Sage City Symphony **Seeks Musicians**

musicians interested in playing for the 2023-24 season, which runs from September through May. No audition is required, but musicians should be able to play works of moderate difficulty. Commitment to all concerts throughout the entire season is not required; however, it is expected that players will participate in all rehearsals scheduled for each concert in which they intend to participate. Rehearsals for the first concert on Sunday, November 12, begin on Sunday, September 17.

Rehearsals are held in Greenwall Auditorium in the VAPA Building at Bennington College on Sunday afternoons 2:45-5:30 PM, with occasional changes accommodate Bennington College events. Performances are on Sundays at 4 PM, following a 2 PM warmup, and there is an additional dress rehearsal the day before (on a Saturday).

'BIG POLAROIDS' ART EXHIBIT BY Sage City Symphony is seeking FRANC PALAIA TO **OPEN AT CO ON** SEPT. 8

> CO is pleased to announce the opening of "Big Polaroids," an exhibit by noted artist Franc Palaia, from 6-8 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 8. The show will run through Oct. "Big Polaroids" is a solo

> exhibition of large-scale color photographs based on Palaia's award-winning hand-colored SX-70 Polaroids. Palaia is the recipient of two Polaroid Sponsorships for his original technique of hand coloring SX-70 Polaroids with oil-based crayons. He is a painter and photographer who treats his photographs paintings. The original Polaroids are only 3 inches by 3 inches in size, but after Palaia's hand colors the photographs, they resemble miniature oil paintings. His process continues by scanning the small Polaroids and enlarging them to 3 feet by 3 feet. The final results are large vibrant and colorful images with the appearance of blended oil

paintings with simulated brush strokes and textured pigments. Palaia said he came up with the technique more or less by accident. "I came up with the hand coloring idea because I took some Polaroid photos but the colors were off and kind of dull, and because the film was expensive, I didn't want to waste the film, so I tried to salvage the photos by coloring them to enhance the colors," Palaia said. "I noticed that it was fun coloring

DRACULA, the original Broadway version, returns to the Widow Jane Mine in Rosendale.

Theatre on the Road, a traveling company based in Rosendale, New York, will produce and stage Dracula at the Widow Jane Mine in Rosendale on Thursday, September 28th and Friday, September 29th at 7:00 pm and on Saturday, September 30th at 3 pm. Written by Hamilton Deane and John L. Balderston, has been described by Newsweek as "as evening of high class fun".

From the Bram Stoker novel, this is the original Broadway in 1927 and was revised in David Britton as Renfield, 1997 starring Frank Langella. Heather Roland-Bianco as Lucy, In September 2022 Theatre on the Road brought this production to the Widow Jane Mine and it sold out all three performances.

Director Frank Marquette describes the play follows: "Lucy, whose father is in charge of an English asylum, has been attacked by a mysterious illness. Dr. Van Helsing believes Lucy is the victim of a vampire — a certain Count Dracula. Renfield, an inmate, suffers from delusions and is under the spell of the Count. Will he be found and finally laid to rest?"

Frank also offers, "I can't think of a better marriage of play and location. Who wouldn't like to experience Dracula live? I'm setting this in the 1920s with period costumes and making



have 29 days. Thanks to Julius Caesar's reform of the Roman calendar in 46 BC the month now has an additional day! The Romans would quite often associate different months with different gods. The month of September is associated with Vulcan, the Roman god of fire, quite possibly because it was a fiery hot month back when it was the seventh month of the year. Back in the days of the Anglo-Saxons September used to be called Gerst Monath, which translates into "barley month". It was given this name because it was the time of year that the barley crop was harvested, and it was a special time as they brewed a popular drink out of it. September 1, 1939, was a dark day for the world. It was on this day that Hitler invaded Poland, consequentially beginning World War II. September 11, 2001, changed the shape of the world forever. It was on this fateful day that the worst terrorist attack on US soil happened when four commercial airliners were hijacked. Two of the planes were flown straight into the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center, and another was crashed into the Pentagon. The fourth plane crash-landed into a field in Pennsylvania after the passengers of the flight attempted to regain control of the plane from the terrorists.



