivities in our pets come from the protein sources and grains are highly digestible when cooked. Some grain free diets are balanced using higher fat content and can have more calories. Some use refined starches (i.e. potatoes) which can be less nutritious and more expensive than grains. There is also a possible link between grain-free diets and heart disease in some dogs.

In summary, there are an overwhelming number of pet foods to choose from and a lot of money goes into marketing those foods. Have a discussion with your veterinarian or contact a board-certified veterinary nutritionist if you have questions or if your pet has special needs due to an underlying illness. but my back has been sore and I didn't want to stoop over with my back so we took a trip to a local self serve dog wash store.

For those unfamiliar with the concept, it's like a self serve car wash except you wash your dog there. They have professional tubs, dryers, various shampoos, and other tools which you use to wash, dry and groom your own dogs.

Dakota loves going places and meeting people so I didn't anticipate any problems. The place was actually busy with a number of people in various stages of bathing their dogs.


Dakota was a little unsure of what was going on. Some dogs were barking and others were showing some signs of stress by panting and trying to get away. I spent a little time making sure she was calm and let her get used to he surroundings. The wash basin is a tub a couple of feet deep and about five feet long. It's mounted so that it's about four feet high. Next to the tub is a narrow set of steps up to a platform about four feet high. There is a BIG step down into the tub. Dakota is used to stairs so I told her to go up. She sat down. I tried once more. "Dakota up.", I said while giving the leash just a little pull. She wasn't budging. The clerk came over and asked if I needed help. I thanked her for her offer but declined her assistance. I did however ask if the tub would support both Dakota and me. I think she was going to ask if I was going to take a bath too, but she just smiled and said it should.

I knew right away that I would have to show Dakota that it was ok. I climbed the narrow steps to the platform and she happily climbed up after me. Luckily the platform was big enough for both of us, although not by much.

I stepped down into the tub and called Dakota to me. She tentatively started to step towards me but stopped and lay down on the platform. I stood up, gave her a calm, quiet correction and called her again. As she reached a paw towards the tub I encouraged her. "That's it, good girl" and



when she stepped down into the tub she was welcomed by lots of happy praise. I petted her and scratched behind her ears, which she loves. I stayed in the tub with her until I was sure she was happy, calm and relaxed. I told her to "stay" and then I climbed out of the tub and down the stairs. Dakota actually likes baths so

she was happy throughout the bath. After the bath it was time to have her climb out and get dried off. She readily climbed out of the tub onto the platform. She shook off and I got soaked and she seemed to enjoy the fact that I was as wet as she was. She had that twinkle in her eyes that she gets when she's being mischievous. I'm guessing it was her way of making sure I got a bath too. She's used to being toweled off because it's a daily event when it's warm enough for her to swim. She wasn't used to a blow dryer though. I turned it on and held it a

little way away letting her get used to the sound. I turned it towards me and partially dried myself before I aimed it towards her paws from a distance. She stood there calmly so I proceeded to blow dry her off. She was certainly fluffy by the time we were done.

Throughout the entire process I made sure that she was not getting upset or stressed. I gave her a lot of praise and positive feedback for remaining calm. I slowed things down and gave her a calm quiet correction any time she started to get nervous. Over all we had a great time.

It seems so simple yet of all the people that I watched come in to use the self serve baths, no one else climbed the stairs and into the tub. Everyone picked their dogs up and put them in the tubs. I didn't see one other dog climb the stairs or enter a tub by his own decision. One young puppy was very scared and was doing her best to crawl back out the door. Her owner grabbed her around the stomach, lifted her up off the floor and swung her into the tub. That was not a pleasant experience for the pup. As we were leaving I saw the pup's tail was tucked completely under and she was lying down on



the bottom of the tub as though trying to make herself disappear.

If I had pushed Dakota too fast or not taken the time to show and guide, Dakota would likely have been nervous or scared. She trusts me and I try very hard not to violate her trust. Trust has to be earned and needs reinforcement with each new situation. I could have picked her up and put her in the tub, but that could have damaged that trust. I know that if I'm patient and can show her what to do she'll do her best to follow my direction.

When you take the time to build trust with your dog and you're careful not to break the trust, the bonds grow stronger. Dakota is a dog, not a person, but just as trust is important with our human relationships, it's also important with our canine ones. With people you can talk things out and explain your reasoning, with dogs you can only show them. Take the time to teach your dog. Each new situation is an opportunity for both of you.