Nellie Bly Around the World in 72 Days is presented with an 1890s stereopticon magic lantern projector, manufactured McIntosh Co. of Chicago. Live sound effects and incidental music accompany this illustrated talk.

Magic lantern performers Dawn Elliott and Joel Schlemowitz are each well-established in the fields of museum interpretation and filmmaking. 



Vermont, Finckel's formative studies were with his parents, both prominent musicians well known throughout the state. He later attended Oberlin College Conservatory of Music and Bennington College, where he studied composition, conducting, and orchestration with Louis Calabro and Henry Brant. He has taught cello and composition at Bennington and Marymount Colleges, and at Princeton and Cornell Universities. As a member of the faculty of the Vermont Governor's Institute on the Arts, he taught gifted junior and senior high school students from around the state. Currently



living in New York City, Finckel is engaged in an active multiple career as soloist, chamber musician, composer, teacher, and conductor. As a cellist he has performed with orchestral and chamber ensembles in venues from coast to coast and across Europe. He performs and coaches each summer at Composers Conference and Chamber Music Center in Wellesley, Massachusetts, and the Chamber Music Conference and Composers Forum of the East at Bennington College. About Sage City Symphony Cofounded in 1972 by composer Louis Calabro and Christine Graham as a community and college orchestra with close ties to Bennington College, Sage City symphony gave its first concert in 1973. At the time, it was one of only a handful of orchestras in the country to commission and premiere new works. Speak Life

Last month I wrote about choosing life. Both eternal life and the life that you presently have.

In her book, The Battlefield of the Mind, Joyce Meyers relates her own story, that one of the greatest revelations of life, was realizing that she could choose her thoughts and her words. We don't have to accept every thought that comes into our heads.

When I learned this principle, nearly two decades ago, it was a game changer for me. I had always had a wondering mind, filled with fears of the future. Having lost my (biological) father at a young age, faced a multitude of moves, financial insecurity and more, fear was deeply engrained in me.

But when I read the pages of the Bible that promised God had a good plan for me, I wanted to choose life! Reminded of the passage from John 10 when Jesus said, "My purpose is to give them [you] a rich and satisfying life. (John 10:10, NLT) I desperately wanted to know what LIFE was. As I began to study more about

the connection between our

words, actions, and life. I realized that choosing life with our words and thoughts wasn't about the philosophy of speaking positive things into the air, or just saying, "everything will be fine." Instead choosing life meant wrestling with the words of the Bible that gave the promise of life. For example, Jeremiah 29:11, when God promises that He has plans to prosper us and not to harm us. Romans 8:28, when God promises to work all things for good.

I had real questions. Life as an adolescent was anything but good. And then there was the age-old question of why bad things happen to good people, like the man Job in the Bible who lost all his wealth and whose children died, yet by the end of his life God restored his wealth and beyond, additionally blessing him with more children.

Let's be honest – choosing life giving thoughts and words when we don't see it, when our own life feels like a mess is not an easy task. Our natural response is to say what we see and feel in our present situation. When there are circumstances in our life that don't seem like they fit into God's good plan for us, it doesn't mean that we expect them as good, but it also doesn't mean that we should be speaking out negative statements.

Rather than verbalizing, "My life is just one series of disasters after another," there are more constructive ways of speaking life by saying, "Right now I'm going through a challenging season, but I believe God is going to bring me through and work it for good." Not only does this turn our focus back to God, but this gives our brains permission to hope and have expectation of a positive outcome as well.

Choose words that expect LIFE, that give you the expectation that your story is not over, God is still doing a work. Don't lose hope, don't give up.



4 zucchinis (about 2 1/2 pounds), halved lengthwise and seeds scooped out

Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper

1 onion, diced

teaspoons ground cumin

1 pound ground turkey

3 tablespoons tomato paste 1 cup low-sodium chicken broth

3 ounces feta cheese, crumbled

Directions

Preheat the oven to 400° F. Drizzle a rimmed baking sheet with 2 tablespoons olive oil. Season the zucchini halves with salt and pepper. Add to the baking sheet and turn to coat with the oil. Arrange the zucchini cut-side down in a single layer. Roast until crisp-tender, about 15 minutes.

Meanwhile, heat the remaining 1 tablespoon olive oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat.

Add the onion and cook until translucent, about 4 minutes. Stir in the cumin and 1/2 teaspoon each salt and pepper; cook 30 seconds. Add the turkey and cook, breaking it up with a wooden

spoon, until browned, about 5 minutes. Stir in the tomato paste and chicken broth until combined. Cook until the broth is reduced to a thick sauce, 4 to 5

minutes. Turn the zucchini boats cut-side up and fill with the turkey mixture, packing it in. Sprinkle with the cheese and roast until the zucchini is tender and the cheese is softened,

about 10 minutes. Meanwhile, stir together the yogurt and lemon juice; season with salt and pepper. Drizzle the zucchini boats with

the yogurt mixture and top with the dill.





LEFT ON THEIR OWN, DOGS

If you read my articles regularly, there is often a common theme that by now you should recognize: there are differences between dogs and people. It's pretty obvious that this is true. What may not be as apparent is that many of the issues that people call for help in training are "natural" dog behaviors. They are not human behaviors. When the dogs that live with us do these things there is a disconnect between our world and Rover's. But dogs are dogs so these things are natural to them. Let's look at some examples.

Jumping up is an activity that starts with puppies playing with each other. They jump on and wrestle each other to prepare themselves for adult life when they'll have to figure out their place in their pack. Jumping can be an expression of dominance. If Rover jumps on you or a guest, he's not just saying hello, which is what a lot of people think. He's actually saying that the house is his and that he is making the rules or he may be challenging leadership. "play" for

Barking is a natural behavior. Almost every dog will bark. Dogs bark for a variety of reasons. It is part of their normal communication technique. But when dogs bark inappropriately it can drive us crazy. One thing I find really interesting is that in a pack consisting of only dogs, there is usually very little barking but in the humancanine packs, our families, there is often a lot of barking.

Mouthing and nipping are also behaviors that dogs learn to do as puppies. It's very similar to the jumping. Puppies and dogs are designed with thick loose skin to handle that kind of play. We're made differently however. Pups will usually learn bite inhibition from the reactions of their littermates or from the older dogs. We however, don't react the same way. They don't get the message from us that nipping is inappropriate.

These activities and many others that we're called to help people with are all natural activities from Rover's perspective. They understand that there is anything wrong with doing them. They aren't doing them to make us mad, although that is often the result. They are just doing things that are either instinctual or behavior often learned as young puppies.

When we work with

people and their puppies and dogs, we start by helping them understand Rover and how he looks at the world. If you can understand why Rover behaves the way he does, you are then in a better position to deal with his behavior. His world view is different than our's. When you yell at Rover to stop barking, he might be thinking that you are joining him in his attempt to chase away an intruder. When Rover is allowed (or encouraged) to go through the door ahead of you, in your human brain you are thinking that you need to close the door behind you and its easier if Rover goes out first. However, Rover's dog brain tells him that if you are sending him out ahead of you, you have just assigned him the role of being the leader because the leader always leads.

We know Rover is a dog. Rover however, also thinks WE are dogs. We're handicapped dogs to Rover. He's faster, his hearing is about 10 times better; his sense of smell is 100 times better and he's often stronger. We usually prove our disabilities to him over and over.

Once we understand Rover's world we can then modify how we interact in his world. Rover is a dog; he can't consciously just decide to modify how he interacts with us. He can LEARN to modify how he interacts but its learned behavior not his "natural" behavior. Left alone Rover will always act like the dog he is.

Even when his behavior changes, he'll still be a dog. He's never going to be a person. Once everyone understands the rules it's much easier to play the game. Once everyone is playing together instead of being at odds, you know what happens. You communicate effectively and understand each other better. And the results? Happy Dogs = Happy Families
